Open

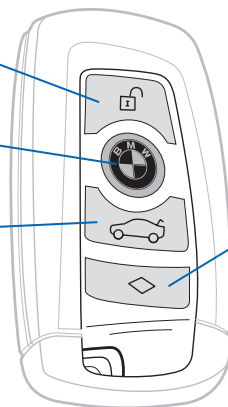
Unlocks the entire vehicle.

Close

Locks the entire vehicle.

Open the small trunk lid

Press and hold the button for approx. 1 second.



Convenient opening

Press and hold the Open button to open the windows and the glass sunroof* after unlocking.

Switch on headlamp courtesy delay feature

Briefly press the button.

Open the large trunk lid*

Press and hold the button for approx. 1 second.

Panic Mode*

Press and hold for at least 3 seconds.
Press any button to cancel.

Personal Profile and Comfort Access*

Personal Profile

Some of the vehicle's functions can be individually tailored and stored for a maximum of three remote controls.

Different settings are retrieved and implemented in the vehicle, depending on the remote control that is detected when unlocking the vehicle.

Most personal settings can be imported/exported and thus transferred to another vehicle with the Personal Profile function.

Keyless driving pleasure

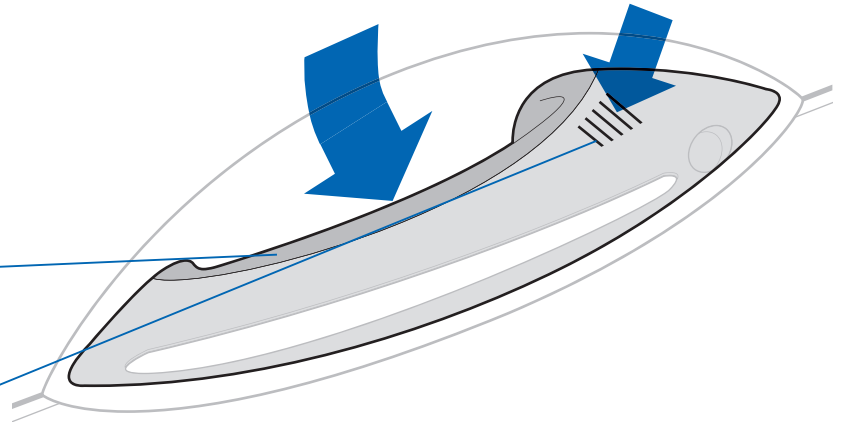
The Comfort Access* system allows you to gain access to the vehicle and start the engine without holding the remote control. The remote control is automatically detected in the immediate vicinity or inside the vehicle.

