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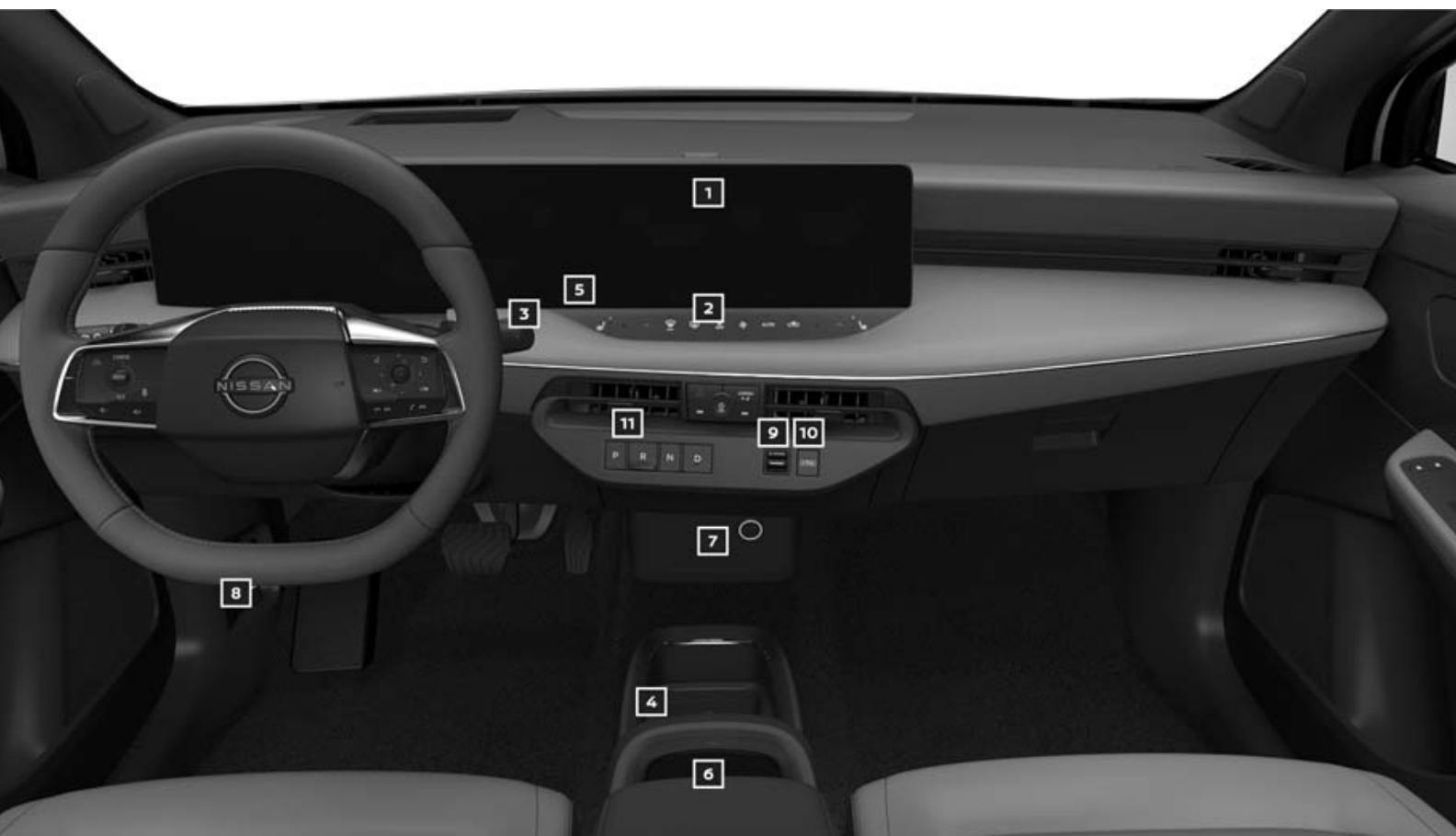

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GETTING STARTED

NISSAN INTELLIGENT KEY® SYSTEM

This system allows you to lock or unlock the vehicle, open the liftgate and start your vehicle. It is important to make sure the Intelligent Key is with you (that is, in your pocket or purse).

- To lock the vehicle, touch either lock sensor **1** or the liftgate request switch **2** once or press the  button **3** on the key fob.
- To unlock the vehicle, perform one of the following procedures:
 - Wrap your hand around the driver's door handle; the driver's door will unlock. Touch the lock sensor within 60 seconds; all other doors will unlock, or
 - Press the  button **4** on the key fob to unlock the driver's side door. Press the  button **4** again within 1 minute; all other doors will unlock.
- The charge port lid is linked to the door locking mechanism of the vehicle. If vehicle doors are locked, the charge port lid will be unlocked when you approach the vehicle with the Intelligent Key. When you walk away from the vehicle with the Intelligent Key, the charge port lid will be locked automatically.
- The Intelligent Key can also be used to activate the panic alarm by pressing and holding the  button **6** for more than 1 second. Once activated, the panic alarm and headlights will stay on for a period of time.
 - Press any button on the key fob to turn the panic alarm off, or press the door request switch if the key fob is in range.



LIFTGATE RELEASE (if so equipped)

- To open the liftgate, press the  button **5** for longer than 1 second.
- To close the liftgate, press the  button **5** again for longer than 1 second.

APPROACH UNLOCK FUNCTION

- When you approach the vehicle with the Intelligent Key, the vehicle will unlock automatically. This function is disabled by the default setting. You can enable this function by using the vehicle information display.

GETTING STARTED

WALK AWAY LOCK FUNCTION

- When you walk away from the vehicle with the Intelligent Key, the vehicle will lock automatically. This function is disabled by the default setting. You can enable this function by using the vehicle information display.

SEAT ADJUSTMENTS (if so equipped)

FRONT POWER SEATS (driver's seat if so equipped)

- To slide the seat forward or backward, push the switch **1** forward or backward.
- To recline the seatback, push the switch **2** forward or backward.



FRONT POWER SEAT LIFTER (driver's seat if so equipped)

- To raise or lower the front portion or height of the seat, push the front or back end of the switch **1** up or down.

FRONT POWER LUMBAR SUPPORT (driver's seat if so equipped)

- To adjust the seat lumbar support, move the switch **3** up or down to adjust the height of the lumbar. Move the switch forward to increase the lumbar support or rearward to decrease the lumbar support.

