Welcome on board

Your BMW 2 Series offers you a wide range of equipment to make driving an enjoyable experience.

This Quick Reference Guide informs you about the most important basic functions of your BMW 2 Series.

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4 Opening and closing

Remote control



Unlocking

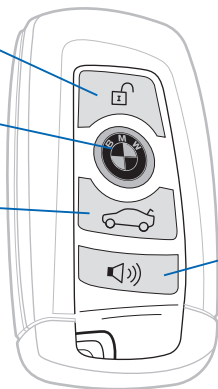
Locking

Unlocking the trunk lid

Press the button on the remote control for approx. 1 second.

Tip

Depending on the equipment and the country variant, it is possible to set whether the doors are also unlocked when the trunk lid is opened.



Convenient opening

Press and hold the Unlock button to open the windows and the glass sunroof.

Panic mode

Press the button on the remote control for at least 3 seconds to set off the alarm system. Switch off by pressing any button.

Personal Profile

Individual settings in the vehicle are saved in personal profiles. Every remote control is assigned a profile. Three personal profiles and a guest profile can be created.

Changes to the settings are automatically saved in the profile currently activated.

During unlocking, the profile stored for the remote control is activated.

Your personal settings will be recognized and called up again even if the vehicle has been operated in the meantime with another remote control.

Only one remote control should be used per person.

For example, the following settings can be stored in a profile:

- Driver's seat position.
- Exterior mirror position.
- Settings for Automatic climate control/Automatic climate control with enhanced features.

Comfort Access

The Comfort Access system allows you to gain access to the vehicle and start the engine without pressing the remote control. The remote control is automatically detected in the immediate vicinity or inside the vehicle.

Unlocking

Grasp the door handle on the driver's or front passenger door completely.

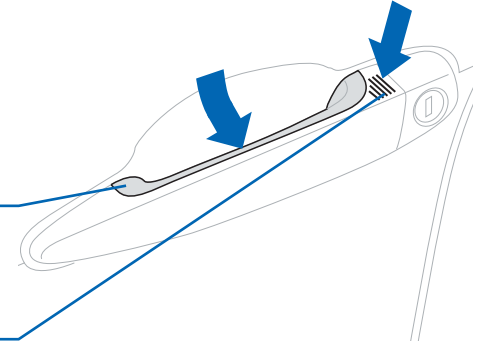
Locking

Press the door handle surface for approx. 1 second with your finger, without grasping the door handle.

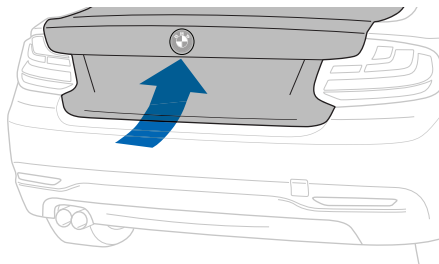
Convenient closing

Press the door handle surface with your finger and keep it there, without grasping the door handle.

In addition to locking, the windows and the glass sunroof are closed and the exterior mirrors folded in.

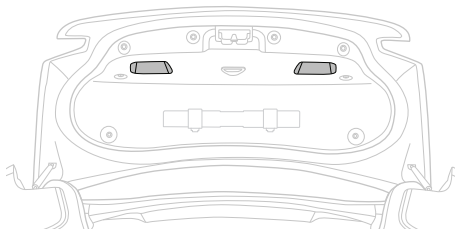

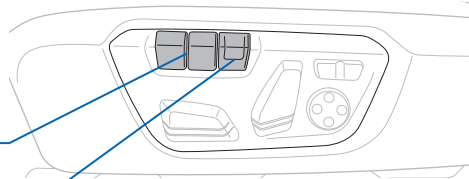

Two driver's seat and exterior mirror positions can be stored and retrieved per profile. The backrest width and lumbar support settings are not stored.

1. Switch on the ignition.
2. Set the desired position.
3.  Press the button. The LED in the button lights up.
4. Press the desired 1 or 2 button as long as the LED is lit up. The LED goes out.
5. Press memory button 1 or 2 to call up the position. The corresponding seat position is performed automatically.

