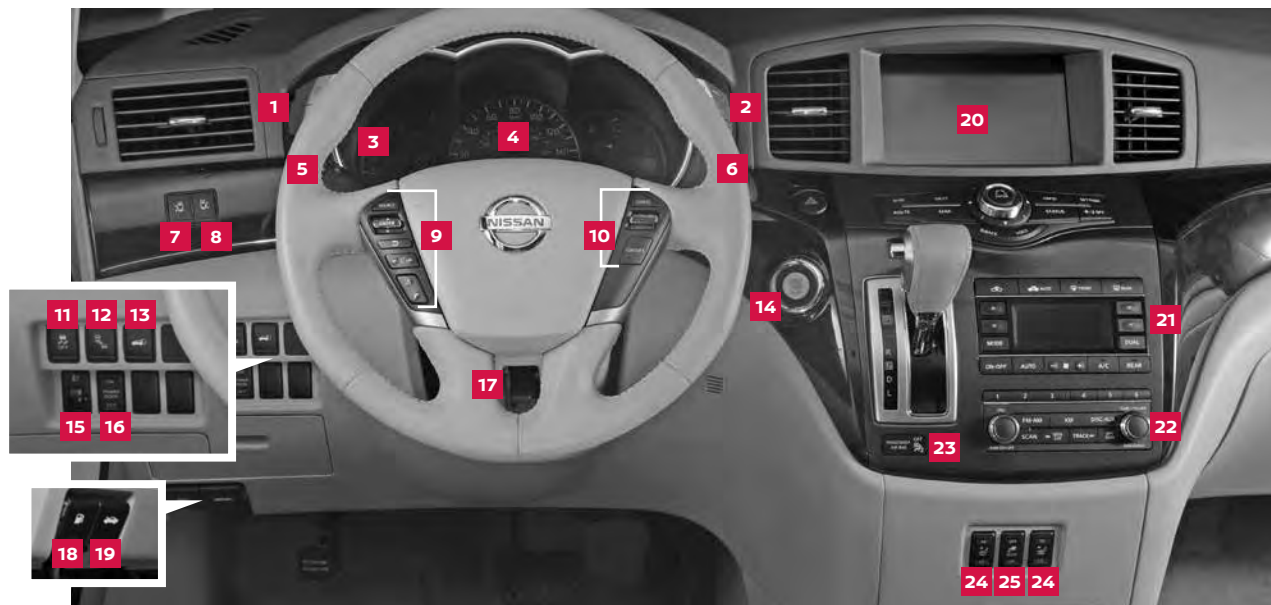

NEW SYSTEM FEATURES

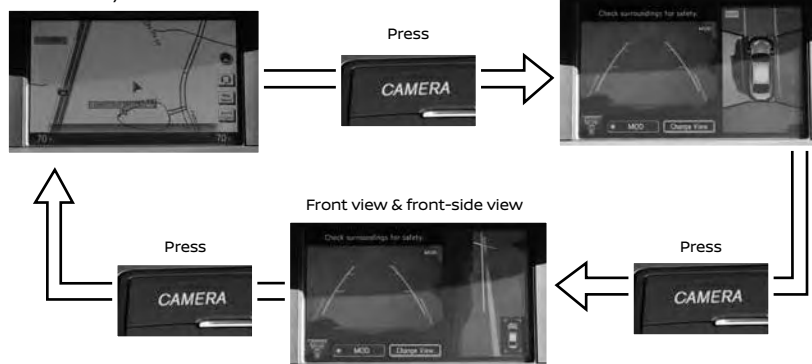
AROUND VIEW® MONITOR WITH MOVING OBJECT DETECTION (MOD) (if so equipped)

- With the ignition switch in the **ON** position, the Around View® Monitor is activated by pressing the **CAMERA** button **1**, located on the control panel, or by moving the shift lever to the **R (REVERSE)** position.

