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Precautions for safety

WARNING:

- Do not disassemble, assemble, or modify the RSE system. Such acts could result in accidents, fire, or electric shock.
- Do not to spill water or insert foreign objects into the device. Such acts could lead to smoke, fire, or product malfunction.
- Please refrain from use if the screen is blank or no sound can be heard as these signs may indicate product malfunction. Continued use in such conditions could lead to accidents (fires, electric shock) or product malfunctions.
- Do not disassemble or modify the headphones. Such acts could result in accidents, fire, or electric shock.
- Store the headphones in a door pocket when they are not being used in order to reduce the chance of injury in case of an accident or sudden stop.
- Do not use damaged batteries. Such acts could result in fires or explosions.
- Be careful when charging batteries. Headphones may overheat when batteries are being charged and cause injury.

Precautions for safety

- Do not charge conventional batteries using the charger. Such acts could result in fires or explosions.
- The cigarette lighter/electrical socket and other connected electric accessories will operate only when the ignition is switched on. Improper use of the cigarette lighter/electric socket and other electric accessories can lead to serious injuries or fires. Never leave children unattended with the vehicle key.
- Reclining the seat all the way back may cause product damage.



Precautions for safety

CAUTION:

- Turn on the car ignition before using this device. Do not operate the RSE System for long periods of time with the ignition turned off as such operations may lead to battery discharge.
 - Adjust the volume to levels that allow the driver to hear sounds from outside of the vehicle. Driving in a state where external sounds and warning alarms in the vehicle cannot be heard may lead to accidents.
 - Pay attention to the volume setting when turning the device on. A sudden output of extreme volume upon turning the device on could lead to hearing impairment.
- (Adjust the volume to a suitable level before turning off the device.)
- Do not subject the device to severe shock or impact. Direct pressure onto the front side of the monitor may cause damage to the LCD or touch screen.
 - When cleaning the device, make sure to turn off the device and use a dry and smooth cloth. Never use tough materials, chemical cloths, or solvents(alcohol, benzene, thinners, etc.) as such materials may damage the device panel or cause color/quality deterioration.
 - When experiencing product malfunctions, have the product inspected by an authorized Kia dealer.

Precautions for safety

- Do not expose the headphones to direct sunlight, strong heat and/or a highly humid environment. The headphones could become deformed and the batteries in them could leak or even explode under these conditions.
- Avoid dropping the headphones and hitting them against hard objects.
- Do not sit on the headphones or place anything heavy on them.
- Do not charge batteries used for wireless headphones with the engine turned off. Such acts could result in vehicle battery discharge.
- Use only batteries that are approved for the wireless headphones. Approved batteries must satisfy the following requirements: rechargeable (Ni-MH) AAA batteries.

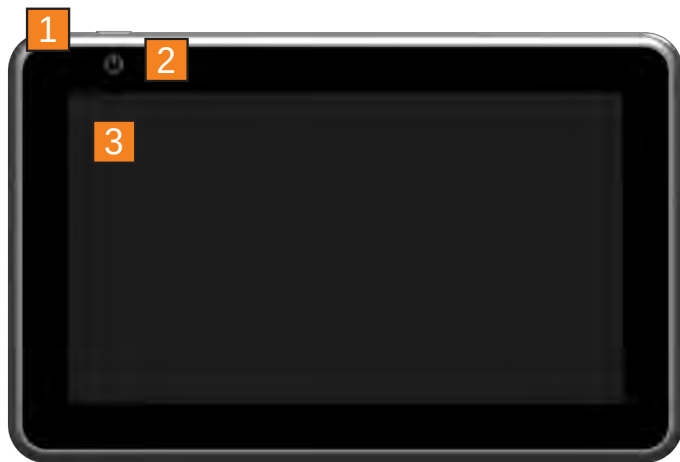

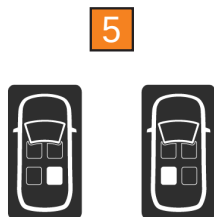

Turning the System On/Off

Turning the System ON

Press the engine start button then press the power button at the upper left side.