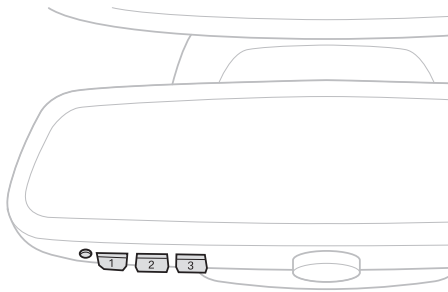
Universal Garage Door Opener

The concept

After programming, elements such as a garage door or lighting system can be operated using one of the buttons on the interior rear view mirror.

Programming

1. Switch on the ignition.
2. Press the two outer memory buttons 1 and 3 for approx. 20 seconds until the LED flashes.
3. Hold the hand-held transmitter for the system to be controlled approx. 1 to 3 in/2.5 to 8 cm from the buttons on the interior rearview mirror. The required distance depends on the manual transmitter.
4. Simultaneously press and hold the button of the desired function on the hand-held transmitter and the button to be programmed on the interior rearview mirror. The LED on the interior rearview mirror will begin flashing slowly.
5. Release both buttons as soon as the LED flashes more rapidly. If the LED is flashing faster, this indicates that the button on the interior rearview mirror has been programmed.



With alternating-code radio systems

For systems with an alternating-code system, the Universal Garage Door Opener and the system also have to be synchronized.

1. Park the vehicle within range of the remote-controlled device.
2. Program the relevant button on the interior rearview mirror as described.
3. Locate and press the synchronizing button on the system being programmed. You have approx. 30 seconds for the next step.
4. Press the programmed memory button of the Universal Garage Door Opener for approx. 3 seconds. If necessary, repeat this work step up to three times in order to finish synchronization.

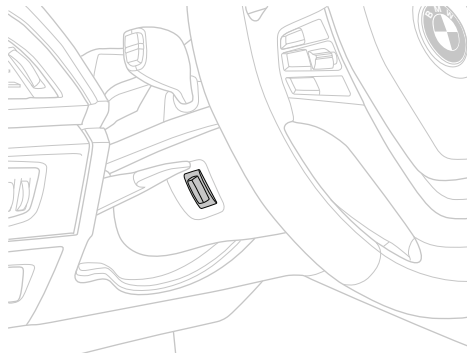
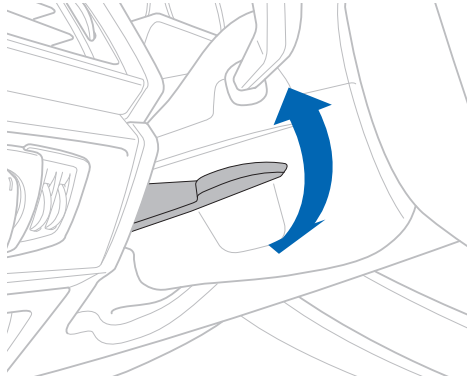

Transporting children safely

LATCH child restraint fixing system

To install and use the LATCH child restraint fixing systems, observe the operating and safety information from the system manufacturer; otherwise, the level of protection may be reduced

Mounts for the lower LATCH anchors

The lower anchors may be used to attach the CRS to the vehicle seat up to a combined child and CRS weight of 65 lb/30 kg when the child is restrained by the internal harnesses. Before installing the LATCH child restraint system, pull the belt away from the child seat fastening area. Make sure that the lower LATCH anchors are properly engaged and that the child restraint system is resting snugly against the backrest. Firmly press the installation guide into the gap between the seat upholstery and backrest. Continue to press until the two funnel-shaped guides snap into place in the LATCH support brackets. The installation guide can be removed simply by pulling.

Automatic transmission: press the Start/Stop button; while doing so, do not depress the brake pedal.

Manual transmission: press the Start/Stop button; while doing so, do not depress the clutch pedal.

Activating the radio ready state

Press the Start/Stop button while the engine is running.

Starting the engine

Automatic transmission: depress the brake pedal and press the Start/Stop button.