FOLDING THE REAR SEATBACKS DOWN

- To fold the seatback down, pull the release knob **4**.
- To return the seatback to the seating position, lift up each seatback and push it to the upright position until it is latched. Then return the seat belt to its original position.

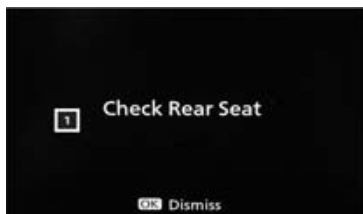
GETTING STARTED

REAR DOOR ALERT

The Rear Door Alert functions under certain conditions to indicate there may be an object or passenger in the rear seat(s). The system is activated when a rear door is opened and closed within 15 minutes before driving.

REAR DOOR ALERT (ACTIVE)

- When the system is active and the driver stops the EV system, the below will occur:
 - A notification message appears in the vehicle information display with the options to “Dismiss Message” **2** or “Disable Alert” **3** if desired.
 - The horn will sound and a **Check Rear Seat** warning **1** will appear on the display.



- To activate Rear Door Alert, in your vehicle information display:
 - Press the scroll/ **OK** dial on the steering wheel until the “Settings” menu screen appears. Press the scroll/ **OK** dial to make the selection.
 - Select “Vehicle Settings”, “Rear Door Alert” and press the scroll/ **OK** dial.
 - Choose from the following options: “Horn & Alert”, “Alert Only” or “OFF” and then press the scroll/ **OK** dial.



- To Dismiss Rear Door Alert:
 - Use the scroll/ **OK** dial on the steering wheel to select “Dismiss Message” **2**. If no selection is made, this message will disappear after a period of time.
- To temporarily disable Rear Door Alert for the remainder of the current trip, use the scroll/ **OK** dial on the steering wheel to select “Disable Alert” **3** and press the scroll/ **OK** dial.

GETTING STARTED

REAR SEAT BELT WARNING

- The rear seatbelt warning **1** appears for 65 seconds after the power switch is placed in the ON position and the EV system is started. This warning shows the status of the rear seat belts.
- When one of the rear seat belts is buckled, the corresponding seat icon will appear in gray or green.
- When one of the rear seat belts is unbuckled, the corresponding seat icon will appear in red.
- After a change in buckle status, a chime will sound and the warning **1** will appear for another 65 seconds.

STARTING/STOPPING THE ELECTRIC VEHICLE (EV) SYSTEM

It is important to make sure the NISSAN Intelligent Key® is with you (that is, in your pocket or purse).

- Confirm the parking brake is applied and push the **P (Park)** switch on the shift selector to place it in the **P (Park)** position.
- Depress the brake pedal.
- Push the power switch to start the EV system.
- Check that the READY to drive indicator light illuminates and the start-up sound is audible.
- Check the Li-ion battery level and the estimated driving range shown on the meter.



TURNING THE EV SYSTEM OFF

- Push the **P (Park)** switch on the shift selector to place it in the **P (Park)** position.
- Apply the parking brake.
- Push the power switch to the OFF position.

GETTING STARTED

OUTSIDE MIRROR CONTROL SWITCH

- Push the left switch **1** to select the driver's side outside mirror or push the right switch **2** to select the passenger's side outside mirror.
- Adjust each mirror to the desired position using the outside mirror control switch **3**.

EMERGENCY CALL (SOS) BUTTON (if so equipped)

- The Emergency Call (SOS) feature requires a NissanConnect® Services subscription.
- With a paid subscription, it can be used to call for assistance in case of an emergency.
- To use the feature, press the cover to open, then press the **SOS**  button **1** on the overhead console.

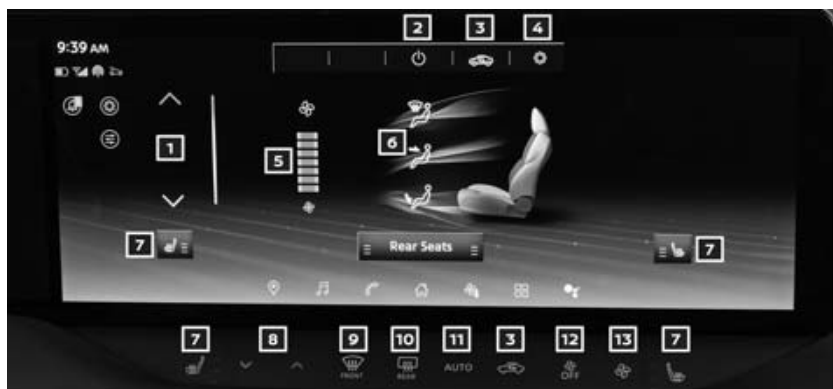

GETTING STARTED

HEATER AND AIR CONDITIONER (automatic)



1 TEMPERATURE CONTROL KEY

- Press the temperature control buttons to set the desired temperature.

2 ON-OFF KEY

- Press the **ON-OFF** button to turn the climate control system on or off.

3 INTAKE AIR CONTROL BUTTON/KEY

- For air recirculation, press the  intake air control button to recirculate air inside the vehicle. The indicator light on the button will illuminate. This system is used to avoid certain outside odors and to help adjust the inside vehicle temperature more effectively.
- For outside air recirculation, press the  intake air control button again to turn off air recirculation. This allows outside air to be drawn into the passenger compartment to prevent fogging in the front defroster, floor vent or front defroster/floor vent mode.
- For automatic air intake control mode, press and hold the  intake air control button. The indicator light will blink twice and the inside/outside circulation will then be controlled automatically.

4 SETTINGS KEY

- Press the settings button to open and change the climate control settings.

5 FAN SPEED KEY

- Press the fan speed control button to manually adjust the fan speed up or down.

GETTING STARTED

6 AIR FLOW CONTROL KEY

- Press the button to cycle through the following air flow outlets:



Air flows from center and side vents.



Air flows from center and side vents and foot outlets.



Air flows mainly from the foot outlets.



Air flows from defroster and foot outlets.

7 HEATED SEATS BUTTON/KEY

- Press the button to turn the heated seats on or off.

8 TEMPERATURE CONTROL BUTTON

- Press the temperature control buttons to set the desired temperature.

9 FRONT DEFROSTER BUTTON

- Press the  front defroster button to turn the system on. Both the air conditioner and heater will automatically turn on when the front defroster mode is selected. The driving range will be reduced when using this setting.
- To remove moisture or fog on the front window quickly, set the temperature control buttons **1** and the fan speed control buttons **5** to their maximum settings.