Note

- If the system is set to "Turn power on automatically," the system will start automatically upon vehicle ignition. For more information, refer to "Power Setting".

Turning the System Off

Press the engine start button again or press the power key on the RSE system to turn off the system.

Display ON/OFF

Press the Display  button on the screen. Even when the display is off, sound will be played. Touch anywhere on the touch screen to turn the display back on.

Adjusting the Display Mode

Press the Brightness  button on the screen. Select the desired mode.



Name	Description
Day Mode	Brightness level suited better for the day time.
Night Mode	Brightness level suited better for night.

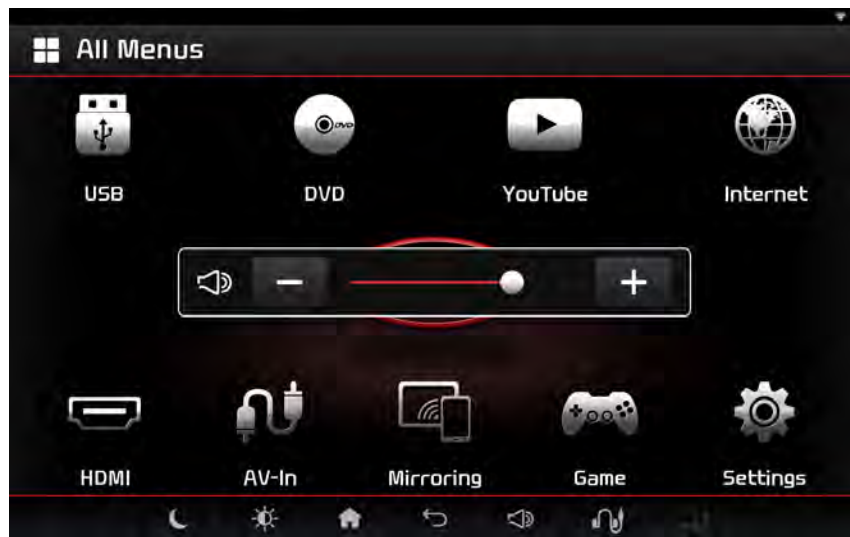

Resetting the System

This feature is used to reset the system in the occurrence of an unforeseen error or problem.



To reset the system, use a clip or a pin to press into the RESET button.

Using the System for the First Time

Setting the Speaker Mode

Press the speaker icon. Each time the button is pressed, the mode will change between the headphones and vehicle speaker.

Note

- The vehicle speakers can be selected for use from one monitor. When in use, the vehicle speakers cannot be connected to the other monitor.
- For more information on connecting Bluetooth headphones, refer to “Bluetooth”.

Using the System for the First Time

Vehicle Speaker - RSE Monitor

This mode is used to play RSE monitor sounds through the car speakers.

Vehicle Speaker - Media Box

This mode is used to play external device sounds through the car speakers. When an external device connector jack is connected with the vehicle media box (AUX input terminal), the sound from the external device will automatically play through the vehicle speakers.

Note

- Vehicle Speaker - RSE Monitor mode cannot be used when the Vehicle Speaker - Media Box icon is active.
- The Media Box image may differ according to the vehicle model.

Using the System for the First Time

Connecting the Wireless Headphones

1. Remove the protective film on the battery cover.
2. Press and hold the power button for over 5 seconds until the LED starts flashing quickly. The wireless headphone will be ready to start the connection process.
3. Press Settings → Bluetooth on the Display Monitor you wish to connect.
4. Select the device name from the list.
5. Once the wireless headphones are properly recognized, a message appears on the RSE display and the LED will flash slowly.
6. Repeat the process for the second wireless headphone.
7. Attach the Left / Right stickers on the inside of the left / right wireless headphones.