Manual transmission: depress the brake and clutch pedals, engage neutral, and press the Start/Stop button.

Switching off the engine

Automatic transmission: engage selector lever position P with the vehicle stopped, press the Start/Stop button and apply the parking brake.

Manual transmission: with the vehicle stopped, press the Start/Stop button, shift into first gear or reverse, and apply the parking brake.

Auto Start/Stop function

The Auto Start/Stop function helps save fuel. The system switches off the engine during a stop. The ignition remains switched on.

The READY display in the tachometer indicates that the Auto Start/Stop function is ready to start the engine automatically.

Automatic engine start

Automatic transmission: release the brake pedal.

Manual transmission: depress the clutch pedal.



Deactivating/activating the system manually

Press the button.

When the Auto Start/Stop function is deactivated, the LED in the button lights up.

Even if driving away was not intended, the deactivated engine could start up automatically under certain circumstances.

Automatic engine stop

The engine is switched off automatically during a stop under the following conditions:

Automatic transmission:

- The selector lever is in selector lever position D.
- Brake pedal remains depressed while the vehicle is stopped.
- The driver's safety belt is buckled or the driver's door is closed.

Manual transmission:

- Neutral is engaged and the clutch pedal is not pressed.
- The driver's safety belt is buckled or the driver's door is closed.

If the engine is switched off and the ignition is switched on, the system automatically switches to the radio ready state when the door is opened if the lights are switched off, or the daytime running lights are switched on.

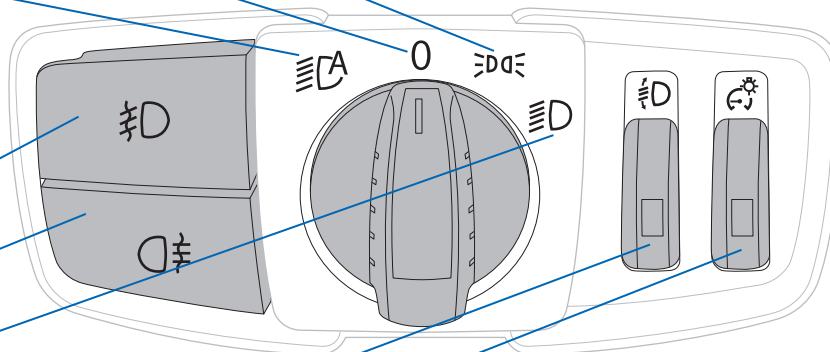

Automatic transmission with Steptronic/Parking brake

Engaging P

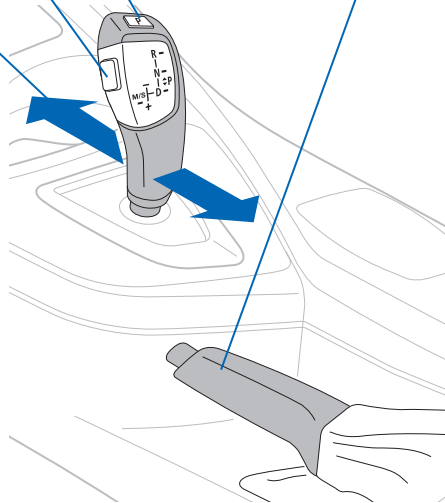
Select only when the vehicle is stationary. The drive wheels are blocked. Press button P.

Press unlock button, in order to:

- Engage R.
- Shift out of P.

Engaging D, R, and N

Briefly push the selector lever in the desired direction, beyond a resistance point if necessary. After releasing the selector lever, it returns to its center position.



Setting the parking brake

The lever engages automatically after it is pulled up.

Releasing the parking brake

Pull the lever slightly upward, press the button, and move the lever down.

To make it possible for the vehicle to roll in an automatic car wash, take the following steps:

1. Drive into the car wash.
2. Engage selector lever position N.
3. Switch off the engine.

The vehicle can roll as long as the ignition remains switched on.

Manual transmission/Parking brake

When the gearshift lever is pushed to the left, a slight resistance needs to be overcome.

