1.6 Loss of Traction Hazard



If loss of traction is experienced do the following:



Disengage PTO.



Look before backing.
Proceed off slope slowly.



DO NOT try to turn or speed up.

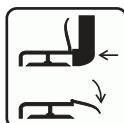

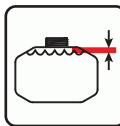

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

The following safety instructions are based on the ANSI/OPEI 5395:2024 specifications of the American National Standards Institute and ISO 5395 in effect at the time of production.

Safe Practices for Ride-On Mowers

If used improperly, this machine is capable of amputating hands and feet and throwing objects. Failure to observe the following safety instructions could result in serious injury or death. Use only for purposes intended as set forth in the Operator's Manual. Other use is improper and may cause serious injury or death.

General Information

Read, understand, and follow instructions and warnings in this manual and on the machine, engine and attachments.

Only allow operators, who are responsible, trained, familiar with the instructions, and physically capable to operate the machine.

DO NOT carry passengers and keep people or pets away from the mowing area.

DO NOT operate the machine while physically or mentally impaired, feeling tired, ill or under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

Follow the manufacturer's recommendation for wheel weights or counterweights.

DO NOT touch parts which are hot. Allow parts to cool.

Preparation Before Operating

Inspect unit before each use for missing or damaged decals and shields, correctly operating safety interlock system, ROPS and deterioration of grass catchers. Replace or repair as needed.

Clear the operating area of all objects which could be thrown by or interfere with operation of the machine.

Keep the area of operation clear of all bystanders, particularly small children. Stop the machine and attachment(s) if anyone enters the area.

DO NOT operate the machine without the entire grass catcher, discharge chute, or other safety devices in place and functioning properly. Check frequently for signs of damage, wear or deterioration and replace as needed.

NEVER tamper with safety devices. Check their proper operation regularly. NEVER do anything to interfere with the intended function of a safety device or to reduce the protection provided by the safety device.

Check parking brake operation frequently. Adjust and service as required.

Wear appropriate personal protective equipment such as safety glasses, hearing protection, and substantial footwear. DO NOT mow barefoot or while wearing sandals.

Operating

Improper use of power equipment can cause serious permanent injury or death to the operator or a bystander. Understand:

- How to operate all controls
- The functions of all controls
- How to STOP in an emergency
- Braking and steering characteristics
- Turning radius and clearances

If the operator or the mechanic cannot read the manual, it is the owner's responsibility to explain it to them. Manuals are available in other languages at www.ariens.com.

Only run the engine in well ventilated areas. Exhaust gases contain carbon monoxide, an odorless deadly poison.

Only operate the machine in daylight or good artificial light.

Avoid holes, ruts, bumps, rocks and other hazards. Uneven terrain could overturn the machine, or cause operator to lose their balance, footing and/or control of the mower.

DO NOT put hands or feet near rotating parts or under the machine. Keep clear of the discharge opening at all times.

Avoid slippery surfaces. ALWAYS be sure of your footing.

Stop engine before removing grass catcher or unclogging chute.

DO NOT direct discharge material toward anyone. Avoid discharging material against a wall or obstruction. Material may ricochet back toward the operator. Stop the blade(s) when crossing gravel surfaces. DO NOT mow into roads or across sidewalks.

DO NOT leave a running machine unattended. ALWAYS park on level ground, disengage the attachment, set parking brake, stop engine and remove key (if applicable) before leaving the operator's position.

DO NOT mow in reverse unless absolutely necessary. ALWAYS look down and behind before and while backing.

Lightning can cause severe injury or death. If lightning is seen or thunder is heard in the area, DO NOT operate the machine; seek shelter.

If you strike a foreign object, stop and inspect the machine. Repair, if necessary, before restarting.

ALWAYS check overhead and side clearances carefully before operation. Keep in mind that your mower deck may be wider than your track width.

Children Specific

Tragic accidents can occur if the operator is not alert to the presence of children. Children are often attracted to the machine and the mowing activity. NEVER assume that children will remain where you last saw them.

Keep children out of the operating area and under the watchful care of a responsible adult other than the operator.

Do not carry children, even with the blade(s) shut off. Children could fall off and be seriously injured or interfere with safe machine operation. Children who have been given rides in the past could suddenly appear in the mowing area for another ride and be run over or backed over.
DO NOT allow children under the age of 18 to operate any outdoor power equipment.