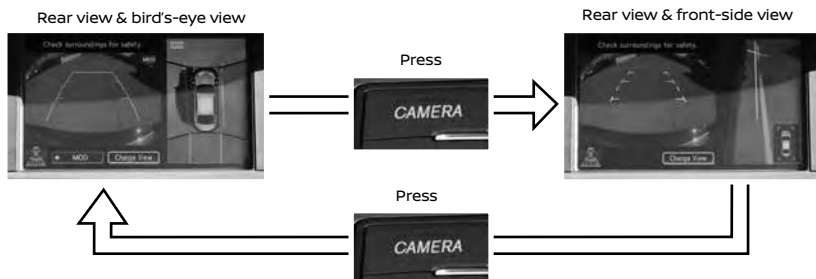


- The monitor displays various views of the position of the vehicle.
- When the shift lever is in the **P (PARK)**, **N (NEUTRAL)** or **D (DRIVE)** position and the **CAMERA** button **1** is pressed, the following views will display in order:

Start from any Control Panel screen



- When the shift lever is in the **R (REVERSE)** position and the **CAMERA** button **1** is pressed, the following views will display in order:

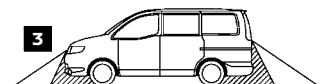
- The colored guide lines on the display screen indicate vehicle width and approximate distances to objects with reference to the vehicle bumper line.

- Red 1.5 ft (0.5 m); Yellow 3 ft (1m); Green 7 ft (2 m) and 10 ft (3 m).

- Predicted course lines **2** indicate the predicted course when operating the vehicle. The lines will be displayed when the steering wheel is turned.



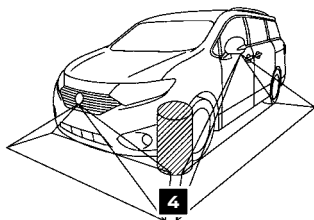
- The course lines will move depending on how much the steering wheel is turned and will not be displayed while the steering wheel is in the neutral position.



- There are some areas where the system will not show objects.

- When in the front or the rear view display, an object below the bumper or on the ground may not be viewed **3**.

- When in the bird's-eye view, a tall object near the seam of the camera viewing areas **4** will not appear in the monitor.



- The distance between objects viewed on the Around View Monitor differs from the actual distance.

- Objects in the bird's-eye view will appear further than the actual distance.



MOVING OBJECT DETECTION (MOD)

- If the MOD system detects moving objects surrounding the vehicle, a yellow frame **4** will be displayed on the camera image and a chime will sound.
- In the bird's-eye view, a yellow frame **4** is displayed on those camera images (front, rear, right, left) where moving objects are detected.
- When the following are displayed:
 - Blue MOD icon **5**; the system is operative in this view.
 - Gray MOD icon **6**; the system is not operative in this view.
 - No MOD icon; the system is off.
- To temporarily turn the system on or off, touch the "MOD" key **7**.

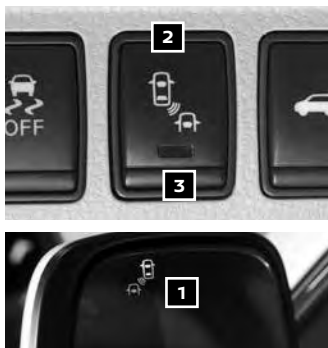

NEW SYSTEM FEATURES

BLIND SPOT WARNING (BSW) (if so equipped)

- The BSW system helps to alert the driver when another vehicle moves into the vehicle's detection zone.
- An indicator light located on the outside mirrors **1** will illuminate if the radar sensors detect a vehicle in the detection zone.
- Push the BSW switch **2** to temporarily turn the system off. When the system is off, the indicator light **3** on the switch is off.
- The indicator light **3** on the switch will illuminate after the ignition switch is switched to the **ON** position and the BSW system is enabled.

ADVANCED CLIMATE CONTROL SYSTEM (if so equipped)

- The advanced climate control system keeps the air inside the vehicle clean using ion control and automatic air intake control with an exhaust gas detecting sensor.
- When ion control is activated, this unit generates highly concentrated Plasmacluster® ions into the air blown from the vents, reducing the odor absorbed inside the vehicle.
- When the automatic air intake control is activated, the exhaust gas detection sensor can detect odors, such as pulp or chemicals, and exhaust gas, such as gasoline or diesel. When such odors or gases are detected, the system automatically changes from the outside air circulation mode to the recirculation mode.