10 REAR WINDOW AND OUTSIDE MIRROR (if so equipped) DEFROSTER SWITCH

- Push the  rear window and outside mirror (if so equipped) defroster switch to turn the system on or off. Start the engine and push the switch on; the indicator light will illuminate.
- Push the switch again to turn the defroster off. This function automatically turns off after approximately 15 minutes.

11 AUTO BUTTON

- The automatic mode may be used year-round. Press the AUTO button, and the system will automatically control the inside temperature (automatic cooling and/or dehumidified heating), air flow distribution and fan speed.

12 OFF BUTTON

- Press the off button to turn the fan off.

13 FAN SPEED CONTROL BUTTON

- Press the fan speed control button to manually adjust the fan speed.

GETTING STARTED

HEATED SEATS (if so equipped)

- Push the  switch **1** or  switch **2** to heat the seats.
- Push the heated seat switch once for high heat, twice for medium heat and three times for low heat.
- Push the  switch **1** or  switch **2** to turn off the heated seats.

HEADLIGHT CONTROL SWITCH

HEADLIGHT CONTROL

- Turn the headlight control switch to the  position **1** to turn on the front parking, tail, license plate and instrument panel lights. Turn the switch to the  position **2** to turn on the headlights.



AUTOLIGHT SYSTEM

- The autolight system will automatically turn the headlights on when it is dark and off when it is light. The system will keep the headlights on for a period of time after you turn the ignition off and all the doors are closed.
- To activate the autolight system, turn the headlight control switch to the **AUTO** position **3**, then place the ignition in the ON position. To deactivate the autolight system, turn the headlight control switch to the OFF position,  position **1** or  position **2**.

HEADLIGHT BEAM SELECT

- With the headlights turned to the  position **2**, push the headlight control switch forward **4** to select the high beam function. The blue indicator light will illuminate in the instrument panel. Pull the headlight switch back to the original position to select the low beam. The blue indicator light will extinguish.
- Pull and release the headlight control switch **5** to flash on and off the headlight high beams.



GETTING STARTED

HIGH BEAM ASSIST

- To activate the High Beam Assist system, turn the headlight switch to the **AUTO** position **3** and push the switch at the end of the lever. The High Beam Assist indicator light in the meter will illuminate while the headlights are turned on.
- When the vehicle speed lowers to less than approximately 13 mph (20 km/h), the headlight uses the low beam.
- To turn off the High Beam Assist system, push the switch again.

LANE CHANGE SIGNAL

- Move the lever up or down until the turn signal begins to flash but the lever does not latch to signal a lane change. Hold the lever until the lane change is completed.
- Move the lever up or down until the turn signal begins to flash but the lever does not latch and release the lever. The turn signal will flash three times.

Choose the appropriate method to signal a lane change based on the road and traffic conditions.

WIPER AND WASHER SWITCH

- Move the lever to one of the following positions to operate the windshield wipers:

1 Mist (**MIST**) — One sweep operation of the front wipers.

2 Intermittent (**INT**) or Auto (**AUTO**) — Front wipers operate intermittently by moving the lever down to the **INT / AUTO** position and then rotating the control ring **3** to increase or decrease wiper speed. Also, the intermittent operation speed varies in accordance to the vehicle speed.

4 Low (**LO**) — Front wipers operate at a continuous low-speed.

5 High (**HI**) — Front wipers operate at a continuous high-speed.

6 Front washer — Pull the lever towards you to activate the front washer. The front wipers will operate several times.

- To replace the windshield wipers, they must be in the service position.



GETTING STARTED

- To move the wipers to the service position:
 1. When the power switch is in the ON position or within 60 seconds after placing the power switch in the OFF position.
 2. Place the lever in the OFF position and lift the windshield wiper and washer lever upwards twice in less than 0.5 seconds. The windshield wipers will move to the service position automatically.
 3. The wipers can now be replaced.
- To move the wiper blades back to the original position:
 1. Lift the lever to the **MIST** position once and release.
 2. This will cause the wipers to resume the set position.

DRIP WIPE

- Once the wiper spray cycle is finished, there will be a short delay. Then the wipers will sweep one more time to clear off any remaining drips from the windshield.

RAIN-SENSING AUTO WIPER SYSTEM (if so equipped)

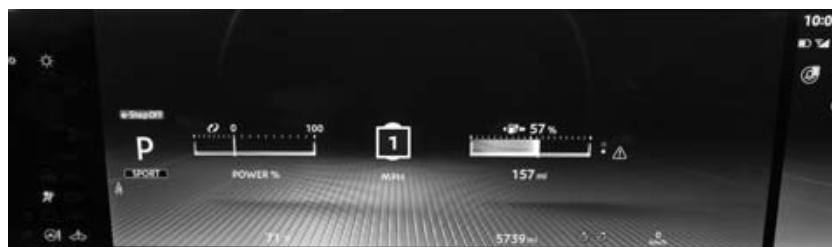
- The rain-sensing auto wiper system automatically turns on the wipers and adjusts the wiper speed depending on the rainfall and the vehicle speed by using the rain sensor located on the upper part of the windshield.
- To set the rain-sensing auto wiper system, push the lever down to the AUTO position **2**. The wiper will sweep one time while the power switch is in the "ON" position.

VEHICLE INFORMATION DISPLAY



The vehicle information display **1** displays items such as:

USING THE VEHICLE INFORMATION DISPLAY

- The vehicle information display can be changed using the scroll/ **OK** button **2**, the **◀▶** buttons **4**, **↑↓** buttons **3** and the **↺** button **5** located on the steering wheel.



RESETTING THE TRIP COMPUTER

- Use the scroll/ **OK** button and the arrow buttons on the steering wheel to select the desired trip mode.
- Press and hold the scroll/ **OK** button for more than one second to reset the selected mode.

TIRE PRESSURE MONITORING SYSTEM (TPMS) WITH EASY-FILL TIRE ALERT



- The low tire pressure warning light **1** and a **Tire Pressure Low — Add Air** warning will illuminate when one or more tires are low in pressure and air is needed.
- Current tire pressure of all tires (except the spare) may be visible on the Tire Pressure screen within the vehicle information display when the vehicle is driven at speeds above 16 mph (25 km/h).

GETTING STARTED

- Adjust the tire pressure to the recommended tire pressure shown on the Tire and Loading information label located in the driver's door opening.
- When the low tire pressure warning light **1** flashes for approximately one minute and then remains on, the TPMS is not functioning properly. It is recommended that you have the system checked by a NISSAN dealer.