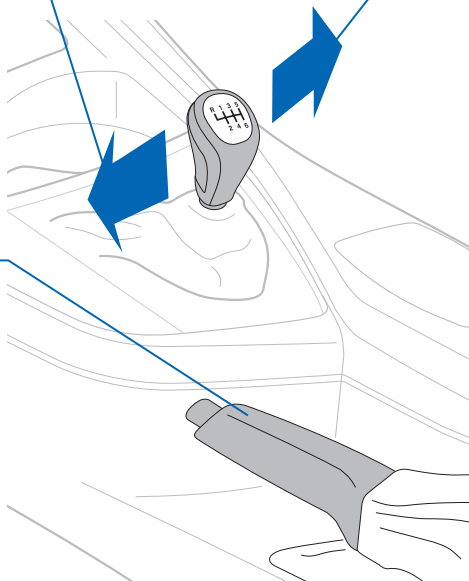

Setting the parking brake

The lever engages automatically after it is pulled up.

Releasing the parking brake

To make it possible for the vehicle to roll in an automatic car wash, take the following steps:

1. Drive into the car wash.
2. Shift to neutral.
3. Switch off the engine.
4. Switch on the ignition.

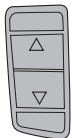

The concept

ECO PRO supports a driving style that saves on fuel consumption. For this purpose, the engine control and comfort functions, e. g. the climate control output, are adjusted.

Activating ECO PRO



Press the button repeatedly until ECO PRO appears in the instrument cluster.

Bonus range

By using an optimized driving style, you can achieve a better cruising range. This may be displayed as the bonus range in the instrument cluster.

The bonus range is included in the range display. After refueling, the bonus range is automatically reset.

Driving style

In the instrument cluster, a mark in the bar display indicates the current efficiency of the driving style.

The efficiency of the driving style is shown by the color of the bar:

- Blue display: efficient driving style as long as the mark moves within the blue range.
- Gray display: adjust your driving style, for example by lifting your foot off the accelerator.

ECO PRO tips



For efficient driving style, back off the accelerator or delay accelerating to allow time to assess road conditions.



Reduce the vehicle speed to the selected ECO PRO speed.



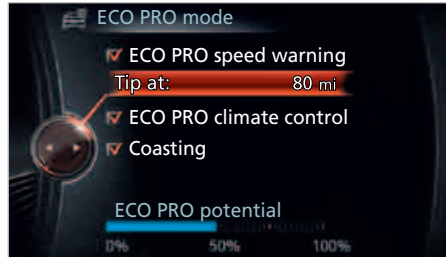
Automatic transmission: shift from M/S to D.



Automatic transmission/manual transmission: follow shifting instructions.



Manual transmission: engage neutral gear for an engine stop.

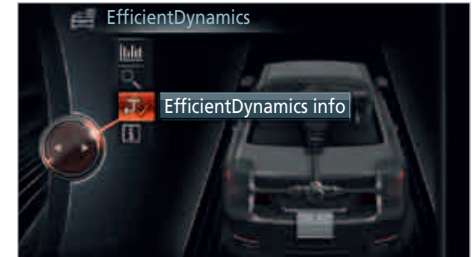


Configuring ECO PRO

Individual settings can be made.

1. "Settings"
2. "Driving mode"
3. "Configure ECO PRO"
4. Configure the program.

When coasting, the engine is automatically disengaged from the transmission in selector lever position D under certain conditions. The vehicle coasts in a fuel-saving manner. Selector lever position D remains engaged.



Displaying EfficientDynamics information

The currently active systems are displayed.

Driving stability control systems

Dynamic Stability Control DSC

DSC prevents traction loss in the drive wheels when driving away and accelerating. DSC also recognizes unstable vehicle conditions, such as fishtailing or nose-diving. Subject to physical limits, DSC helps to keep the vehicle on a steady course by reducing engine speed and by applying the brakes at individual wheels.

