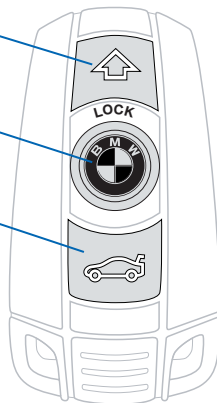

Personal Profile

Some of the vehicle's functions can be individually tailored and stored for several remote controls.

Different settings are retrieved and implemented in the vehicle, depending on the remote control that is detected when unlocking the vehicle.

Keyless driving pleasure*

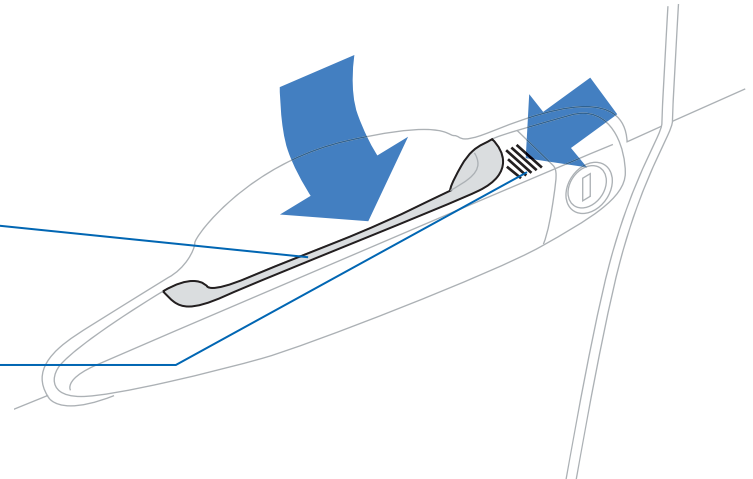
The Comfort Access system allows you to gain access to the vehicle and start the engine without holding the remote control. The remote control is automatically detected in the immediate vicinity of or inside the vehicle.

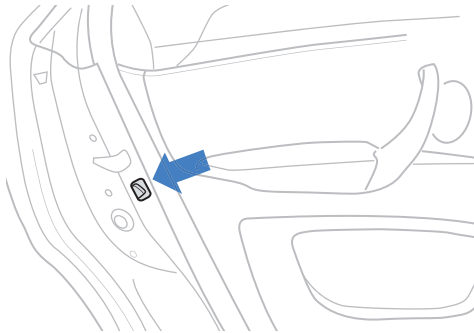
1. The ignition is on.
2. Press both outer buttons, 1 and 3, for approx. 20 seconds until the LED flashes.
3. Hold the hand-held transmitter a distance of approx. 2 to 8 in/5 to 20 cm away from the memory buttons.
4. Simultaneously press the transmit button of the hand-held transmitter and the memory button of the universal remote control.
5. Release both buttons when the LED flashes rapidly.

Securing rear doors and windows

Move the lever in the rear doors to its downward position. The door can only be opened from the outside.



Child safety lock for rear side windows

Press the child safety lock

for the rear side windows on the driver's side door when children are riding in the back. The LED lights up: operation of the rear windows is disabled.

Child restraint system

Please observe the manufacturer's instructions of the child restraint systems concerning the selection, mounting and use of these systems; otherwise, the child's safety may be compromised.

LATCH child restraint fixing system

Before mounting the LATCH child restraint fixing system, pull the belt away from the child seat fastening area.

The inserts for the lower LATCH mountings are located in the space between the seat and the backrest.

Make sure that both lower LATCH mountings are firmly snapped and that the child restraint system is snugly positioned against the backrest.

Run the upper safety belt between the headrest supports and attach it to the fastening point using the hook. Pull the upper safety belt tight and push it under the headrest.

Start/Stop button



Switching the ignition on/off

Press the Start/Stop button without depressing the brake pedal.

Starting the engine

Press the Start/Stop button while depressing the brake pedal.

Engine off/radio ready state

Press the Start/Stop button when the engine is running.

M Sport automatic transmission/Parking brake

Unlock button

For shifting from P or to R:

1. Press on the brake while the engine is running.
2. Press the Unlock button.
3. Move the selector lever in the desired direction.

Applying the parking brake

Pull the switch; the LED lights up.

Releasing the parking brake

Press the switch with the brake depressed or transmission position P engaged; the LED goes out.

Automatic Hold

Automatic setting and releasing of the parking brake, for instance in stop-and-go-traffic.