EASY-FILL TIRE ALERT

- When adding air to an under-inflated tire, the TPMS with Easy-Fill Tire Alert provides visual and audible signals to help you inflate the tire to the recommended tire pressure.
- To use the Easy-Fill Tire Alert:
 1. Push the **P (Park)** button and apply the parking brake.
 2. Place the ignition switch in the ON position. Do not start the engine.
 3. Add air to the under-inflated tire, and within a few seconds, the hazard warning lights will start flashing.
 4. When the designated tire pressure is reached, the horn will beep once and the hazard warning flashers will stop.
 5. Repeat this procedure for any additional under-inflated tires.

LIFTGATE RELEASE

To open the liftgate, unlock it and push the liftgate opener **1** switch and pull the liftgate up to open. The liftgate can be unlocked by:

- Pressing the **lock** button **2** on the NISSAN Intelligent Key® twice.
- Pushing the liftgate opener switch **1** while carrying the Intelligent Key with you (that is, in your purse or pocket).
- Pushing the door handle request switch twice.
- Pushing the power door lock switch to the unlock position.

The liftgate does not lock when closed. To lock the liftgate, use the liftgate request switch **3**, power door lock or key fob.

GETTING STARTED

POWER LIFTGATE (if so equipped)

- When the liftgate is closed and locked, the liftgate will open automatically by:
 - Push and hold the  switch **1** on the instrument panel for more than 1 second.
 - Pushing the liftgate opener switch **2**.
 - Pressing the  button **3** on the NISSAN Intelligent Key® for more than 1 second.



GETTING STARTED

GARAGE MODE SYSTEM (if so equipped)

- The liftgate can be set to open to a specific height by performing the following procedure:
 1. Open the liftgate.
 2. Pull the liftgate down and move it to the desired height position (the liftgate will have some resistance when being manually adjusted).
 3. Push and hold the  switch **4** and the  lock switch **5** located on the liftgate for approximately 3 seconds or until two beeps are heard.
- The liftgate will open to the selected position setting. To change the position of the liftgate, repeat steps 1 through 3 for setting the position of the liftgate.

MOTION-ACTIVATED LIFTGATE (if so equipped)

To operate the liftgate hands-free:

- Ensure you have the Intelligent Key®.
- Use a quick kicking motion under the center of the rear bumper **1**.
- The vehicle will beep three times and the liftgate will open.
- Do not swing your foot side to side or pause during kicking motion.

GETTING STARTED

CHARGE PORT LID/CHARGE CONNECTOR LOCK SYSTEM

There are two charge ports on your vehicle, the driver side supports normal and trickle charging and the passenger side supports quick charging.

- To open the charge port lid, unlock the doors then push the part of the lid near the rear of vehicle **1** or approach the vehicle with the Intelligent Key and push the charge connector unlock switch **2** in the charge port.

- When the charge port lid springs up slightly, place your hand underneath the lid and open it fully.
- After 30 seconds, the charge connector lock is locked again.

- To close the charge port lid, slowly move the lid and lock it securely in place.
- The normal or trickle charge connector can be locked to the normal charge port by selecting the charge connector lock mode in the vehicle information display.

- There are three different modes of the charge connector lock system:
 - **AUTO** – The charge connector is locked while charging is in progress and will automatically unlock when charging is complete.
 - **LOCK** – The charge connector will remain locked until **UNLOCK** mode is selected.
 - **UNLOCK** – When the unlock mode is selected, the charge connector will unlock and remain unlocked.

NOTE: For DC Quick chargers only, locking is automated for safety, and not controlled by vehicle selection.

COLD WEATHER RANGE AND PARKING IN EXTREMELY COLD WEATHER

COLD WEATHER RANGE

- Vehicle range is reduced when the heater is used and the battery temperature drops below 77°F (25°C).
- Using the climate control system to heat the cabin when the outside temperature is below 32°F (0°C) uses more electricity (heat pump, if so equipped) and affects vehicle range more than using the heater at temperatures above 32°F (0°C).

PARKING IN EXTREMELY COLD WEATHER

- Do not store the vehicle in temperatures below -13°F (-25°C) for over seven days. If the outside temperature is -13°F (-25°C) or lower, the Li-ion battery may freeze, and it cannot be charged or provide power to run the vehicle.

ELECTRIC VEHICLE (EV) SYSTEM WARNING LIGHT

- The warning light will illuminate if there is a malfunction in the following systems:
 - Traction motor and inverter system
 - Charge port or on-board charger
 - Li-ion battery system
 - Cooling system
 - Emergency shut-off system is activated
- If the warning light illuminates, it is recommended that you visit a NISSAN certified Leaf dealer.

GETTING STARTED

LI-ION BATTERY CHARGING

Before charging the Li-ion battery, see your Owner's Manual for detailed warnings and cautions when charging your battery.

- There are three methods available to perform the charge operation: normal charge, trickle charge and quick charge.

NORMAL CHARGE

Normal charging is only supported on the driver's side charge port.

- Perform a normal charge using the charging device installed in your home.
- Normal charging uses SAE J1772 compliant charger connected to a dedicated 220-240 volt circuit.
- To charge your vehicle:
 1. Place the power switch in the OFF position.
 2. Push the charge port lid switch located on the instrument panel to the left of the steering wheel.
 3. Press the charge port tab and open the cap.
 4. Connect the charge connector **1** to the charge port **2**. When connected correctly, a beep will sound once.
 5. If charging has started, a beep will sound twice and the charging status indicator light will operate.
- To stop charging:
 1. Ensure that the charge connector lock is not engaged.
 2. Press the button on the charge connector **3** to release the lock and remove the charge connector from the charge port.
 3. Close the charge port cap and the charge port lid.



GETTING STARTED

TRICKLE CHARGE

Trickle charging is only supported on the driver's side charge port.

- Perform a trickle charge by connecting the Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment (EVSE) or a SAE J1772 compliant cord set to connect the vehicle to a dedicated AC 110-120 volt, 15A dedicated outlet.

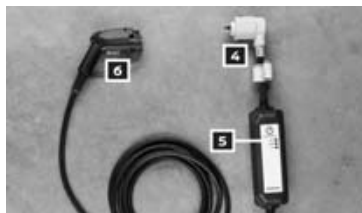
- To charge your vehicle:

1. Place the power switch in the OFF position.
2. Open the charge port lid.
3. Connect the EVSE plug **4** to the 110-120 volt, 15A dedicated electrical outlet. The EVSE control box's indicator light **5** will illuminate when connected properly.
4. Open the charge port cap.
5. Remove the safety cap from the charge connector.
6. Connect the charge connector **6** to the charge port **2**. A beep will sound once.
7. If charging has started, a beep will sound twice and the charging status indicator light will operate.