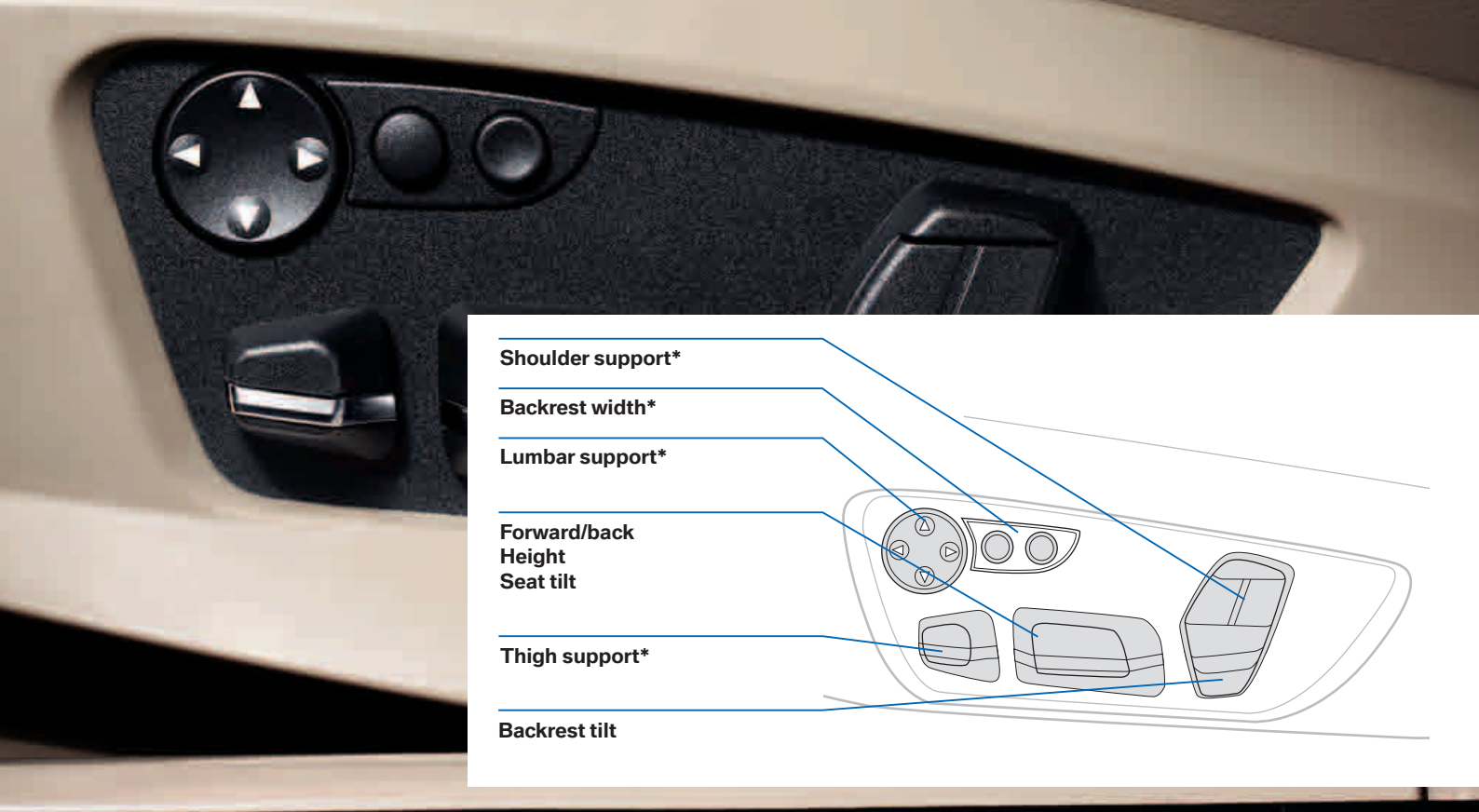

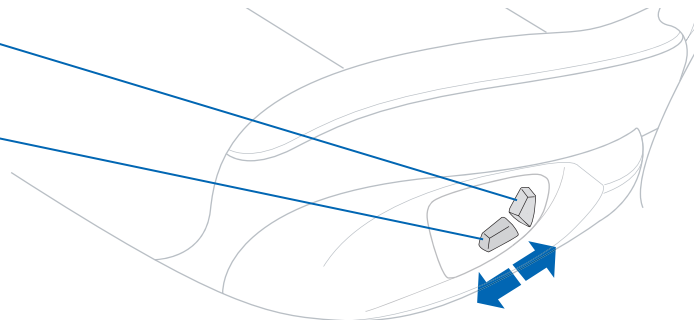

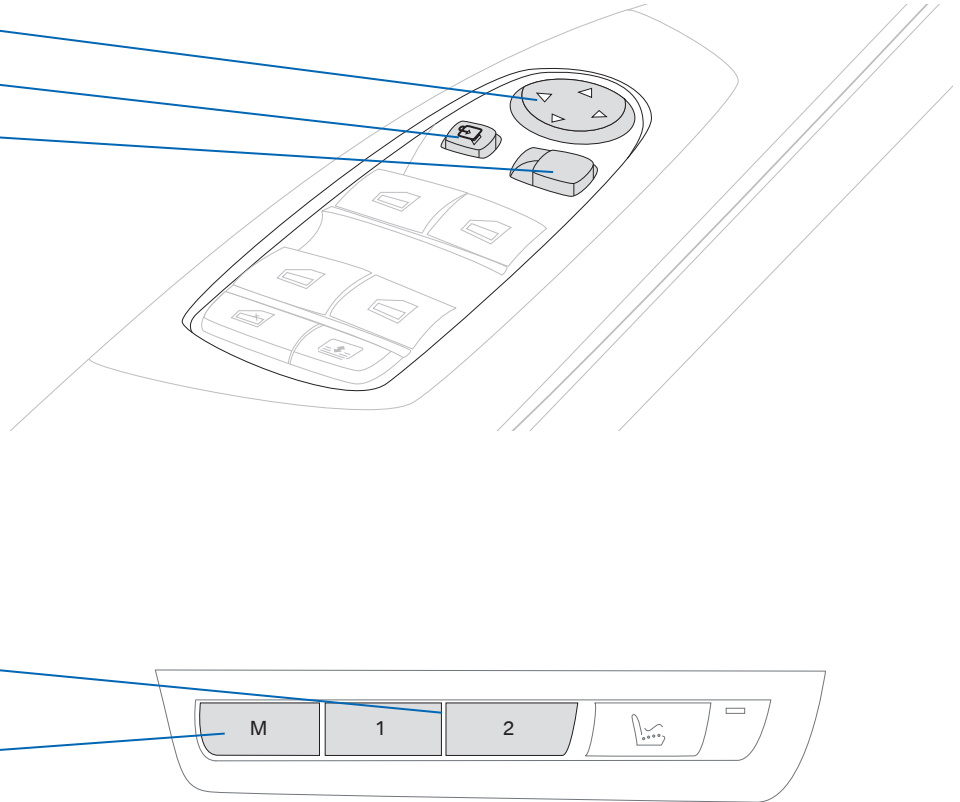
Seat, mirror and steering wheel memory*

You can store two different positions for the driver's seat, exterior mirrors and steering wheel for each remote control used.

- 1 . Ignition on.
- 2 . Set the seat, mirrors and steering wheel.
- 3 . Press the M button; the LED lights up.
- 4 . Press memory button 1 or 2.

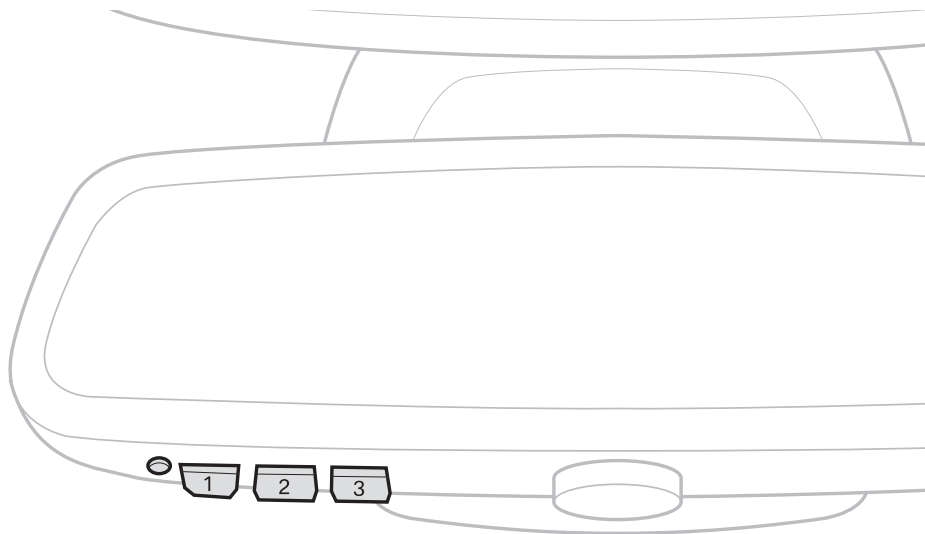
Integrated universal remote control*

Fixed-code hand-held transmitters

- 1 . The ignition is on.
- 2 . Press both outer buttons, 1 and 3, for approx. 20 seconds, until the LED flashes.
- 3 . Hold the hand-held transmitter a distance of approx. 2 to 8 in/5 to 20 cm away from the memory buttons.
- 4 . Simultaneously press the transmit button of the hand-held transmitter and the memory button of the universal remote control. The LED flashes slowly.
- 5 . Release both buttons when the LED flashes rapidly.

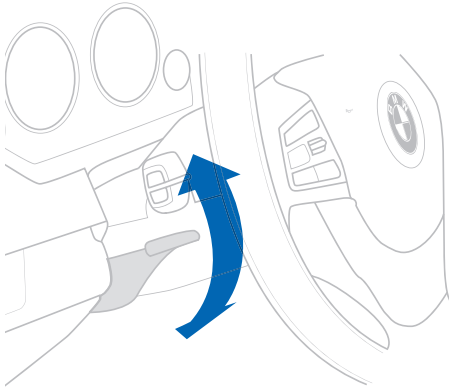
Alternating-code hand-held transmitters

- 1 . Park vehicle within the range of the radio-remote controlled device.
- 2 . Program the universal remote control as described in the section entitled "Fixed-code hand-held transmitters".
- 3 . Press and hold the programmed button on the interior rear-view mirror for approx. 5 seconds until the device being adjusted is activated.
- 4 . Press button on the receiver of the device being adjusted.
- 5 . Within 30 seconds, press the programmed button on the interior rear-view mirror three times.