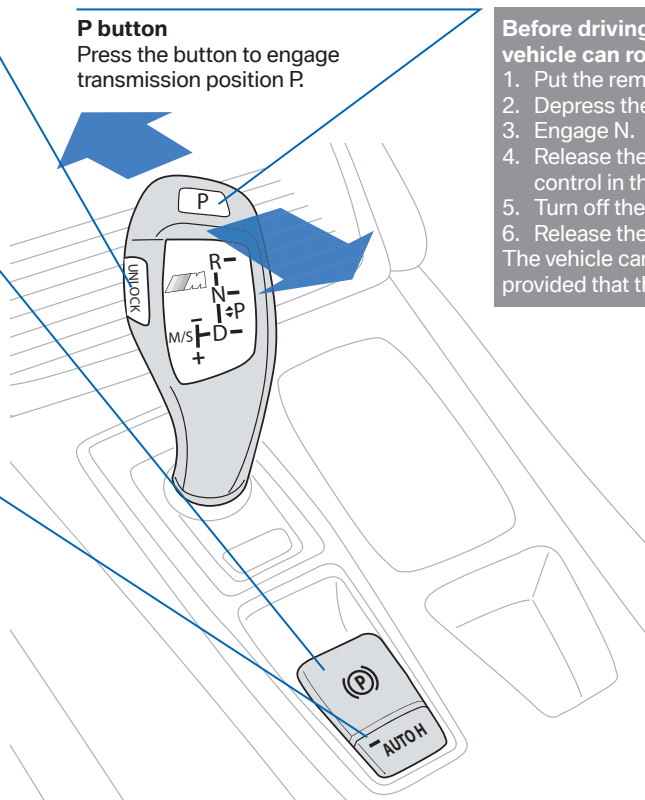
Press the button; the LED lights up.

Deactivating

Press the button again; the LED goes out.

Press the button to engage transmission position P.



Before driving into a car wash, so that the vehicle can roll:

1. Put the remote control into the ignition.
2. Depress the brake.
3. Engage N.
4. Release the parking brake; leave the remote control in the ignition.
5. Turn off the engine.
6. Release the brake.

The vehicle can roll for approx. 30 minutes, provided that the ignition is not switched off.

M Sport automatic transmission.



Sport program

Push the shift lever in D to the left. In the instrument cluster, speeds S1 to S6 are indicated. Sport program S supports a dynamic driving style.

Manual mode

First switch to Sport mode. Push the shift lever forward or backward resp. Pull the shifter +/- on the steering wheel. The transmission does not upshift when the rpm limit is reached.

Shift lights in the Head-Up Display*

Close to engine speed limits, the yellow marked areas of the tachometer in the M View light up, reminding the driver of the approaching upshift point. Please upshift early while the engine is still cold. When the engine is hot, upshift no later than when the red area lights up. As a final upshift reminder, the whole tachometer blinks when the vehicle reaches the maximum engine speed.

Tip

By the fading in of the M View in the Head-Up Display*, the shift lights, the transmission speed indication, and the vehicle speed are projected within the driver's field of vision.

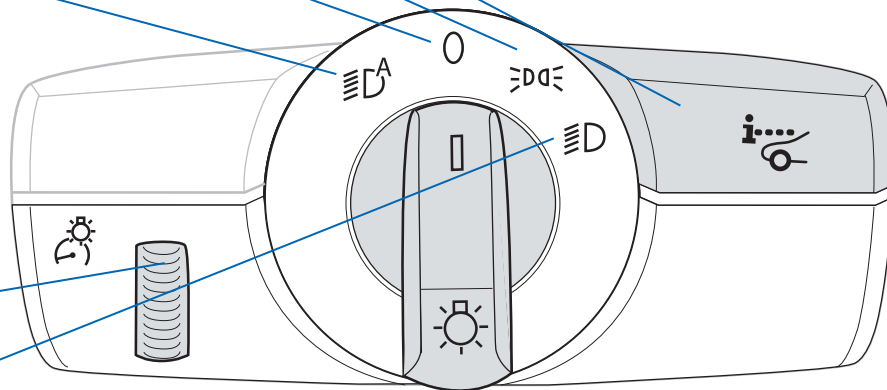

22 Driving M Technology



M TwinPower turbo engine

The M TwinPower turbo engine is a V8 high performance engine. With a 4.4 liter displacement, it creates a maximum output of 555 hp and a maximum torque of 500 lb ft/680 Nm. It is marked by spontaneous response characteristics and an extremely broad effective torque range. The maximum engine speed of 6,800 rpm is electronically limited.