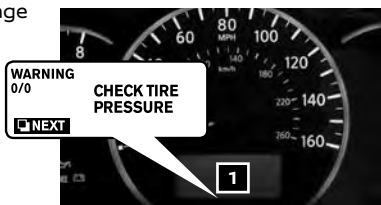

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

TIRE PRESSURE MONITORING SYSTEM (TPMS) WITH EASY-FILL TIRE ALERT

- A **CHECK TIRE PRESSURE** warning message will appear in the trip computer **1** and the low tire pressure warning light **2** will illuminate when one or more tires are low in pressure and air is needed.



- The tire pressures should be checked when the tires are cold. The tires are considered cold after the vehicle has been parked for 3 hours or more or driven less than 1 mi (1.6 km) at moderate speeds.

- When adding air to an under-inflated tire, the TPMS with Easy-Fill Tire Alert provides visual and audible signals outside the vehicle to help you inflate the tire to the recommended COLD tire pressure.



- To use the Easy-Fill Tire Alert system:

1. Move the shift lever to the **P (PARK)** position and apply the parking brake.
2. Place the ignition switch in the **ON** position. Do not start the engine.
3. Add air to the under-inflated tire, and within a few seconds, the hazard warning lights will start flashing.
4. When the designated tire pressure is reached, the horn will beep once and the hazard warning flashers will stop flashing.
5. Repeat this procedure for any additional under-inflated tires.

- After tire pressures are adjusted, drive the vehicle at speeds above 16 mph (25 km/h). The **CHECK TIRE PRESSURE** warning message and low tire pressure warning light **2** will extinguish.

- When the low tire pressure warning light **2** flashes for 1 minute and then remains on, the TPMS is not functioning properly. Have the system checked. It is recommended that you visit a Nissan dealer for this service.

- Tire pressure rises and falls depending on the heat caused by the vehicle's operation and the outside temperature. Low outside temperature can lower the temperature of the air inside the tire, which can cause a lower tire inflation pressure. This may cause the low tire pressure warning light **2** to illuminate. If the warning light illuminates, check the tire pressure in your tires.

- Check the tire pressure (including the spare tire) often and always prior to long distance trips.

- The Tire and Loading Information label contains valuable information. Please refer to the "Maintenance and schedules (section 9)" of your Owner's Manual for the location of the Tire and Loading Information label.

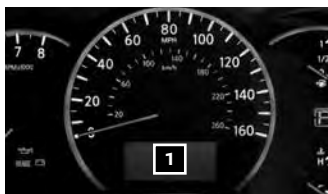
ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

LOOSE FUEL CAP

- A **LOOSE FUEL CAP** warning message will appear in the vehicle information display **1** when the fuel-filler cap is not tightened correctly.
- To tighten, turn the cap clockwise until a single click is heard.
- The warning message will extinguish when the vehicle detects the fuel-filler cap is properly tightened and the reset button **2** is pressed for about 1 second.
- If the cap is not properly tightened, the Malfunction Indicator Light  may illuminate.

FUEL-FILLER DOOR

- To open the fuel-filler door, pull the release **1** located on the lower instrument panel to the left of the steering wheel.
- The fuel-filler door is located on the driver's side of the vehicle.

CLOCK SET/ADJUSTMENT

FM/AM RADIO WITH COMPACT DISC (CD) PLAYER (if so equipped)

1. Press the **MENU** button **1** repeatedly until "Clock: ON" or "Clock: OFF" appears on the display and use the **TUNE/FOLDER** knob **2** to select "Clock: ON".
2. Press the **MENU** button **1** until "Adjust Clock" is displayed, and then select "Yes".
3. Press the **MENU** button **1**. Turn the **TUNE/FOLDER** knob **2** to adjust the hour.
4. Press the **MENU** button **1**. Turn the **TUNE/FOLDER** knob **2** to adjust the minutes.
5. Press the **MENU** button **1** to exit the clock mode.