- You can pass a rope through the hole on the EVSE control box **7** in order to hang it up while the Li-ion battery is charging.

- To stop charging:

1. Ensure that the charge connector lock is not engaged.
2. Press the button on the charge connector **3** to release the lock and remove the charge connector from the charge port.
3. Close the charge port cap and the charge port lid.
4. Attach the safety cap to the charge connector, remove the electrical plug from the dedicated outlet and store it in the case.

GETTING STARTED

QUICK CHARGE

Quick charging is only supported on the passenger's side charge port.

NOTE: Nissan approved charging adapter kits are available through your NISSAN certified LEAF Dealer.

- Perform a quick charge by connecting the charge connector at a public charging station or a SAE J3400 compliant cord to charge the battery in a short period of time.
- Quick charging is possible if the battery temperature is not near the red zone.
- To charge your vehicle:
 - Place the power switch in the OFF position.
 - Open the charge port lid and the charge port cap.
 - Align the groove of the charge connector **8** with the groove of the charge port, then insert the charge connector.
 - Grasp the lock lever and lock the charge connector.
 - Follow the instructions on the quick charge equipment to start charging. When the equipment is properly installed and ready to charge, a beep sounds twice and the charging status indicator light will change.
- To stop charging:
 - The charge connector can be disconnected from the vehicle when the charging is stopped.
 - Unlock the charge connector and remove it from the vehicle.
 - After closing the charge port cap, close the charge port lid.

LI-ION BATTERY GAUGES

- The Li-ion Battery Available Charge Gauge **1** displays the approximate available Li-ion battery power remaining to drive the vehicle. Charge the Li-ion battery before the blue bar of the gauge disappears.
- The driving range **2** provides an estimated distance that the vehicle can be driven before recharging is necessary. The driving range is constantly being calculated based on the amount of available Li-ion battery charge and the actual power consumption average.

FORWARD DRIVING AID SENSORS (if so equipped)

- A camera and sensor support the forward driving aids for your vehicle. The camera sensor is located above the inside mirror **1** and the radar sensor is located on the front of the vehicle **2**.
- Forward Driving Aid systems (if so equipped) supported by these sensors include, but are not limited to:
 - ProPILOT Assist
 - Automatic Emergency Braking (AEB) with Pedestrian Detection
 - Intelligent Forward Collision Warning (I-FCW)
- The “Forward Driving Aids temporarily disabled Front Sensor blocked See Owner’s Manual” warning **3** may illuminate if the front radar sensor **2** is obstructed.
- The warning light **4** may illuminate and blink if the front camera sensor **1** is obstructed.
- Front sensor areas may become obstructed due to mud, dirt, snow, ice, and inclement weather (rain, fog, snow, etc).
- If the warning message appears, stop the vehicle in a safe place, place the shift selector in the **P (Park)** position and turn the EV system off. Clean the sensor areas and restart the EV system. If the message and light continue to appear after cleaning sensor areas, it may mean that forward driving aids are not functioning properly. DRIVING FEATURES

BLIND SPOT WARNING (BSW) WITH REAR CROSS TRAFFIC ALERT (RCTA)

- An indicator light **1** located on the outside mirrors will illuminate if the radar sensors detect a vehicle in the detection zone.
- The BSW system helps to alert the driver when another vehicle moves into the vehicle's detection zone.
- If the turn signal is activated, the system will chime (twice), the side indicator light will flash, and the BSW indicator will illuminate (yellow) in the vehicle information display.
- The RCTA system helps to alert the driver of an approaching vehicle when the driver is backing out of a parking space. The system operates when the **R (Reverse)** position is selected and the vehicle speed is less than approximately 5 mph (8 km/h).
- The radar sensors detect an approaching vehicle from up to 66 ft (20 m). The sensors are located on both sides near the rear bumper. The system gives visual and audible warnings if an approaching vehicle is detected.
- The RCTA and BSW system can be turned on or off through the "Driver Assistance" menu in the vehicle information display.

INTELLIGENT BLIND SPOT INTERVENTION (I-BSI)

- The I-BSI system helps alert the driver of other vehicles in adjacent lanes when changing lanes, and helps assist the driver to return the vehicle to the center of the traveling lane.
- An indicator light **1** located on the outside mirrors will illuminate if the radar sensors detect a vehicle in the detection zone.
- When the BSI system is turned on the I-BSI ON indicator light on the instrument panel illuminates.
- To turn on the I-BSI system, push the  switch **2** on the steering wheel after starting the EV system.



DRIVING FEATURES

- The I-BSI system operates above approximately 37 mph (60 km/h). If the system detects a vehicle in the detection zone and your vehicle is approaching the lane marker, the system chimes (three times) and the side indicator light and I-BSI indicator flash. The I-BSI system activates to help return the vehicle back to the center of the driving lane. The I-BSI system operates regardless of turn signal usage
- The I-BSI system can be turned on or off through the “Driver Assistance” menu in the vehicle information display.

PROPILOT ASSIST (if so equipped)

ProPILOT Assist is a combination of Intelligent Cruise Control (ICC) and Steering Assist. The ProPILOT Assist system is intended to enhance the operation of the vehicle when following a vehicle traveling in the same lane and direction. The ProPILOT Assist system is a “hands-on” driver assistance system and is intended for use on freeways/highways.

The driver must be prepared to steer and brake the vehicle at all times.

SETTING THE PROPILOT ASSIST SYSTEM

1. To set ProPILOT Assist, push the  switch **1** on the steering wheel. The ProPILOT Assist system display will appear on the vehicle information display.
2. Push the **SET** switch **4** when at the desired speed.
3. Push the  switch **5** to select the following distance.



PROPILOT ASSIST SYSTEM DISPLAY AND INDICATORS

- 6** Vehicle set speed indicator
 - Displays the speed set by the driver.
 - Green: ICC active
 - Gray: ICC standby
- 7** Steering Assist Indicator
 - Shows whether Steering Assist is active or not (green-active, gray-standby).



DRIVING FEATURES

8 Lane marker indicator

- No lane markers displayed: Steering Assist is turned off.
- Gray: No lane markers detected, steering assist in standby.
- Green: Lane markers detected, steering assist active.
- Yellow: Lane departure is detected.

9 ProPILOT Assist status indicator

- Displays whether ProPILOT Assist is active or not.
- White: Standby
- Blue: Active

10 Vehicle ahead detection indicator

- Appears on display when a vehicle is detected ahead.