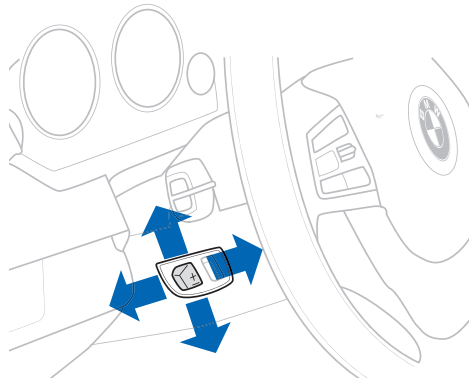

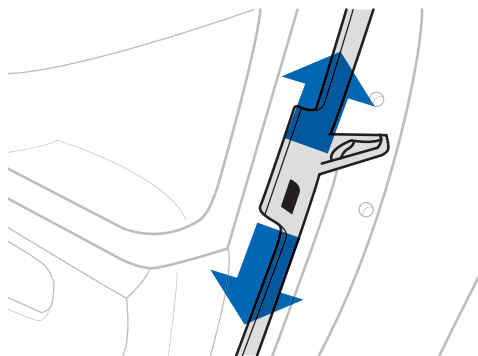

Transporting children safely

Locking doors and windows for the rear

Push the locking lever on the rear doors down. The door can now be opened from the outside only.



Safety switch for the rear

Press the button on the driver's door if children are being transported in the rear.

This locks various functions so that they cannot be operated from the rear.

Child restraint systems

To select, mount and use child restraint systems, observe the information provided by the system manufacturer; otherwise, the protective effect can be impaired.

LATCH child restraint fixing system

Before installing LATCH child restraint systems, pull the belt away from the region of the child restraint system.

Make sure that both lower LATCH anchors have properly engaged and that the child restraint system is resting snugly against the backrest.

Firmly press the installation guide into the gap between the seat upholstery and backrest. Continue to press until the two funnel-shaped guides snap into place in the LATCH support brackets. The installation guide can be removed simply by pulling.

Switching the ignition on/off

Press the Start/Stop button without depressing the brake pedal.

Starting the engine

Press the Start/Stop button; while doing this, press the brake pedal.

Engine off/radio ready state

Press the Start/Stop button while the engine is running.

Automatic transmission/Parking brake

P button

Press the button to engage transmission position P.

Unlock button

To switch from P or into R:

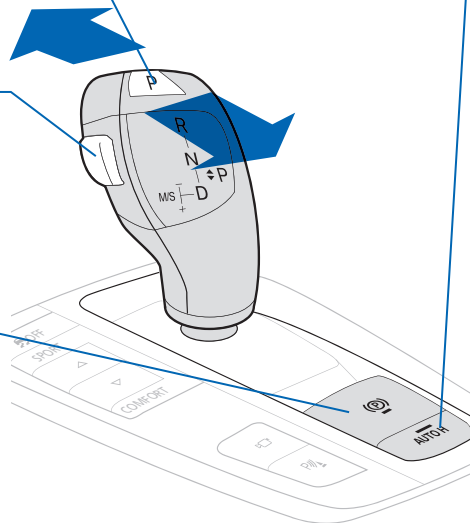
- 1 . Depress the brake pedal while the engine is running.
- 2 . Press the Unlock button.
- 3 . Move the selector lever in the desired direction.

Applying the parking brake

Pull the switch; the LED lights up.

Releasing the parking brake

Press the switch with the brake pedal depressed or transmission position P engaged; the LED goes out.

**Automatic Hold**

Automatic application and release of the parking brake, in stop-and-go traffic, for instance.

Activate Automatic Hold:

Press the button; the LED lights up.

Deactivate Automatic Hold:

Press the button again; the LED goes out.

Tip

Before driving into a car wash, so that the vehicle can roll:

- 1 . Depress the brake pedal.
- 2 . Engage in position N.
- 3 . Release the parking brake or deactivate Automatic Hold.
- 4 . Switch off the engine.

The vehicle can roll for approx. 30 minutes, provided that the ignition is not switched off.