FM/AM/SAT RADIO WITH COMPACT DISC (CD) PLAYER (Type A) (if so equipped)

1. Rotate the **TUNE SCROLL** knob **4** until "Clock Adjust" is displayed and press the **ENTER/SETTING** button **3**.
2. Turn the **TUNE SCROLL** knob **4** to adjust the hour and then press the **ENTER/SETTING** button **3**.
3. Turn the **TUNE SCROLL** knob **4** to adjust the minute and then press the **ENTER/SETTING** button **3**.



FM/AM/SAT RADIO WITH COMPACT DISC (CD) PLAYER (Type B) (if so equipped)

- To adjust the time and the appearance of the clock on the display:

1. Press the **SETTING** button on the control panel.
2. Touch the "Others" key.
3. Touch the "Clock" key.



- The following settings can be adjusted:

- **On-screen Clock:** The clock in the upper right corner of the display can be turned ON or off.
- **Clock Format (24h):** The clock can be set to 12 hours or 24 hours.
- **Offset (hour):** The time can be adjusted by increasing or decreasing per hour.
- **Offset (min):** The time can be adjusted by increasing or decreasing per minute.
- **Daylight Savings Time:** The application of Daylight Savings Time can be turned ON or off.
- **Time Zone:** Adjust the time zone. Choose a time zone from the available list.

- Touch the "**BACK**" key to return to the previous screen.

FIRST DRIVE FEATURES

NISSAN INTELLIGENT KEY® SYSTEM

The Nissan Intelligent Key® System allows you to lock or unlock your vehicle, open your liftgate and start the engine. It is important to make sure the Intelligent Key is with you (that is, in your pocket or purse).

- The operating range of the Intelligent Key is within 31.5 in (80 cm) from each request switch.
- To lock the vehicle, push either door handle request switch **1** or the liftgate request switch **2** or press the **1** button **3** on the key fob.
- To unlock the vehicle, perform one of the following procedures:
 - Push either door handle request switch **1** or the liftgate request switch **2**; the corresponding door will unlock. Push the request switch again within 1 minute; all other doors will unlock, or
 - Press the **1** button **4** on the key fob to unlock the driver's side door. Press the **1** button **4** again within 1 minute; all other doors will unlock.
- To open the power liftgate (if so equipped), press the  button **5** for more than 1 second.
- The Intelligent Key can also be used to activate the panic alarm by pressing and holding the  button **6** for more than 1 second. Once activated, the panic alarm and headlights will stay on for a period of time.



INTELLIGENT KEY BATTERY DISCHARGE

- If the battery of the Intelligent Key is discharged or environmental conditions interfere with the Intelligent Key operation, start the engine according to the following procedure:
 1. Move the shift lever to the **P (PARK)** position.
 2. Firmly apply the foot brake.
 3. Touch the ignition switch with the Intelligent Key and a chime will sound.
 4. Within 10 seconds after the chime sounds, push the ignition switch **START/STOP** button while depressing the brake pedal and the engine will start.

POWER SLIDING DOOR RELEASE (if so equipped)

Use one of the following methods to open the power sliding doors:

- Press the driver's side **1** or the passenger's side **2** button on the Nissan Intelligent Key® for approximately 1 second.
- From the driver's seat, push the driver's side **3** or passenger's side **4** sliding door switch for about 0.5 seconds. The switches are located on the driver's side instrument panel.
- Pull the sliding door handle (inside or outside) until you hear the chime.

FIRST DRIVE FEATURES

POWER LIFTGATE RELEASE (if so equipped)

Use one of the following methods to open the liftgate:

- Press the  button **1** on the Nissan Intelligent Key® for more than 1 second.
- Once unlocked, push the liftgate opener switch **2** while carrying the Intelligent Key with you (that is, in your pocket or purse).
- From inside the vehicle, push the power liftgate switch **3** located on the instrument panel to the left of the steering wheel.

FRONT POWER SEAT ADJUSTMENTS (if so equipped)

- To slide the seat forward or backward, push the switch **1** forward or backward.
- To adjust the angle of the seatback, push the switch **2** forward or backward.