Note

- Once you have completed the wireless headphone setup, then Bluetooth will connect automatically when the power is turned on.
 - When using Bluetooth headphones and the vehicle speakers together, a delay in sound may occur in the headphones.
 - The wireless headphones are an optional feature.

Using the System for the First Time

Charging/Replacing the Batteries

When the LED turns red, the battery charge is weak and the batteries need to be charged/replaced.

Charging the Batteries

Connect the USB charger cable to the charging port on the bottom left side of the headphone.



Using the System for the First Time

Replacing the Batteries

1. Rotate the cover on the left headphone from right to left to open the battery compartment.
2. Replace the batteries.
3. Reattach the cover and rotate it from left to right until it engages.



Note

- When replacing with a non-chargeable battery, never connect the charging cable.
- Battery charging through the Charging Port is possible with the provided rechargeable batteries.

On-Screen Touch Controls

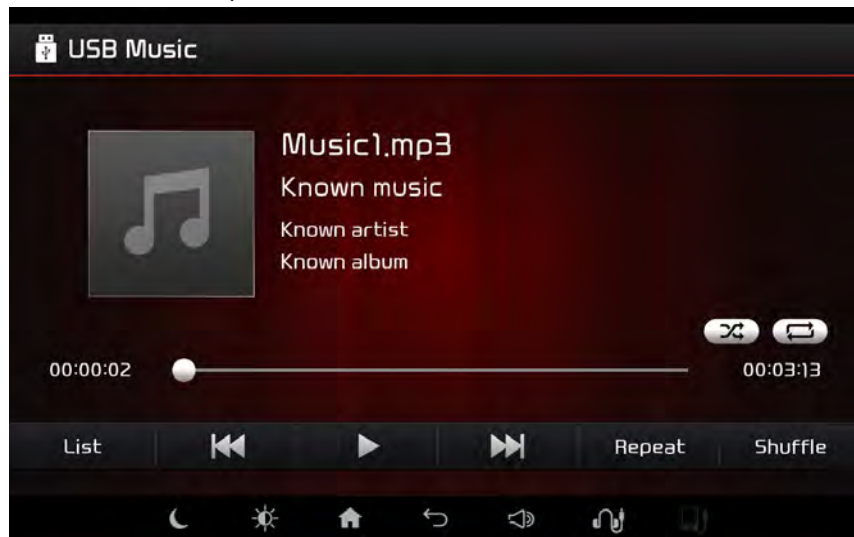

Select

Mirroring

Before Using Mirroring

- You can use the Screen mirroring feature to display your device screen on the system display without connecting a cable.
- To use the Mirroring feature, you must first turn on the Wi-Fi in your mobile device.
- The Mirroring feature is supported only in Android devices.
- To use the Mirroring feature, first turn off the WiFi connection in the system.

Starting Mirroring

1. Press the  button → Press **Mirroring**.



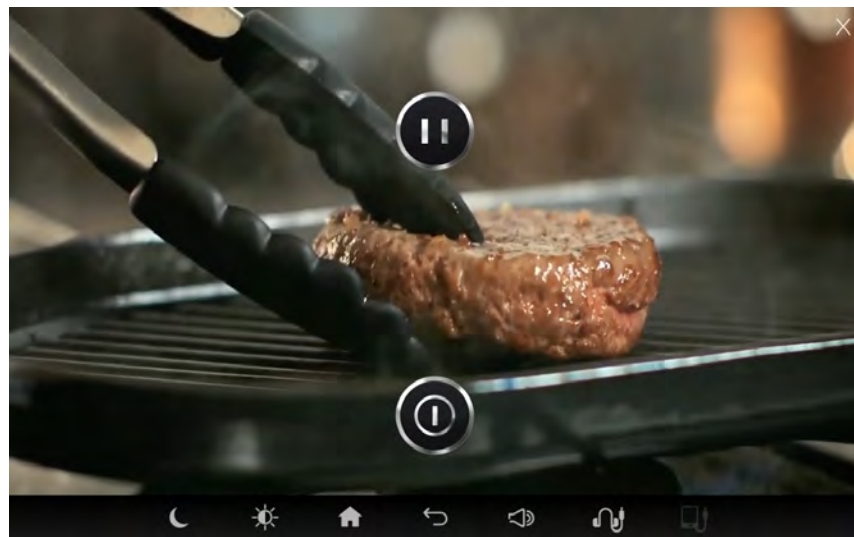
2. Turn the mirroring feature on in your mobile device. Then select the system name.