Drivetrain

The all-wheel-drive system xDrive offers a permanently variable torque distribution between the front and rear axles. In conjunction with Dynamic Performance Control and the characteristic M rear-wheel drive design, the dynamics and maneuverability in all speed ranges have been considerably upgraded. Additionally, driving dynamics may be noticeably improved by utilizing the M Dynamic Mode.

Driving on a racetrack

Prior to taking the vehicle to a racetrack, BMW recommends the following:

- Participation in BMW driver training
- Have the vehicle checked at your BMW service center.

Racetrack driving results in increased wear and tear of components.

The standard brake pads and wear indicators are not designed for use on a racetrack. Your center will be most obliged to advise you.

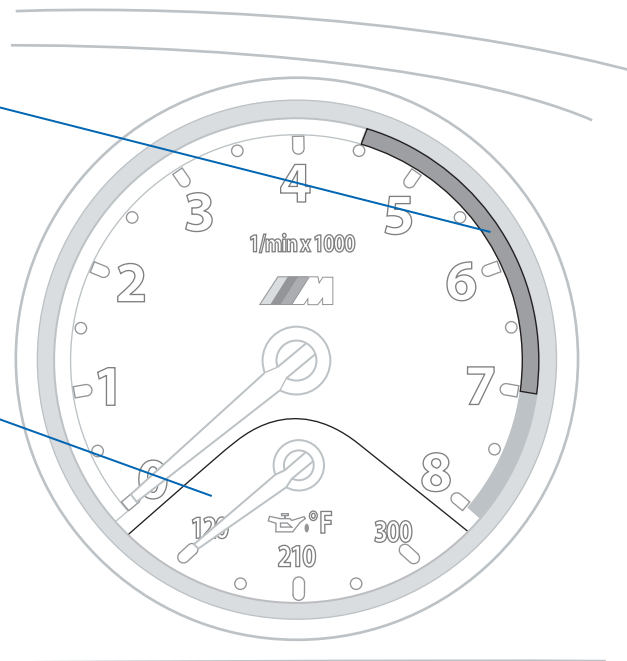
When engine components are hot due to high power demands, engine management may reduce the output in order to protect the engine. After a cooling off period, the full engine power is at your disposal again.

Tachometer

The variable warning area limits the currently permitted engine speed, depending on the engine oil temperature. Please avoid engine speeds in the yellow warning area.

Engine oil temperature

During the warm-up phase, the V8 high performance engine may sound a bit rough with a momentarily higher idling speed. You must drive the vehicle with caution until the engine has reached its operating temperature. The engine oil temperature of an engine at operating temperature is 175 °F/80 °C to 250 °F/120 °C.

Break-in period

Up to 1,200 miles/2,000 km

Drive the vehicle at varying engine and vehicle speeds. Do not exceed 5,500 rpm or 105 mph/170 km/h.

Always avoid the full-throttle or kickdown position of the accelerator.

From 1,200 miles/2,000 km to 3,000 miles/5,000 km

Engine and vehicle speed may be gradually increased. Only briefly exceed the vehicle speed of 135 mph/220 km/h, for example, when passing.

New tires

The road-holding capabilities of new tires are not yet optimal. You should drive with restraint during the first 200 miles/300 km.

New brake system

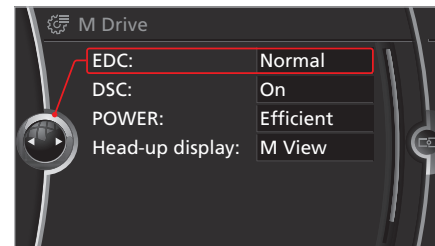
Brake pads and rotors reach the most favorable wear and contact pattern at approx. 300 miles/500 km.

M Drive

M Drive

With M Drive, several settings of the vehicle may be configured. The settings affect the drive dynamic control, the adjustment of shock absorbers and steering, the engine characteristics, and the data on the Head-Up Display*.

**Voice activation system***

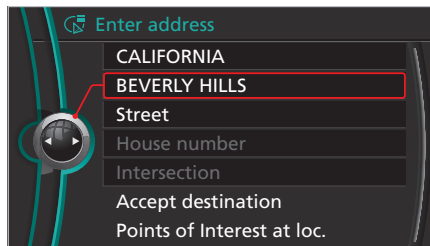
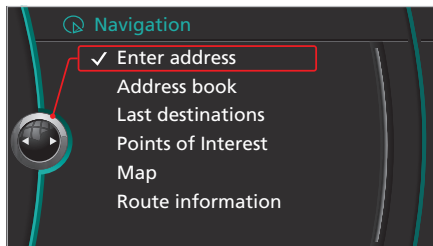

You can also call up the functions directly via so-called short commands, such as >Map perspective view<* and >Redial<. To give those commands, speak without hesitation, loudly and clearly. Avoid background noises, such as those caused by an open sunroof.