POWER SEAT LIFTER (driver's seat)

- To raise or lower the height of the seat, push the switch **1** up or down.
- To raise or lower the front portion of the seat, push the front or back end of the switch **1** up or down.

POWER LUMBAR SUPPORT (driver's seat)

- To adjust the seat lumbar area, push the front or back portion of the switch **3**.

2ND ROW SEAT ADJUSTMENTS

- To slide the seat forward or backward, pull the lever **1** up and hold it while you slide the seat forward or backward to the desired position.
- Release the lever **1** to lock the seat in position.
- To adjust the angle of the seatback, pull the lever **2** up and lean back. To bring the seatback forward, pull the lever up and lean your body forward.
- Release the lever **2** to lock the seatback in position.

FOLDING THE 2ND ROW SEATS

- Secure the seat belts on the seat belt hooks **1** on the side wall.
- To fold down the seatbacks, pull the lever **2** on the 2nd row seat.
- To return the seatbacks, lift up each seatback and push it to the upright position until it is latched.

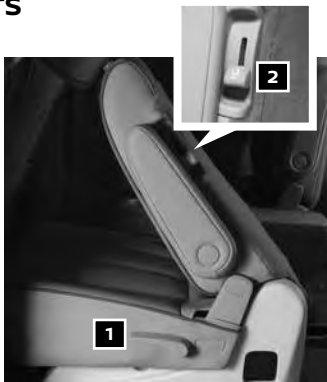


ENTERING/EXITING THE 3RD ROW SEATS

- The 2nd row seats can tilt and slide forward for easy entry and exit to and from the 3rd row seats.
- To enter or exit the 3rd row seat, pull the lever **1** or **2** up to tilt down the seatback and slide the seat forward.
- Return and lock the 2nd row seats by sliding the seats to the rearmost position and tilting up the seatback after use.

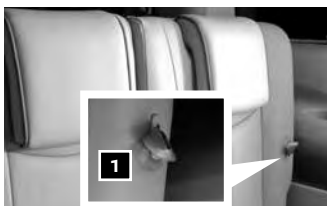
3RD ROW SEAT ADJUSTMENTS

- To adjust the angle of the seatback, pull the strap **1** on the seatback and lean back.

Release the strap at the desired angle.

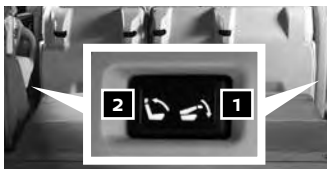
3RD ROW POWER FOLDING SEATS (if so equipped)

- To fold the power 3rd row seats, push the front side of the switch **1** located on the right or left side of the cargo area. The corresponding 3rd row seatback will be folded down automatically.

- Push and hold the rear side of the switch **2**. A beep will sound and the rear seatback will rise up while you are holding the switch. A beep will sound when the seatback is returned to its fully upright position.

AUTOMATIC DRIVE POSITIONER (if so equipped)

- Two positions for the driver's seat and outside mirrors can be stored in the automatic drive positioner memory.
- Follow this procedure to set the memory positions:

- Confirm the shift lever is in the **P (PARK)** position.
 - Place the ignition switch in the **ON** position.
 - Adjust the driver's seat and outside mirrors to the desired positions using the adjusting switches for each feature.
 - Push the **SET** switch, and within 5 seconds, push the memory switch (**1** or **2**) for at least 1 second.
 - The indicator light on the memory switch you select will illuminate for approximately 5 seconds.
 - The driver's seat and outside mirror positions are now set to your preferences.
- These memorized positions can also be linked to your Nissan Intelligent Key®. To link a memorized position to your Intelligent Key, press the unlock button on the key fob after completing the previous step.

OUTSIDE MIRROR CONTROL SWITCH

- To select the right or left side mirror, turn the control switch **1** right or left.
- To adjust the mirror angle, move the control switch **1** up, down, right or left.
- To prevent accidentally moving the mirror, turn and set the switch to the center (neutral) position.



REVERSE TILT-DOWN FEATURE (if so equipped)

The reverse tilt-down feature will turn both of the outside mirror surfaces downward to provide better rear visibility close to the vehicle.