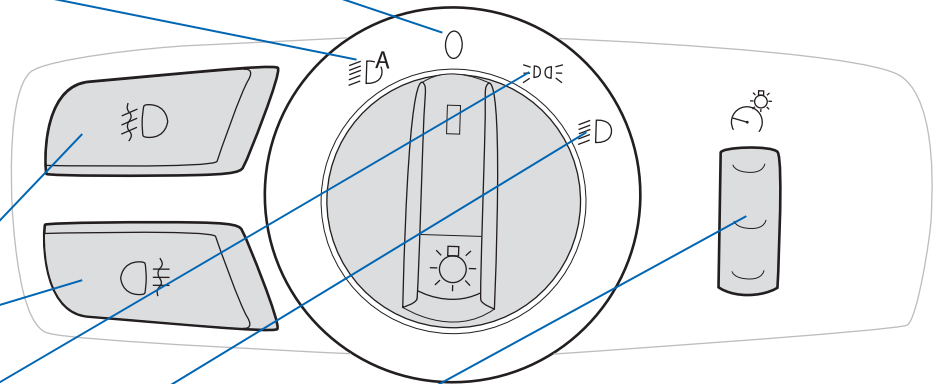

Driving stability control systems

Dynamic Stability Control DSC

DSC prevents traction loss in the driving wheels when driving away and accelerating. DSC also recognizes unstable vehicle conditions, such as fishtailing or nose-diving. Subject to physical limits, DSC helps to keep the vehicle on a steady course by reducing engine speed, and by applying brakes at individual wheels.

The program can be deactivated/activated via Dynamic Driving Control.

Dynamic Traction Control DTC

The DTC system with the TRACTION program is a variant of DSC that is optimized for forward momentum. The system ensures maximum forward momentum on special road conditions, such as unplowed snowy roads, but driving stability is limited.

The system and program can be deactivated/activated via Dynamic Driving Control.

Dynamic Damping Control*

This system can infinitely and independently adjust the suspension characteristics at all four wheels, depending on the road surface and the driving style. It gives the driver the ability to set the suspension for a more comfort-oriented setting or for more sporty driving. The settings can be selected via the Dynamic Driving Control switch.

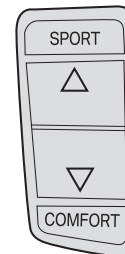
Dynamic Driving Control*

This system is designed to allow the driver to alter the driving dynamics of the vehicle. Four preset programs can be selected; each affects the engine response settings, transmission shift characteristics, steering boost and suspension mode.

The selection is done by using the Up and Down switch of the Dynamic Driving Control unit on the center console.

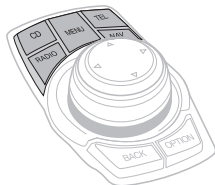

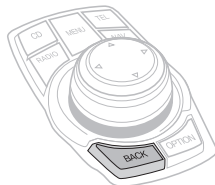

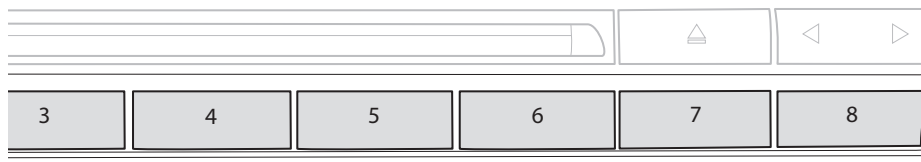

Programmable memory keys



iDrive functions can be stored on the programmable memory keys and called up directly, for instance radio stations, navigation destinations*, phone numbers* and jumps into the menu.

Storing functions

- 1 . Highlight the function via the iDrive.
- 2 . Press the desired key for longer than two seconds.

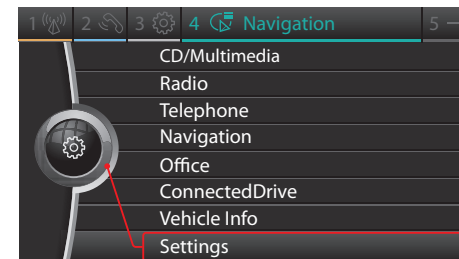
Executing a function

Press the button.

The function is executed immediately. This means, for example, that the number is dialed when a phone number is selected.

Tip

You can also save content from the Integrated Owner's Manual to the programmable memory keys.



Displaying memory key assignments

Briefly touch the button.

The key assignment is displayed at the top edge of the screen.

Displaying brief information: press the button.

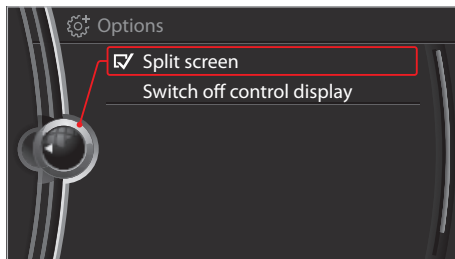
Displaying detailed info: press the button for an extended period.

Tip

You can save this function to the programmable memory keys for easy access to the Getting Help features. In the "Options" menu, select "Display Owner's Manual" and save to a programmable memory key.