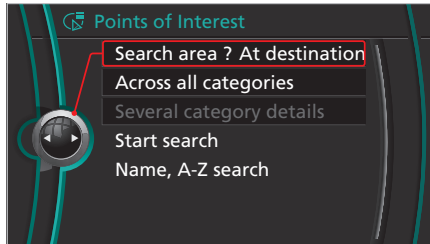

8. If desired, select the building number or intersection.

You can enter the destination via the voice activation system*. Town/city, street and building number can also be spoken in one sentence.

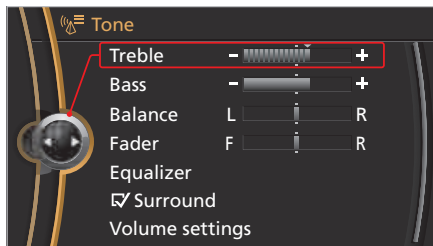

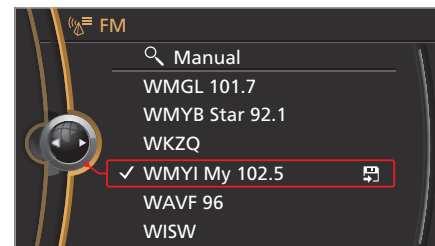

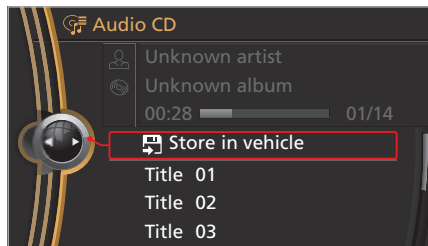

1. Insert the CD/DVD* into the CD/DVD* player.
2. "CD/Multimedia"
3. "CD/DVD"
4. Select the symbol for the CD/DVD* player.

5. "Store in vehicle"

The music collection is displayed. The tracks are stored and played in sequence from the music collection.

Observe the following during the storage process:

Do not switch back to the CD/DVD* player, and do not remove the CD/DVD* from the CD/DVD* player, as this will interrupt the storage process.

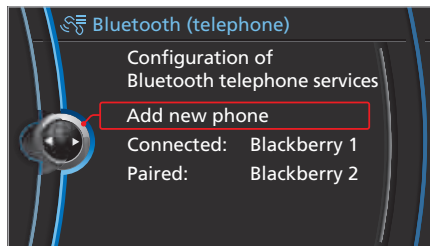
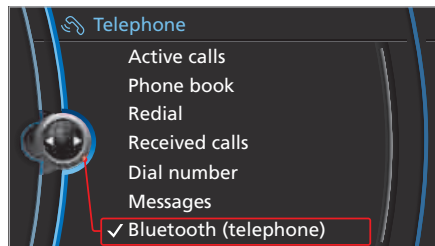
You can only store CDs/DVDs* from the CD/DVD* player. Additional information about how to store compressed audio files from CDs/DVDs* or USB media can be found in the Owner's Manual.

Tip

You can switch to other audio sources, except for the CD/DVD* player, without interrupting the storing process. Tracks from the current CD/DVD* that have already been stored can be called up.

Mobile phone pairing*



Pairing the mobile phone with the vehicle

1. Switch on the ignition.
2. Activate Bluetooth both on the vehicle and the mobile phone.
3. If necessary, adjust the mobile phone according to the Bluetooth presets, for instance, connection not visible, neither with confirmation nor on the mobile phone.
4. Think of a 4 to 16-digit passkey in order to enter it later. The passkey is only required once for the pairing procedure.
5. "Telephone"
6. "Bluetooth (telephone)"

7. "Add new phone"
The vehicle's Bluetooth name will be displayed on the control display.
8. Use the mobile phone to search for Bluetooth devices; check your mobile phone's operating instructions. The Bluetooth name of the vehicle also appears on the mobile phone display.
9. Select the Bluetooth name of the vehicle on the mobile phone.
The mobile phone's display and the iDrive will prompt you to enter the Bluetooth passkey.

10. Enter the passkey on the mobile phone and via the iDrive. If pairing was successful, the mobile phone appears on the mobile phone list.