1. Place the ignition switch in the **ON** position.
2. Choose either the right or left outside mirror by operating the outside mirror control switch **1**.
3. Move the shift lever to the **R (REVERSE)** position.
4. Both outside mirror surfaces will turn downward.

The outside mirror surfaces will return to their original positions when one of the following conditions has occurred:

- The shift lever is moved to any position other than **R (REVERSE)**.
- The outside mirror control switch is set to the center (neutral) position.
- The ignition switch is placed in the OFF position.

STARTING/STOPPING THE ENGINE

- It is important to make sure the Nissan Intelligent Key® is with you (that is, in your pocket or purse).
- Depress the brake pedal.
 - If the brake pedal is not depressed, pushing the ignition switch once enters the **ACC** mode.
 - If the ignition switch is pushed a second time, the vehicle will enter the **ON** mode.
- Press the ignition switch **START/STOP** button to start the engine.



TURNING THE ENGINE OFF

- Move the shift lever to the **P (PARK)** position and apply the parking brake.
- Press the ignition switch **START/STOP** button to turn the engine off.

FIRST DRIVE FEATURES

HEADLIGHT CONTROL SWITCH

HEADLIGHT CONTROL

- Turn the headlight control switch to the  position **1** to turn on the front parking, side marker, tail, license plate and instrument panel lights. Turn the switch to the  position **2** to turn on the headlights.



AUTOLIGHT SYSTEM (if so equipped)

- The autolight system will automatically turn the headlights on when it is dark and off when it is light. The system will keep the headlights on for a period of time after you turn the ignition off and all doors are closed.
- To activate the autolight system, turn the headlight control switch to the **AUTO** position **3** then place the ignition switch in the **ON** position. To deactivate the autolight system, turn the headlight control switch to the **OFF** position,  position **1** or  position **2**.

HIGH BEAM SELECT

- With the headlights ON (either in the **AUTO** or  position), push the headlight control switch forward **4** to select the high beam function. The blue indicator light  will illuminate in the instrument panel. Pull the headlight switch back to the original position to select the low beam . The blue indicator light will extinguish.
- Pull and release the headlight control switch **5** to flash the headlight high beams on and off.



FOG LIGHT SWITCH (if so equipped)

- The headlights must be on and the low beams  selected for the fog lights to operate.
- Turn the switch (inside collar) to the  position **6** to turn the fog lights on.
- Turn the switch (inside collar) to the **OFF** position to turn the fog lights off.



LANE CHANGE SIGNAL

- Move the lever up or down until the turn signal begins to flash but the lever does not latch to signal a lane change. Hold the lever until the lane change is completed.
- Move the lever up or down until the turn signal begins to flash but the lever does not latch and release the lever. The turn signal will automatically flash three times.
- Choose the appropriate method to signal a lane change based on the road and traffic conditions.

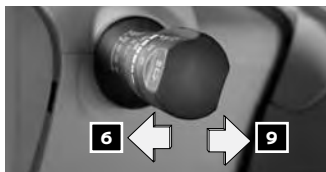
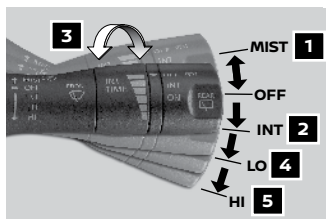

WIPER AND WASHER SWITCH

- Move the lever to one of the following positions to operate the front windshield wipers:

- 1** Mist (**MIST**) – One sweep operation of the front wipers.
- 2** Intermittent (**INT**) – To operate intermittently, push the lever down. The intermittent speed can be adjusted by twisting the time control ring **3** to increase or decrease wiper speed.
- 4** Low (**LO**) – Front wipers operate at a continuous low-speed.
- 5** High (**HI**) – Front wipers operate at a continuous high-speed.
- 6** Front washer  – Pull the lever toward you to activate the front washer. The front wipers will operate several times.



REAR WIPER AND WASHER

- 7** Intermittent (**INT**) – Rear wiper operates intermittently.
- 8** Low (**ON**) – Rear wiper operates at a continuous low-speed.
- 9** Rear washer  – Push the lever forward to activate the rear washer. The rear wiper will operate several times.