Slope Specific

Slopes are a major factor related to accidents. Operation on slopes requires extra caution. If you feel uneasy on a slope DO NOT mow it. Use the parking brake for emergency stops.
DO Not operate on slopes of more than 15°.
Do not mow within 1.2 M (4 feet) of a drop off. Do not mow within 1.2 M (4 feet) of a pond or other waterway. The primary hazard of slope operation is loss of control and/or roll over.
Mow up and down slopes, NEVER across. Exercise caution when changing direction on slopes. Use caution while operating near dropoffs.
Avoid mowing wet grass. Wet surfaces can cause a loss of traction and control.
DO NOT operate machine under any condition where traction, steering, or stability is in question. Tires could slide even if the wheels are stopped.
Always keep the machine in gear when going down slopes. Do not coast downhill.
Avoid starting and stopping on slopes. Avoid making sudden changes in speed or direction. Make turns slowly and gradually.
Use extra care while operating machine with a grass catcher or other attachment(s). They can affect the stability of the machine.

Fire and Fuel Specific

Extinguish all cigarettes, cigars, pipes and other sources of ignition.
Use only an approved fuel container.
DO NOT remove fuel cap or add fuel with the engine running or while hot.
DO NOT refuel indoors or in enclosed spaces.
DO NOT store the machine or fuel container, or refuel, where there is an open flame, spark, or pilot light such as on a water heater or other appliance.

If fuel is spilled, DO NOT attempt to start the engine and avoid creating any source of ignition until fuel vapors have dissipated.
To help prevent fires: keep machine free of grass, leaves, or other debris build up; clean up oil or fuel spillage and remove any fuel soaked debris; allow engine to cool before storing.
Use extra care in handling gasoline and other fuels. They are flammable and vapors are explosive.

Hauling

Use a single full-width ramp for loading and unloading a machine for transport. Secure with appropriate straps.
Towing
Follow the manufacturer's recommendation for weight limits for towed equipment and towing on slopes.

ROPS

The ROPS is an integral safety device. Do not remove or alter the ROPS.
Keep a folding ROPS in the raised and locked position and use the seat belt when operating the machine.
Lower a folding ROPS temporarily only when absolutely necessary. Do not wear the seat belt when folded down. There is no rollover protection when a folding ROPS is in the down position.
Frequently inspect the ROPS and the seatbelt for damage. Replace a damaged ROPS. Do not repair or alter.

Service

Keep machine in good working order. Replace worn or damaged parts.
Use caution when servicing blades. Wrap the blade(s) or wear gloves. Replace damaged blades. DO NOT repair or alter blade(s).
Disconnect spark plug wire(s) and the negative battery cable before making any repairs.
Use only attachments recommended by AriensCo that are appropriate to your use and can be used safely in your application.

The use of non-genuine replacement parts or accessories could adversely affect machine operation and safety.

DO NOT change engine governor setting or overspeed the engine.

ASSEMBLY



WARNING: Read and understand the *Safety* section before proceeding.

1. Remove bag and packaging materials from unit.
2. Remove pins and fold crate ends outward.
3. Remove hardware from negative (-) battery cable, but **DO NOT** discard.
4. Secure negative (-) battery cable to negative (-) battery terminal with hardware removed in step 3.
5. Remove hairpin from ROPS lock pin and disconnect seat brace. Reinstall hairpin. See Figure 3.