11 Set distance indicator

- Displays the selected distance set by the driver.

CANCELING THE PROPILOT ASSIST SYSTEM

- To cancel ProPILOT Assist, do one of the following:
 - Push the **CANCEL** switch **2** on the steering wheel.
 - Tap the brake pedal. This action will keep the system in standby. To resume, push the **RES±** switch **3** to either direction to return to the original vehicle set speed, or push the **SET** switch **4** to set the current vehicle speed.

PROPILOT ASSIST INTELLIGENT CRUISE CONTROL (ICC)

- The set speed range is between approximately 20 and 90 mph (30 and 144 km/h).
- To accelerate or decelerate your vehicle to the desired speed, push the **RES±** switch **3** or **SET** switch **4** and release it.
- When a vehicle is detected in the lane ahead, the ICC system controls the vehicle speed to maintain the distance from the vehicle ahead set by the driver.
- For more information, refer to the ICC section in this book.

VEHICLE AHEAD DECELERATES AND/OR STOPS

- The system will not detect a vehicle that is already stopped in the traveling lane before it enters the detection zone. The driver must control the vehicle to prevent a collision.
- When the vehicle ahead decelerates, your vehicle decelerates to maintain the distance from the vehicle ahead set by the driver.
- Once the vehicle ahead stops, the ICC system will stop your vehicle and apply the brakes to keep the vehicle stopped.

DRIVING FEATURES

- When the vehicle ahead accelerates, push and release the **RES±** switch **3** or depress the accelerator pedal. The ICC system starts to follow the vehicle ahead.
- If your vehicle comes closer to the vehicle ahead due to rapid deceleration of that vehicle or if another vehicle cuts in, the system warns the driver with a chime and ICC system display. The driver must control the vehicle to prevent a collision.
- ICC may not operate as expected under all conditions. Always be prepared to brake if needed. For example, vehicles cutting into your lane or approaching stopped traffic may not be detected. For more information see Owner's Manual.

TURNING THE CONVENTIONAL (fixed speed) CRUISE CONTROL MODE ON

- To choose the conventional (fixed speed) cruise control mode, push and hold the  switch **1** for longer than approximately 1.5 seconds.
- Once vehicle is at the desired speed, push the **SET** switch **4**. Once set, the vehicle will maintain the desired set speed as shown by the cruise control icon and set speed indicator displayed above.

STEERING ASSIST

- The Steering Assist system assists the driving operation to help keep the vehicle within the traveling lane. Steering Assist can be activated when the following conditions are met:
 - ProPILOT Assist is activated.
 - Lane markings on both sides are clearly detected.
 - The driver has hands on the steering wheel.
 - The vehicle is driven at the center of the lane.
 - Turn signals are not active.
 - The windshield wipers are not operated in the high speed position
- Steering Assist provides a warning, is canceled or temporarily goes into standby mode under the following conditions:
 - The turn signals are activated.
 - Both hands are not detected on the steering wheel. Simply apply more pressure or a tighter grip on the steering wheel.
 - The wipers are in LO or HI speed position.
 - Steering Assist will not activate if the system does not detect lane markers.

DRIVING FEATURES

Push the Steering Assist switch **12** to turn the system on.

To turn off Steering Assist:

- Push the Steering Assist switch **12** on the instrument panel to the left of the steering column or in the settings of "Driver Assistance" in the vehicle information display.
- Steering Assist may not operate as expected under all conditions. Always be prepared to steer if needed. For example, lighting conditions, weather, lane splits (such as exit ramps) and confusing lane markers may cause the system to not operate as expected. For more information see Owner's Manual.



HANDS ON DETECTION

- If the driver lets go of the steering wheel or only lightly touches it, the system may not detect the driver's hand(s) on the wheel and a sequence of warnings may occur. When the driver holds and operates the steering wheel again (apply gentle torque in one direction), the warnings turn off.
- If the driver does not place their hands back on the wheel or cancel the ProPILOT Assist, the vehicle warnings will continue and the vehicle will eventually come to a stop.



ELECTRONIC PARKING BRAKE AND AUTOMATIC HOLD (if so equipped)

- To apply the parking brake, pull the **15** switch **15**, located in the center console. The electronic parking brake indicator light **16** will illuminate.
- To release the parking brake, and with the ignition switch in the ON position, depress the brake pedal and push the **15** switch **15** down. The electronic parking brake indicator light **16** will turn off.
- Automatic brake hold function maintains the braking force without the driver having to depress the brake pedal when the vehicle is stopped at a traffic light or intersection.
- With the EV power system ON, push the automatic brake hold switch **17** to activate the automatic brake hold function. The indicator light will illuminate.



DRIVING FEATURES

- To use the automatic brake hold function, the following conditions need to be met:
 - The driver's seat belt is fastened.
 - The electronic parking brake is released.
 - The shift selector is not in the **P (Park)** position.
 - The vehicle is not parked on a steep hill.
- Push the automatic brake hold switch **17** to cancel the function. To deactivate while the feature is applying the brake force, depress the brake pedal and push the automatic brake hold switch **17**.

The System may temporarily become unavailable due to poor weather conditions, lane visibility issues or unique traffic conditions. Clean/defrost your windshield and/or cleaning sensor to keep this feature working properly. Please refer your Owner's Manual for more information.

AUTOMATIC EMERGENCY BRAKING (AEB) WITH PEDESTRIAN DETECTION SYSTEM

- The AEB with Pedestrian Detection system can assist the driver when there is a risk of a forward collision with a vehicle, cyclist or pedestrian ahead in the traveling lane.
- Intersection assist helps the driver when there is a risk of a forward collision when turning right or left. The turn signal must be activated for the system to detect an approaching vehicle. The system may detect a pedestrian without the turn signal activated.
- The AEB with Pedestrian Detection system will function when your vehicle is driven at speeds above approximately 3 mph (5 km/h). For the pedestrian detection function, the AEB with Pedestrian Detection system operates at speeds between 6-50 mph (10-80 km/h). Intersection assist operates between 6-16 mph (10-25 km/h) when the turn signal is active.
- If there is a risk of a forward collision with a vehicle, an audible tone will sound and the vehicle ahead detection indicator **1** will illuminate. In addition, the system applies partial braking. If the driver does not take action, the AEB Pedestrian Detection System will provide a second set of audible and visual warnings to the driver and then automatically apply harder braking.
- If there is a risk of a forward collision with a pedestrian, an audible tone will sound and the AEB emergency warning indicator **2** will flash. Partial braking will be applied, followed by harder braking if the driver fails to react.