FIRST DRIVE FEATURES



HEATER AND AIR CONDITIONER (automatic) (if so equipped)

1 AUTO BUTTON

- The automatic mode may be used year-round. Press the **AUTO** button to turn the system on. The system will automatically control the inside temperature (automatic cooling and/or dehumidified heating), air flow distribution and fan speed.

2 FAN SPEED CONTROL BUTTON

- Press the fan speed control button  to manually adjust the fan speed down – or up +.

3 DRIVER'S SIDE TEMPERATURE CONTROL BUTTONS

- Press the driver's side temperature control buttons up ▲ for warmer air or down ▼ for cooler air.

4 MODE BUTTON

- Press the **MODE** button to cycle through the following air flow outlets:

-  Air flows from the center and side vents.
-  Air flows from the center, side and foot vents.
-  Air flows mainly from the foot vents.
-  Air flows from the front defroster and foot vents.

5 PASSENGER'S SIDE TEMPERATURE CONTROL BUTTONS

- Press the passenger's side temperature control buttons up ▲ for warmer air or down ▼ for cooler air.

6 DUAL BUTTON

- Press the **DUAL** button to turn the passenger's side temperature controls on or off. This will allow the passenger's side temperature to be adjusted independently from the driver's side by pressing the passenger's side temperature control buttons.

7 AIR RECIRCULATION BUTTON

- Press the air recirculation button  to recirculate interior air inside the vehicle. The indicator light on the button will illuminate. This system is used to avoid certain outside odors and to help adjust the inside vehicle temperature more effectively.
- The air recirculation mode cannot be activated when the climate control system is in the front defroster mode  **FRONT** or in the front defroster and foot vent mode .

8 AUTO-RECIRCULATION BUTTON

- Press the auto-recirculation button  **AUTO** to switch to the automatic air intake control mode. The indicator light on the button will illuminate.
- In this mode, the sensor detects certain odors and gases to automatically switch between the air recirculation mode and the outside air circulation mode.
- The auto-recirculation mode cannot be activated when the air flow control is in the front defroster mode  **FRONT** or in the front defroster and foot outlet mode .

9 DEFROSTING/DEFOGGING FRONT AND SIDE WINDOWS

- Press the front defroster button  **FRONT** to turn the system on. The A/C automatically turns on when the front defroster mode is selected. This feature removes humidity from the air.
- Press the temperature control buttons  or  to set the desired temperature.
- To defrost the front and side windows quickly, set the temperature controls and fan speed controls to their maximum settings.

10 DEFROSTING REAR WINDOW AND OUTSIDE MIRRORS (if so equipped)

- Push the rear window defroster switch  **REAR** to turn the system on or off.
- This function automatically turns off after approximately 15 minutes.

11 A/C BUTTON

- Press the **A/C** button to turn the air conditioner system on or off. This system helps cool and dehumidify the air inside the cabin and defog the windows.

12 REAR BUTTON

- To control the rear automatic air conditioning system with the front air conditioner control panel, press the **REAR** button.
- When the rear automatic air conditioning system is on, the indicator light on the **REAR** button will illuminate and the front display will switch to the rear air conditioner screen.
- To adjust the front air conditioning system, press the **REAR** button again or wait 10 seconds.
- The rear passenger controls are unavailable when **REAR** is shown on the front display.



13 ON-OFF BUTTON

- Press the **ON-OFF** button to turn the climate control system on or off.

1 ON-OFF BUTTON/VOL (volume) CONTROL KNOB

- Press the **ON-OFF** button to turn the system on or off.
- Turn the **VOL** (volume) control knob right or left to increase or decrease the volume.

2 AUDIO BUTTON/TUNE/FOLDER KNOB

- Press the **AUDIO** button to go to the audio settings screen.