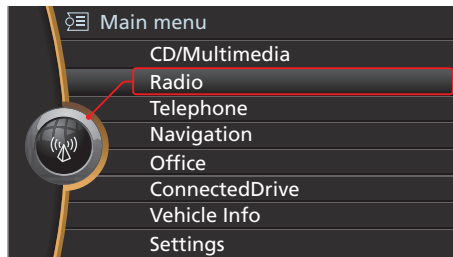

Additional information can be displayed on the right side of the split screen, information from the computer, for instance. You can set which information is displayed.

Switching the split screen* on/off

- 1 . Open "Options".
- 2 . "Split screen"

The split screen is activated and the information remains displayed, even if another menu is selected.

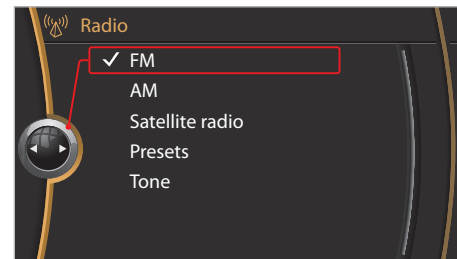


Voice activation system*

The voice activation system allows you to operate functions via a spoken command. Most text which is displayed on the Control Display may be voice-activated.

Example: calling up the FM waveband

- 1 . Press the button on the steering wheel.
- 2 . Wait for the signal.
- 3 . Say >Radio<.



- 4 . Say >F M<.

The list of available radio stations is displayed.

Having the possible commands read aloud

- 1 . Press the button on the steering wheel.
- 2 . Say >Voice commands<.

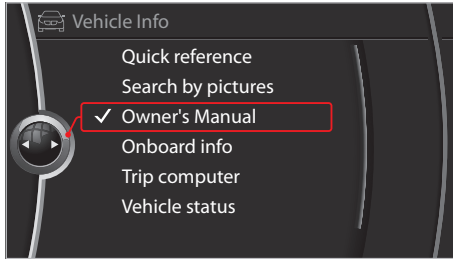
Tip

You can also call up the functions directly via so-called short commands, for instance >Map perspective view<.

To give those commands, speak without hesitation, loudly and clearly. Avoid background noise such as that caused by open windows.

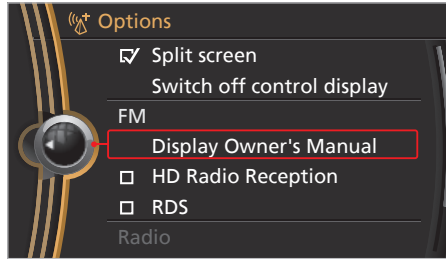

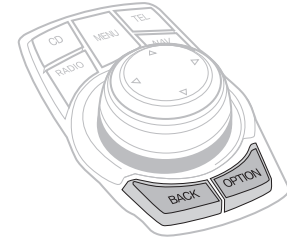


Getting help on selected menu items and screens

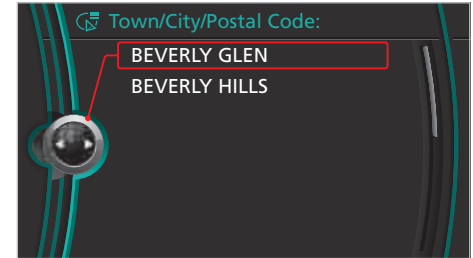
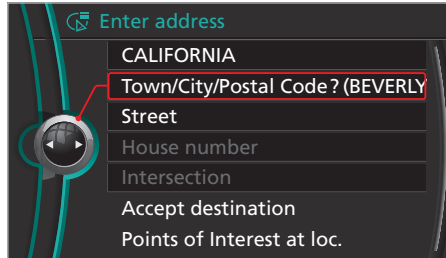
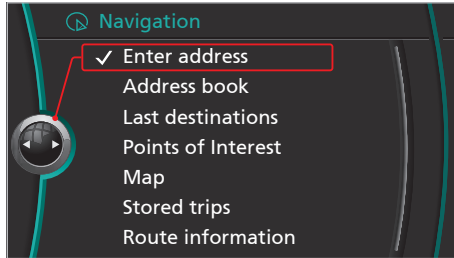

Entering a destination

- 1 . "Navigation"
- 2 . "Enter address"

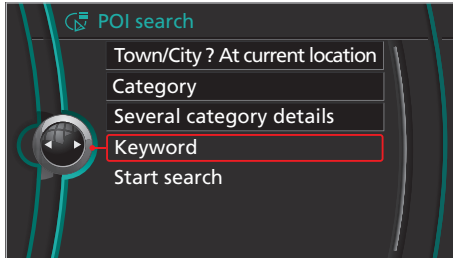
- 3 . Select "State/Province" or the displayed state or province.
- 4 . Select "Town/City/Postal Code" or the displayed town/city/postal code.
- 5 . Select the letters individually. The list gradually grows smaller each time you enter a new letter.