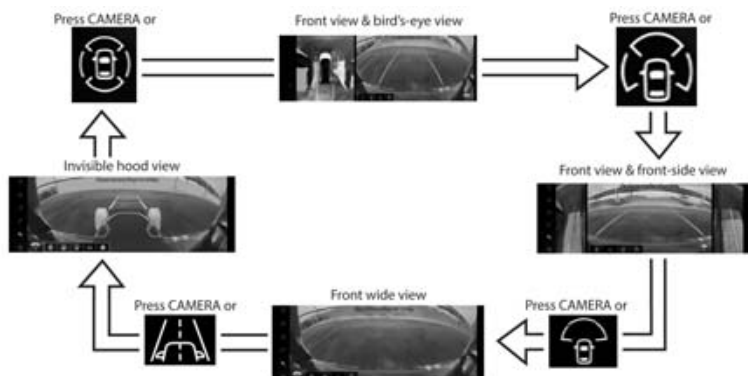
DRIVING FEATURES

INTELLIGENT AROUND VIEW® MONITOR (if so equipped)

- With the ignition switch in the ON position, the Intelligent Around View® Monitor is activated by pressing the **CAMERA** button **1**, located on the control panel, or by selecting the **R (Reverse)** shift position. The monitor displays various views of the position of the vehicle.



- When the transmission is in the **P (Park)**, **N (Neutral)** or **D (Drive)** position, press the **CAMERA** button **1** or the screen icon at the bottom of the display to switch between the available views:

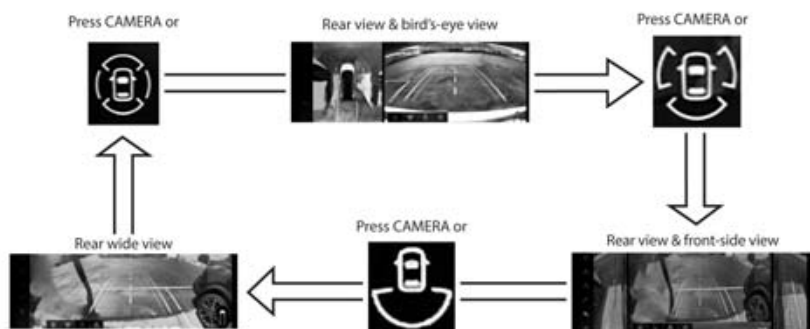


- When the transmission is in the **P (Park)**, **N (Neutral)** or **D (Drive)** position, press the icon **2** at the bottom of the display to see the 3D View **3** (if so equipped).
- The Invisible Hood View allows you to see the road surface underneath the vehicle. This may be useful for aligning the front wheels at a car wash or help to avoid hitting the side of curbs when operating at low speeds.
- The front and rear wide views show a wider area on the entire screen and allows checking of the blind corners on the right and left sides.

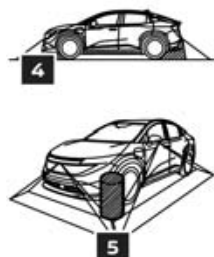


DRIVING FEATURES

- When the **R (Reverse)** shift position is selected, press the CAMERA button or the screen icon at the bottom of the display to switch between the available views:



- The colored guidelines on the display screen indicate vehicle width and approximate distances to objects with reference to the vehicle body line.
 - Red 1.5 ft (0.5 m)
 - Blue 3 ft (1 m)
 - Blue 7 ft (2 m)
 - Blue 10 ft (3 m)
- For information regarding how to access additional viewing cycles, please see your Owner's Manual.
- There are some areas where the system will not detect objects:
 - When in the front or the rear view display, an object below the bumper or on the ground may not be detected **4**.
 - When in the bird's-eye view, a tall object near the seams of the camera detecting areas **5** will not appear in the monitor.
 - The distance between objects viewed on the Intelligent Around View® Monitor differs from the actual distance.
- Always check your surroundings and turn to look behind you before moving the vehicle.
- Objects in the bird's-eye view will appear farther than the actual distance.



DRIVING FEATURES

MY PARKING LOCATIONS (if so equipped)

- This system allows you to ensure that there is enough space to open the door at your usual parking spot, such as your home garage.
- To register a parking location after parking the vehicle in the correct position:
 1. Press the camera button.
 2. Touch the “Settings” key.
 3. Touch the “My Parking Locations” key.
 4. Touch your preferable parking location from the list, then touch the “Register” key.
- After registering the parking space, use the on-screen arrows to adjust the parking space frame or delete it.
- Once registered, the display view switches and the parking guide appears when the vehicle approaches the registered spot.

MOVING OBJECT DETECTION (MOD) (if so equipped)

- The MOD system helps inform the driver of moving objects around the vehicle.
- The system will operate when the transmission is in the **P (Park)**, **R (Reverse)**, **N (Neutral)** or **D (Drive)** position and the vehicle is driven at speeds of approximately 5 mph (8 km/h) or less.
- If the MOD system detects moving objects, an orange frame will be displayed on the camera image and a chime will sound.
- When the following is displayed:
 - Green MOD icon ; the system is active.
 - Gray MOD icon; the system is not active.
 - No MOD icon; the system is off. The indicator will also be off if all of the warning systems are deactivated using the Settings menu.
- The MOD system will not operate if the liftgate is open.

DRIVING FEATURES

HILL START ASSIST

Hill Start Assist allows time for the driver to release the brake pedal and apply the accelerator when the vehicle is parked on a hill. The brakes are applied automatically for 2 seconds after the driver releases the brake pedal.

- Hill Start Assist system will operate automatically under these conditions:
 - The transmission is shifted to a forward or reverse gear.
 - The vehicle is stopped completely on a hill by applying the brake.
- The system will not operate when the transmission is shifted to the **N (Neutral)** or **P (Park)** position or on a flat and level road.

REAR AUTOMATIC BRAKING (RAB)

- The RAB system can assist the driver when the vehicle is backing up and approaching objects directly behind the vehicle.
- The RAB system will function when the transmission is in the **R (Reverse)** position and the vehicle speed is less than approximately 9 mph (15 km/h).
- If a risk of a collision with an obstacle is detected when your vehicle is backing up, the RAB system warning indicator light **1** will flash in the vehicle information display.
- A red frame will appear in the center display **2** for vehicles equipped with the Intelligent Around View® Monitor system. The system will chime three times and the brakes will be applied automatically. The driver must depress the brake pedal to maintain brake pressure.
- The RAB system can be turned on and off through the "Driver Assistance" section vehicle information display.