Dynamic Traction Control DTC

The DTC system is a version of the DSC in which forward momentum is optimized. The system ensures maximum forward momentum under special road conditions, such as unplowed snowy roads or loose road surfaces, but driving stability is limited. Activating the Dynamic Traction Control DTC provides maximum traction. Driving stability is limited during acceleration and when cornering.

Dynamic Damping Control

This system reduces undesirable vehicle motion when using a dynamic driving style or traveling on uneven road surfaces. This enhances driving dynamics and comfort as required for the road surface and driving style.

The system offers different programs. They can be selected using the Driving Experience Switch.

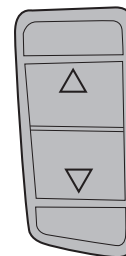
Driving Experience Switch

The Driving Dynamics Control can be used to adjust the driving dynamics of the vehicle. For this purpose, various programs are available for selection that are activated via the two buttons of the Driving Experience Switch and the DSC OFF button.

Programmable memory buttons



The concept

iDrive functions can be stored on the programmable memory buttons and called up directly, e.g. radio stations, navigation destinations, telephone numbers, and jumps into the menu. Without a navigation system, only radio stations can be stored on the buttons.

Saving a function

1. Highlight the function via the iDrive.
2. Press the desired button for longer than 2 seconds.

Executing a function

Press the button.

The function is executed immediately. This means, for example, that the number is dialed when a phone number is selected.



Displaying memory button assignments

Use a finger to touch the buttons.

The button assignment is displayed at the top edge of the screen.

To display short information: touch the button.

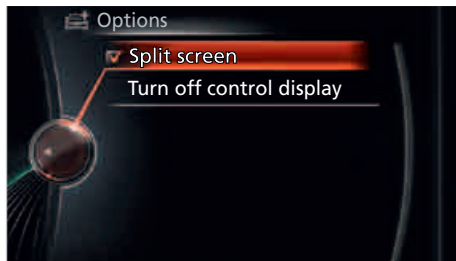
To display detailed information: touch the button for an extended period.

Tip

The content of the integrated Owner's Manual can also be saved on the programmable memory buttons.

Split screen/Voice activation system



Divided screen view, split screen

Additional information, such as information from the computer, can be displayed on the right side of the split screen. In the divided screen view, the so-called split screen, this information remains visible even when you change to another menu.

Switching the split screen on and off

1. Press the button.
2. "Split screen"



Voice activation system

The voice activation system can be used to operate functions by means of spoken commands. Most menu items that are displayed on the Control Display can be voice-activated.

Example: opening the FM waveband

1. Press the button on the steering wheel.
2. Wait for the signal.
3. Say >Radio menu<.



4. Say >F M menu<.

The list of available radio stations is displayed.

Having the possible commands read aloud

1. Press the button on the steering wheel.
2. Say >Voice commands<.

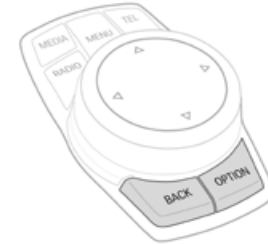
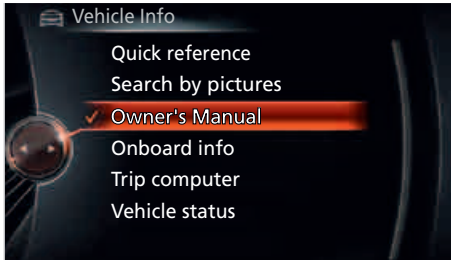
Tip

The functions can also be opened directly using so-called short commands, such as >Map perspective<.

To give these commands, speak without hesitation, loudly, and clearly. Avoid background noise such as that caused by open windows.

The BMW 2 Series comes with an integrated Owner's Manual, which contains all of the information necessary for you to make the best use of your vehicle. For safety reasons, the integrated Owner's Manual is only displayed when the vehicle is stationary.

Selecting the components

1.  Press the button.
2. Turn the controller: call up "Vehicle Info".
3. Press the controller.
4. Select the desired section:
 - "Quick reference"
 - "Search by pictures"
 - "Owner's Manual"

Getting Help feature via iDrive

The integrated Owner's Manual for the currently selected function can be displayed.