TRIP COMPUTER

- When the  button **1** is pressed, the following modes will appear on the vehicle information display **2**:

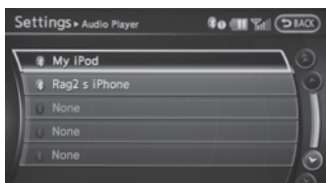
BLUETOOTH® STREAMING AUDIO* WITH NAVIGATION (if so equipped)

- If you have a compatible Bluetooth® device with streaming audio (A2DP and AVRCP profiles), you can set up the wireless connection between your Bluetooth® device and your vehicle’s audio system. This connection allows you to listen to audio from the Bluetooth® device using your vehicle’s speakers.

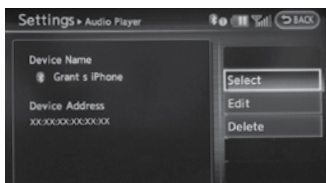

NAVIGATION SYSTEM (if so equipped)

- Your Navigation System can calculate a route from your current location to a preferred destination. The real-time map display and turn-by-turn voice guidance will lead you along the route.
- The Navigation System will continually update your vehicle's position. If you have deviated from the original route, it will recalculate the route from your current location.
- To help promote safe driving, some functions cannot be operated or have limited operation when the vehicle speed is above 5 mph (8 km/h). The on-screen text and keys for these restricted functions will be grayed-out or muted and cannot be selected while driving. These functions will become available again when the vehicle speed is reduced to 5 mph (8 km/h). Voice commands may be available for some of the restricted functions. - 1** Touch-screen display
- 2 DEST** (Destination) – Press to enter a destination.
- 3 INFO** (Information) – Press to display the vehicle, traffic (if so equipped), weather (if so equipped) or Voice Recognition information.
- 4 SETTING** – Press to access the system settings.
- 5** Multi-function controller – Turn to highlight an item on the screen, press to select the highlighted item or scroll the map.

- 6**  – Press to switch to the zoom mode to change the map scale. Use the center dial to adjust the map scale. Turn clockwise to zoom in. Turn counterclockwise to zoom out.
- 7** **ROUTE** – Press to access guidance control functions (guidance cancellation, route priority, waypoint setting on the route, etc.).
- 8** **MAP** – Press to display the map. While following a programmed route, press multiple times to change the type of route information.
- 9** **STATUS** – Press multiple times to display audio information with either the air conditioner status, fuel economy or navigation directions.
- 10**  **OFF** – Press to switch between the day screen (bright) and the night screen (dark). Press and hold to turn off the display. Press again to turn on the display.
- 11**  **BACK** – Press to return to the previous screen. In a settings screen, this button can also be used to apply the setting. In a character input screen, this button can also delete the characters that have been entered.
- 12** **VOICE** – Press to hear the current guidance for a programmed route.

- Use the remote controller, provided with the system, to operate the rear display screen.

HOMELINK® UNIVERSAL TRANSCEIVER (if so equipped)

- The HomeLink® Universal Transceiver can learn and consolidate the functions of up to three different hand-held transmitters, operating items such as garage doors, property gates, outdoor and indoor lights or alarm systems.
- To program the HomeLink® Universal Transceiver:
 - Position the handheld transceiver 1-3 in (26-76 mm) away from the HomeLink surface, keeping the HomeLink indicator light in view.
 - Press and hold the desired HomeLink button and the handheld transmitter button simultaneously until the HomeLink indicator light flashes slowly and then rapidly.
 - Both buttons may be released when the indicator light flashes rapidly.
- To verify the programming is complete, press and hold the HomeLink button and observe the indicator light:
 - A solid, continuous light indicates the programming is complete and the HomeLink button will activate your device.
 - A blinking light that turns to a solid, continuous light after 2 seconds indicates additional steps are required to complete the programming.
- An additional person may make the remaining steps easier. To complete the programming process:
 - At the receiver of the device that you are programming to the HomeLink button, press and release the learn or smart button (the name may vary by manufacturer, but it is usually located near where the hanging antenna wire is attached to the unit). You have approximately 30 seconds to initiate the following step.
 - Press and hold the programmed HomeLink button for 2 seconds and release.
- You may have to repeat the previous two steps up to three times to complete the programming process. HomeLink should now activate your device.