When the RAB system is turned off, the RAB system warning light **1** illuminates.

DRIVING FEATURES

LANE DEPARTURE WARNING (LDW) AND INTELLIGENT LANE INTERVENTION (I-LI)

- The LDW system can help alert the driver when the vehicle is traveling too close to either the left or the right side of a traveling lane.
- The system will operate when the vehicle is driven at speeds of approximately 37–125 mph (60–200 km/h) and above and only when the lane markings are clearly visible on the road.
- When the vehicle approaches either the left or the right side of the traveling lane, the LDW system will vibrate and the LDW light **1** on the vehicle information display will blink to alert the driver.
- The I-LI system can assist the driver in returning the vehicle to the center of the traveling lane by applying individual brake pressure to the left or right wheels for a short period of time.
- The LDW system can be turned on and off through the “Driver Assistance” section vehicle information display.

APPROACHING VEHICLE SOUND FOR PEDESTRIANS (VSP) SYSTEM

- The VSP system helps alert pedestrians to the presence of the vehicle when it is being driven at a low-speed.
- The sound stops when the vehicle speed is more than approximately 25 mph (40 km/h) while accelerating.
- The sound starts when the vehicle speed is less than approximately 22 mph (35 km/h) while decelerating.

DRIVING FEATURES

e-STEP SYSTEM

- The e-Step system enables the driver to slow the vehicle by operating only the accelerator pedal. This system helps to keep the driver from moving his/her foot between the accelerator pedal and the brake pedal.
- When the e-Step system is activated, the regenerative brake is enhanced and the driver can adjust the vehicle speed by only depressing or returning the accelerator pedal.
- Be sure to confirm the status of the e-Step system in the vehicle information display before driving.
- To activate or deactivate the e-Step system, place the power switch in the **ON** position and push the e-Step switch **1** located on the instrument panel.
- The e-Step system indicator illuminates **e-Step ON/OFF 2** in the vehicle information display when the e-Step system has been activated or deactivated.
- The e-Step system will not function under the following conditions.
 - When the vehicle is placed in the **P (Park)** or **N (Neutral)** position.
 - When a driver assistance function such as ProPILOT Assist system is operating.



REGENERATIVE BRAKING INTENSITY

When the transmission is in **D (Drive)** position, regenerative braking intensity can be manually selected.

- To reduce the intensity of the regenerative braking, briefly pull on the right-side paddle selector on the steering wheel.
- To increase the intensity of the regenerative braking, briefly pull on the left-side paddle selector on the steering wheel.

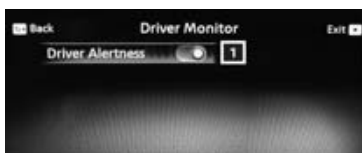

INTELLIGENT DRIVER ALERTNESS (I-DA)

- When Driver Alertness **1** is selected in the vehicle information display, the system will use an audible and visual warning to suggest that the driver take a break.
- If the system detects that driver attention is decreasing, the **Take a Break?** message **2** appears in the vehicle information display and a chime sounds when the vehicle is driven at speeds above 37 mph (60 km/h).

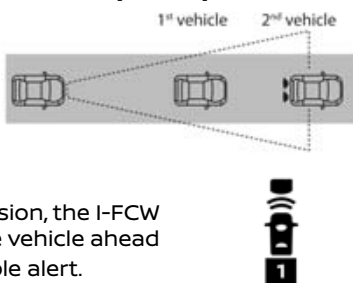

INTELLIGENT FORWARD COLLISION WARNING (I-FCW)

- The I-FCW system can help alert the driver of sudden braking by the second vehicle traveling ahead of your vehicle in the same lane.
- The I-FCW system operates at speeds above approximately 3 mph (5 km/h).
- If there is a potential risk of a forward collision, the I-FCW system will warn the driver by blinking the vehicle ahead detection indicator light **1** and an audible alert.

DRIVING FEATURES

SHIFT CONTROL SYSTEM



This vehicle is equipped with an electric shift control system **1**, providing smooth and easy shifting operation.

- There are four shift positions for operating the vehicle: **P (Park)**, **R (Reverse)**, **N (Neutral)** and **D (Drive)**.
 - **P (Park)** – Activated by pushing the **P (Park)** switch on the shift selector when the vehicle has come to a complete stop.
 - **R (Reverse)** – Use this position to back up. Make sure that the vehicle is completely stopped before selecting the **R (Reverse)** position.
 - **N (Neutral)** – Neither forward nor reverse gear is engaged. The vehicle can be placed in the READY to drive position in this position.
 - **D (Drive)** – For normal driving, it is activated by pressing the **D** switch on the shift selector.

Multiple driving modes can be selected by using the Drive Mode Selector **2**. To change the mode, push the upper side or lower side of the Drive Mode Selector **2**.

- Eco mode
 - Improves energy efficiency and cruising range. The intensity of regenerative braking increases when the accelerator pedal is released.
- Personal mode
 - Set drive mode of your own. Using the vehicle information display controls, you can set each of the driving elements to your preference.
- Standard mode
 - This is the normal mode that is most suitable for normal driving.
- Sport mode
 - Provides higher motor torque response for agile driveability and stronger regeneration brake for sporty drive by accelerator pedal only. The setting of the steering system is adjusted to moderately increase steering wheel effort for a sporty feel.

DRIVING FEATURES

NEUTRAL HOLD MODE FUNCTION

- This function enables you to turn off the EV system with the vehicle in the **N (Neutral)** position. While activated, the vehicle can be moved by pushing with hand (when car washing) even if the power switch is in the OFF position. When using this function, release the parking brake. To activate the Neutral Hold Mode Function, please see your Owner's Manual.

VEHICLE DYNAMIC CONTROL (VDC)

- Press the Head Up Display (HUD) switch **1** on the lower instrument panel to turn the system on and off.
- To adjust the Head Up Display settings when the system is on:
 1. Press the **◀▶** arrows **2** on the steering wheel until you get to the "Settings" menu in the vehicle information display. Press the scroll/ **OK** dial to select "Head-Up Display".



DRIVING FEATURES

2. Adjust the positioning of the Head Up Display on the windshield by making a selection and press the scroll/ **OK** dial on the steering wheel to adjust features such as the height and brightness.

The following features can be adjusted through the “Settings” menu in the vehicle information display:

- Brightness
- Height
- Rotation
- Contents Selection
- Reset