1.  Press the button.
2. "Display Owner's Manual"

The BACK and OPTION buttons can be used to switch between the integrated Owner's Manual and the currently selected menu. This is particularly helpful for functions with multiple operating steps.

Printed Owner's Manual

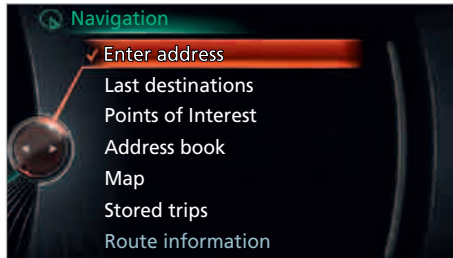
A printed Owner's Manual is contained in the vehicle document portfolio in the glove compartment or in the trunk.

Complex principles are explained quickly in videos in the integrated Owner's Manual.

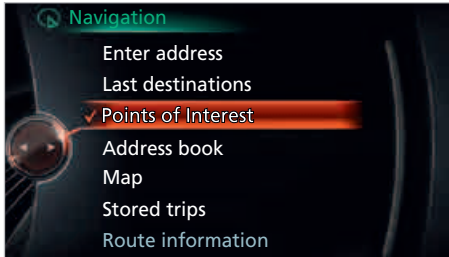

Ending destination guidance

1. "Navigation"
2. "Map"
3.  "Guidance"

Tip

Destination entry can be operated using the voice activation system. Town/city, street, and building number can also be spoken in one command.



Searching for points of interest

Selection of points of interest, such as filling stations or tourist attractions.

1. "Navigation"
 2. "Points of Interest"
 3. Select the type of search:
 - "Online search"
 - "Keyword search"
 - "Category search"
 4. Enter the keyword or select in which town the special destinations are to be searched for.
 5. Enter the search term or select a category.
- A list of the points of interest is displayed.

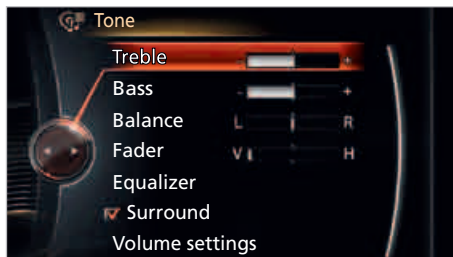

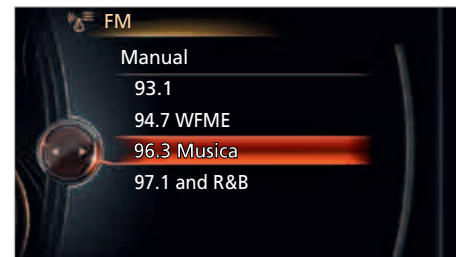

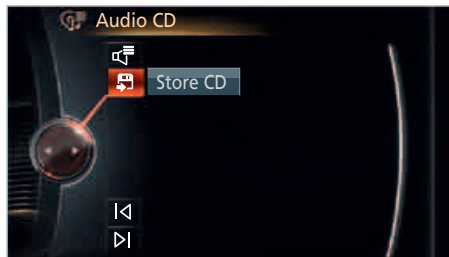

Storing from a CD/DVD

Music tracks from CDs/DVDs and USB devices can be stored in the music collection on a hard disc in the vehicle and played from there.

1. Insert the CD or DVD in the CD/DVD player.
2. "Multimedia"
3. "CD/DVD"
4.  Select the symbol for the CD/DVD player.



5. "Store CD"

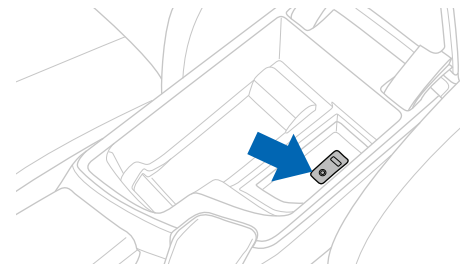
The music collection is displayed and the first track is played. During storage, the tracks are played in sequence.