- 6 . Move the controller to the right and select a town/city from the list.
- 7 . Enter a street, as you did for the town/city.
- 8 . If desired, select the building number or intersection.
- 9 . "Accept destination"
- 10 . "Start guidance"

Tip

You can also enter a destination using the voice activation system*. Town/city, street and building number can also be spoken in one sentence.

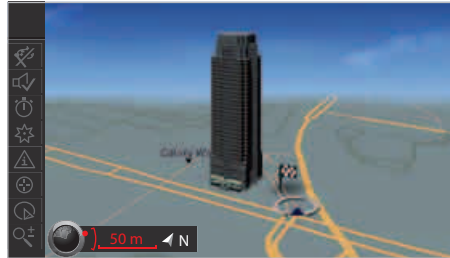

Searching for specific destinations, for instance, points of interest, hotels, or gas stations:

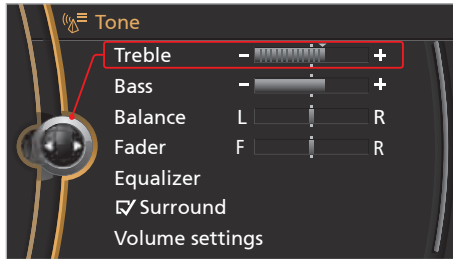

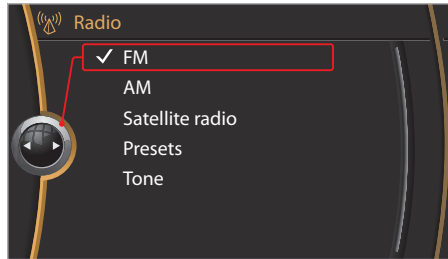

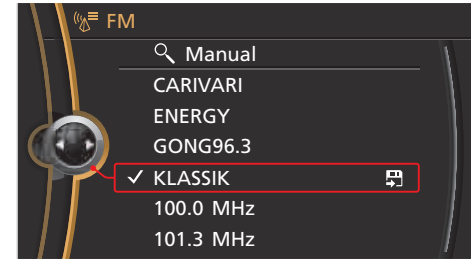

Storing music

CD/DVD* and USB media music tracks may be stored in the vehicle in a music collection.

- 1 . Insert the CD/DVD* into the CD/DVD* player.
- 2 . "CD/Multimedia"
- 3 . "CD/DVD"
- 4 .  Select the symbol for the CD/DVD player.

5 . "Store in vehicle"

The music collection is displayed.

The tracks are stored and played in sequence from the music collection.

Observe the following during the storage process:

Do not switch to the CD/DVD player, and do not remove the CD/DVD from the CD/DVD player, as this will interrupt the storage process.

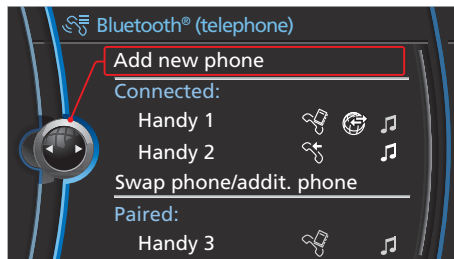
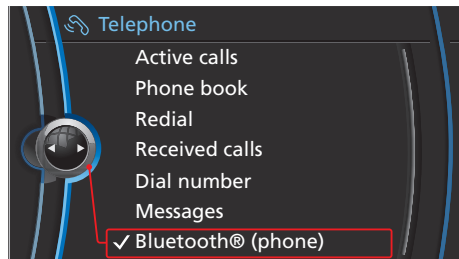
You can store music using the CD/DVD player and compressed audio files using the USB interface in the glove compartment. For further information, consult the Owner's Manual.

Tip

While storing, you can switch to audio sources other than the CD/DVD player without interrupting the storage process. Tracks from the current CD/DVD that have already been stored can be called up.