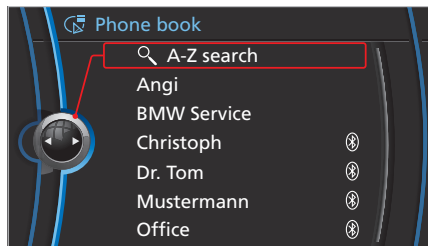

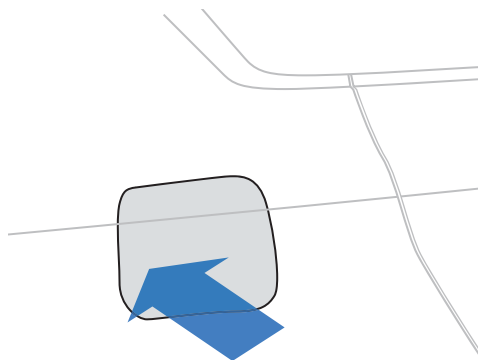

Minimum grade: AKI 91.

The oil level is monitored electronically and shown on the control display.
For recommended oil grades, refer to the Owner's Manual.

FTM Flat Tire Monitor*

The system identifies a loss of pressure by comparing the speeds of rotation of the individual wheels as the car is traveling.

The system must be initialized with the correct tire pressures in order for it to respond reliably in detecting a flat tire.

Operation via iDrive:

1. "Vehicle Info"
2. "Vehicle status"
3. "Reset"
4. Start the engine; do not drive away.
5. Start the initialization with "Reset".
6. Drive away.

FTM is no replacement for tire pressure checks.

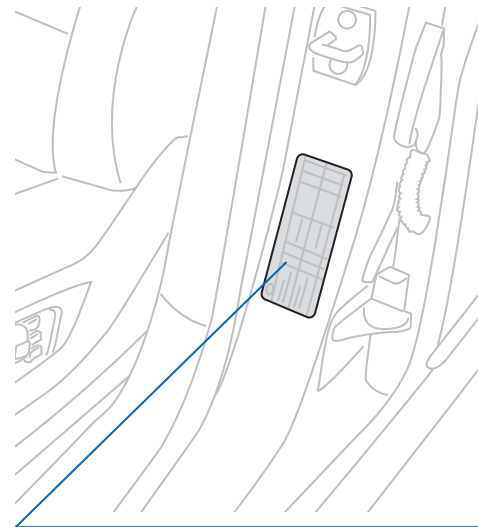
TPM Tire Pressure Monitor*

Monitoring of the tire inflation pressure in the four mounted tires: the system reports when the tire inflation pressure has dropped considerably in one or more tires.

The system must have been reset when the inflation pressure was correct; otherwise, reliable signaling of a flat tire is not ensured.

Operation via iDrive:

1. "Vehicle Info"
2. "Vehicle status"
3. "Reset TPM"
4. Start the engine; do not drive away.
5. Start the initialization with "Reset TPM".
6. Drive away.



Tire inflation pressure

For speeds of up to 100 mph/160 km/h and for optimum driving comfort, note the pressure values in the tire inflation pressure table (refer to the Owner's Manual), and adjust as necessary. These pressure values can also be found on the tire inflation pressure label on the driver's door pillar.

Tip

Check the tire pressure twice a month and reinitialize the FTM/TPM after adjusting tire pressure and after changing a tire or wheel.

The only method approved for transporting your vehicle is using a commercial flatbed carrier truck, and securing the vehicle to the flatbed truck with four nylon wheel straps.

When pulling the vehicle onto a flatbed carrier truck, only use the screw-in tow-eye found in the trunk tool kit.

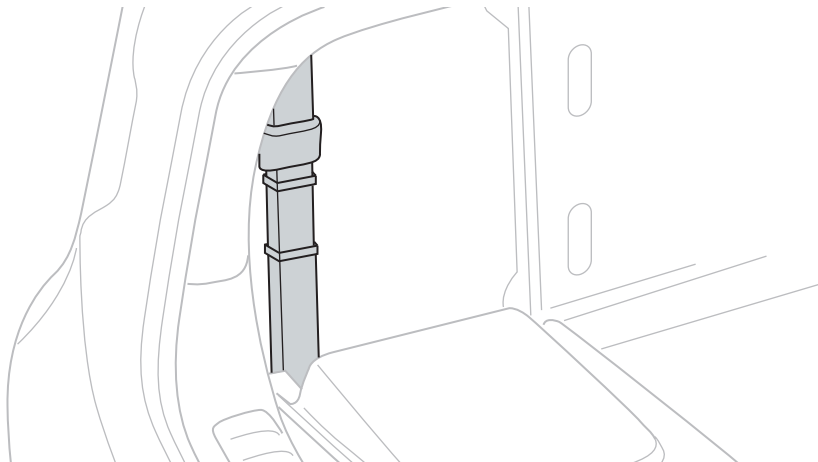