Observe the following during the storage process:

Do not switch to the CD/DVD drive and do not remove the CD/DVD from the CD/DVD drive as this will interrupt the storage process.

Tip

Other audio sources can be activated without interrupting the storage process. Tracks from the current CD/DVD that have already been stored can be called up.



USB interface for data transfer

Connection for importing and exporting data on USB devices, e.g.:

- Personal Profile settings.
- Music collection.

Tip

Depending on the equipment and the country variant, the USB interface for data transfer is located in either the glove compartment or the center armrest. Additional information can be found in the Owner's Manual on navigation, entertainment, and communication.

Pairing the mobile phone with the vehicle

1. Switch on the ignition.
2. Activate Bluetooth on the vehicle and the mobile phone.
3. If necessary, adjust the mobile phone according to the Bluetooth presets, e.g. connection without confirmation or visibility.
4. If necessary, deactivate Bluetooth audio.
5. If necessary, define a 4 to 16-digit number as the Bluetooth passkey. This is only required for the one-time pairing procedure.
6. "Settings"
7. "Connections"
8. "Bluetooth®"

9. "Add new device"
The vehicle's Bluetooth name appears on the Control Display.
10. Perform additional steps on the mobile phone, such as searching for the Bluetooth device.
The Bluetooth name of the vehicle also appears on the mobile phone display.
11. Select the Bluetooth name of the vehicle on the mobile phone display.

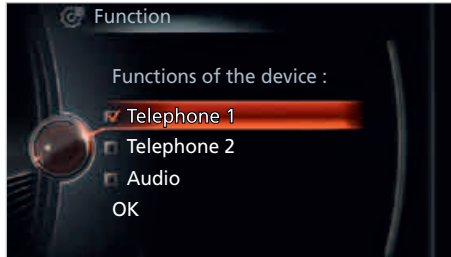
12. Enter and confirm the same passkey on the mobile phone and via the iDrive.

Refueling

To open the fuel filler flap, tap on the rear edge.

Fuel quality: gasoline

Only use unleaded gasoline without metal additives.

Fuel quality: BMW recommends AKI 91.

Minimum grade: BMW recommends AKI 89.

Maximum ethanol content: 10%, which corresponds to E10.

The ethanol should meet the following quality standards:

US: ASTM 4806-xx

CAN: CGSB-3.511-xx

xx: Note the standard applicable in each case.

Checking the oil level electronically

The oil level is monitored electronically while driving and is shown on the Control Display.

1. "Vehicle Info"
2. "Vehicle status"
3.  "Engine oil level"

For recommended oil grades, refer to the Owner's Manual.

Tip

To open the hood, pull the lever in the footwell twice. Note the additional information contained in the integrated Owner's Manual for Vehicle.

Flat Tire Monitor FTM

The system identifies a loss of pressure by comparing the speeds of rotation of the individual wheels as the car is traveling.

The system must be initialized with the correct tire pressure in order for it to reliably indicate a flat tire in the instrument cluster.

1. "Vehicle Info"
 2. "Vehicle status"
 3. $\langle \text{!} \rangle_{\text{INIT}}$ "Perform reset"
 4. Start the engine; do not drive away.
 5. "Perform reset"
 6. Initialization of the tire pressure begins.
- Drive away.

The FTM is not a substitute for carrying out tire pressure checks.

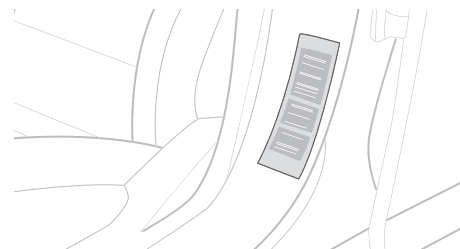
Initialize the FTM/TPM again after correcting the tire pressure or changing the tires/wheels.

Tire Pressure Monitor TPM

TPM checks the inflation pressures of the four mounted tires. The system notifies you if there is a significant loss of pressure in one or more tires.

In order to assure that a flat tire is indicated reliably in the instrument cluster, the system must be reset while all tire inflation pressures are correct.