Note

- The method of setting the Mirroring may differ by mobile device. For more information, refer to your mobile device user's manual.
- The default system name is RSE-xxxxxxxxxx.

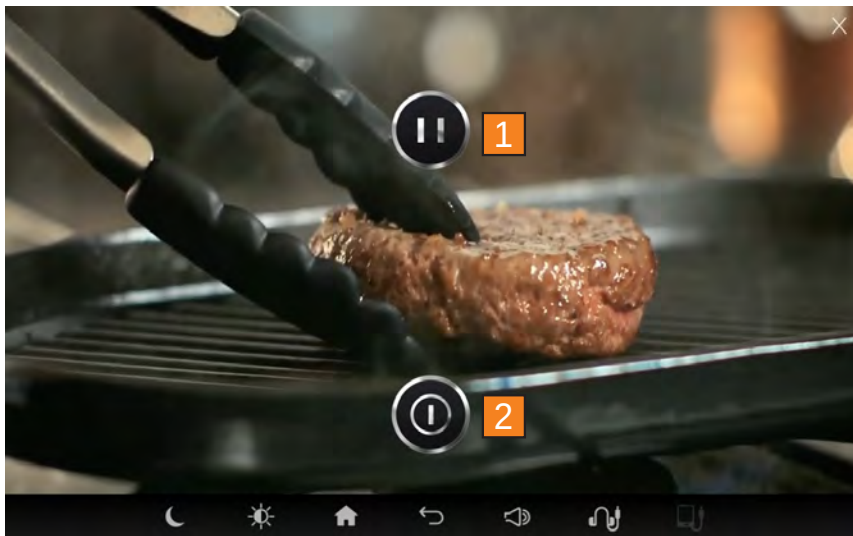
3. When your mobile device is connected, the mobile device screen is displayed on the system display.

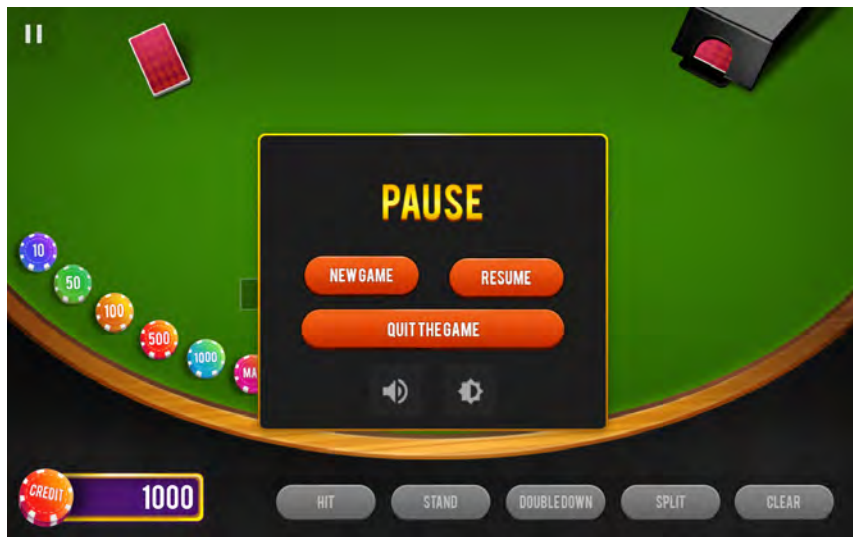

Settings

Starting mode

Press the **Home** button → Press **Settings** button to display the Settings screen.



Language

This menu allows you to set the language of the system.