Mobile phone pairing*



Pairing the mobile phone with the vehicle

- 1 . Switch on the ignition.
- 2 . Activate Bluetooth on the vehicle and the mobile phone.
- 3 . If necessary, adjust the mobile phone according to the Bluetooth presets, e.g., connection not visible, neither with confirmation nor on the mobile phone.
- 4 . Think of a 4 to 16-digit passkey in order to enter it later. The passkey is only required once for the pairing procedure.
- 5 . "Telephone"
- 6 . "Bluetooth® (phone)"

- 7 . "Add new phone"
The Bluetooth name of the vehicle appears on the Control Display.
- 8 . Use the mobile phone to search for Bluetooth devices; check your mobile phone's operating instructions. The Bluetooth name of the vehicle also appears on the mobile phone display.
- 9 . Select the Bluetooth name of the vehicle from the mobile phone. The mobile phone's display or the iDrive will prompt you to enter the Bluetooth passkey.

- 10 . Enter the passkey on the mobile phone and via the iDrive.

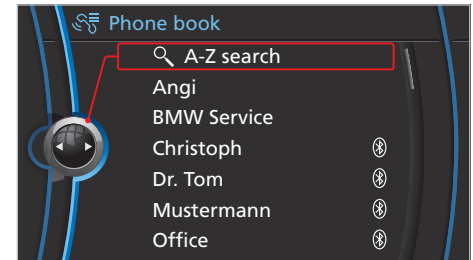
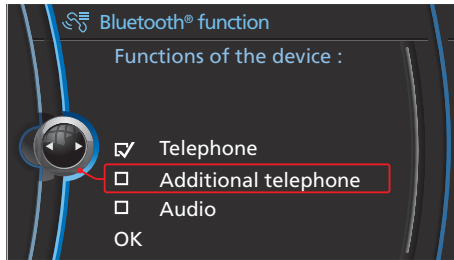

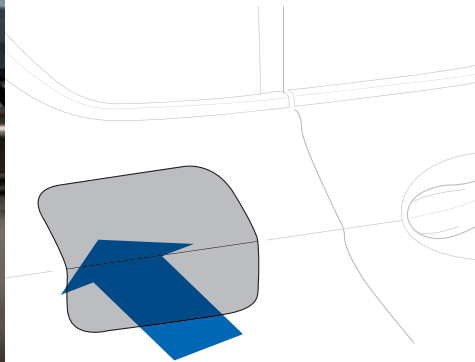

FTM Flat Tire Monitor*

The system identifies a loss of pressure by comparing the speeds of rotation of the individual wheels as the car is traveling.

The system must be initialized with the correct tire pressures in order for it to reliably respond in detecting a flat tire.

Operation via iDrive:

- 1 . "Vehicle Info"
- 2 . "Vehicle status"
- 3 . $\langle \text{!} \rangle_{\text{INIT}}$ "Reset"
- 4 . Start the engine; do not drive away.
- 5 . "Reset"
- 6 . Drive away.

The FTM is not a replacement for carrying out tire pressure checks.

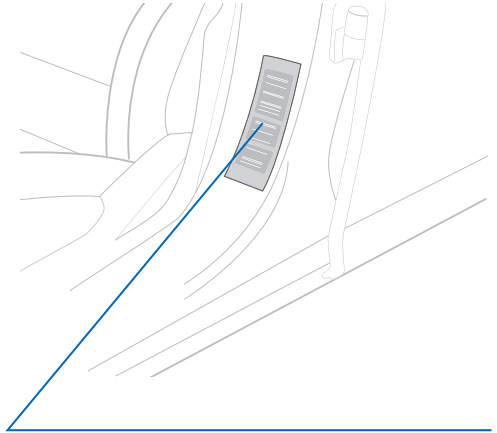
TPM Tire Pressure Monitor*

Monitoring of the tire inflation pressure in the four mounted tires: the system reports when the tire inflation pressure has dropped considerably in one or more tires.

The system must have been reset when the inflation pressure was correct; otherwise, reliable signaling of a flat tire is not ensured.

Operation via iDrive:

- 1 . "Vehicle Info"
- 2 . "Vehicle status"
- 3 . $\langle \text{!} \rangle_{\text{INIT}}$ "Reset"
- 4 . Start the engine; do not drive away.
- 5 . Start the initialization with "Reset".
- 6 . Drive away.



Tire pressure

The pressure values for approved tire sizes and speeds up to 100 mph/160 km/h can be found on the driver's door pillar.

If the tire's speed rating code is not listed, use the tire pressure for the corresponding size e.g., 255/50 R19.

Tip

Check the tire pressure twice a month and reinitialize the FTM/TPM after adjusting tire pressure and after changing a tire or wheel.

Towing

The only method approved for transporting vehicles with automatic transmission is using a commercial flatbed carrier truck, and securing the vehicle to the flatbed truck with four nylon wheel straps.

When pulling the vehicle onto a flatbed carrier truck, only use the screw-in tow-eye found in the trunk tool kit.