1. "Vehicle Info"
2. "Vehicle status"
3. $\langle \text{!} \rangle_{\text{INIT}}$ "Perform reset"
4. Start the engine; do not drive away.
5. To reset the tire pressure: "Perform reset".
6. Drive away.



Tire pressure

For speeds of up to 100 mph/160 km/h and for optimum driving comfort, heed the pressure values in the tire inflation pressure table and adjust as necessary.

These pressure values can also be found on the tire inflation pressure label on the driver's door pillar.

Check the tire pressure, with the tires in a cold condition, at least twice per month and before setting out on a lengthy trip. Note the additional information contained in the integrated Owner's Manual for Vehicle.

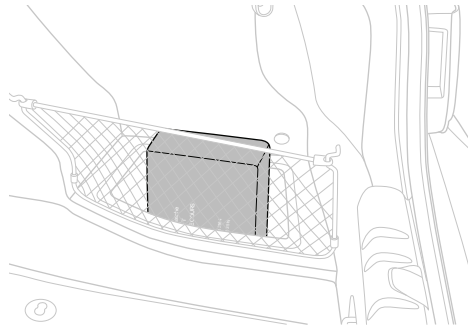
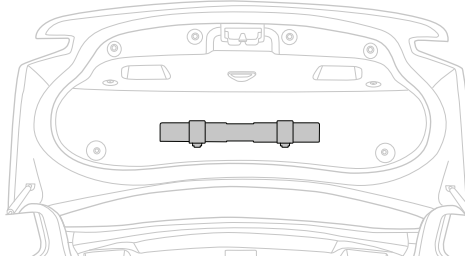

Release the holders to remove it.

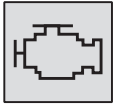


First aid kit

The first aid kit is located in a pocket on the right side of the cargo area.

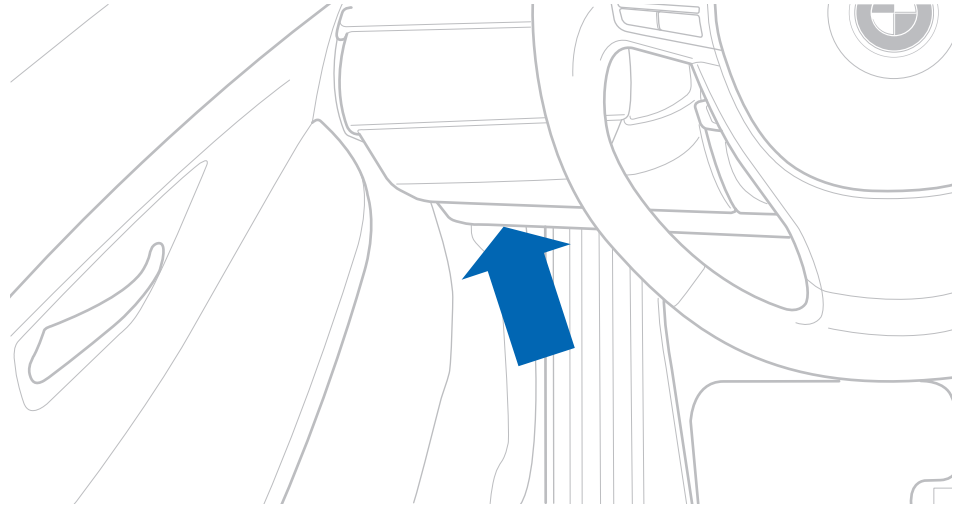
Socket for Onboard Diagnostics OBD

Emissions

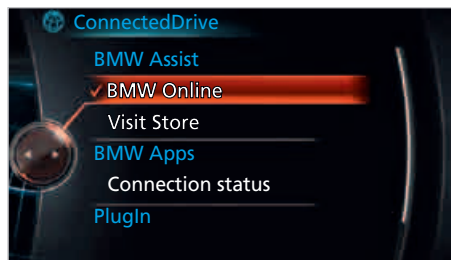
The warning lamp lights up: Emissions are deteriorating. Have the vehicle checked as soon as possible.