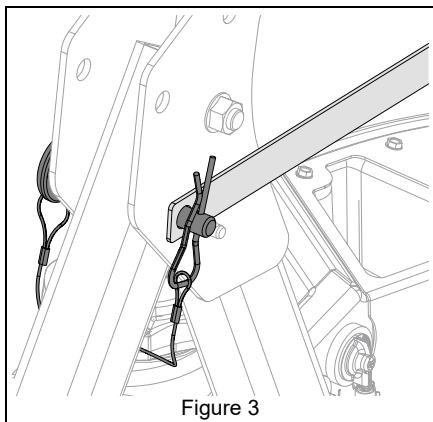

6. Rotate seat brace to remove it from notch in seat plate. Discard brace. See Figure 4.

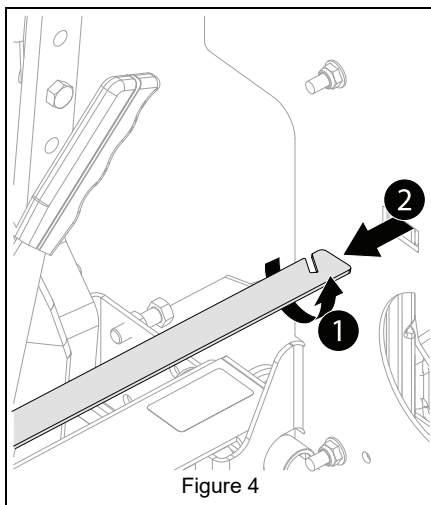

8. Rotate seat into the operating position. See Figure 5.

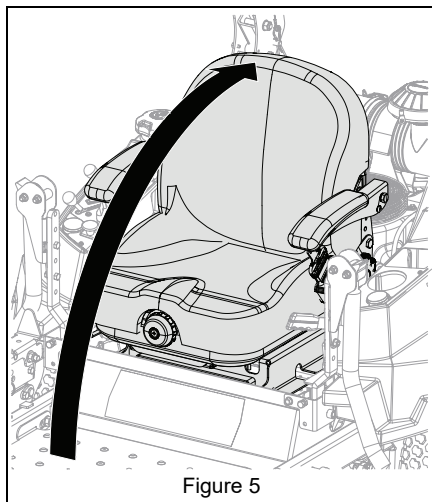
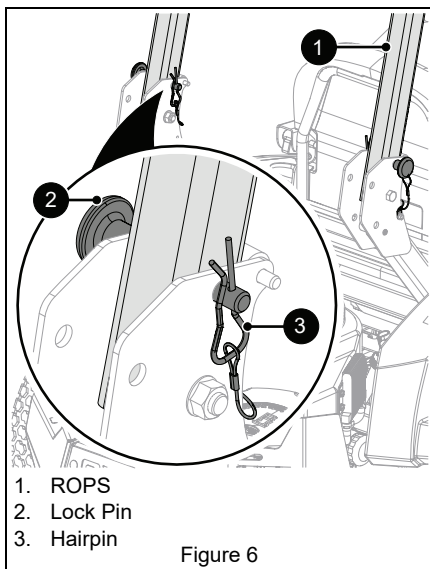

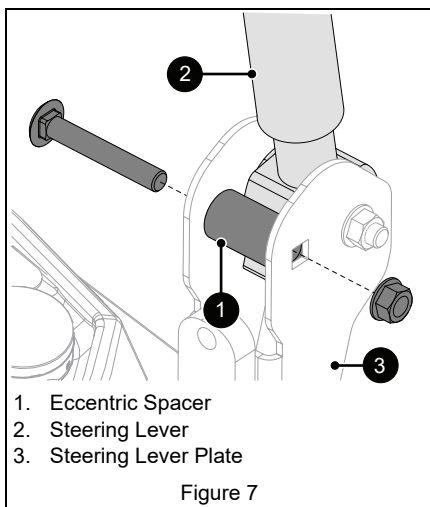
9. Rotate ROPS to operating position and secure with lock pins. Secure lock pins with hairpins. See Figure 6.

10. Remove two eccentric spacers, two round head square neck bolts and two locking nuts from hardware bag.
11. Rotate steering levers to operating position and install eccentric spacer between steering lever plates. Secure with hardware. See Figure 7.

12. Check steering lever alignment. See *Adjust Steering Levers* on page 19.
13. Add a small amount of gasoline to the fuel tank. See *Before Operation* on page 16 for fuel specification.

14. Check engine oil level and add oil if needed. Refer to the engine manual for details.
15. Check hydraulic fluid level and add fluid if needed. See *Check Hydraulic System* on page 24.
16. Check tire pressures. See *Check Tire Pressure* on page 26 and *Specifications on Page 44*.
17. Inspect all hardware and tighten if loose.
18. Check safety interlock system functions. See *Check Safety Interlock System* on page 24.



WARNING: FAILURE OF INTERLOCK together with improper operation can result in severe personal injury.

19. Start the engine, set the throttle to a slow position, and slowly drive unit off shipping crate. See *Start The Engine* on page 21 and *Operate Unit* on page 21.
20. Stop unit, engage parking brake, and stop the engine. See *Stop the Engine* on page 22.
21. Lift discharge chute up slightly and rotate to operating position. See Figure 8.

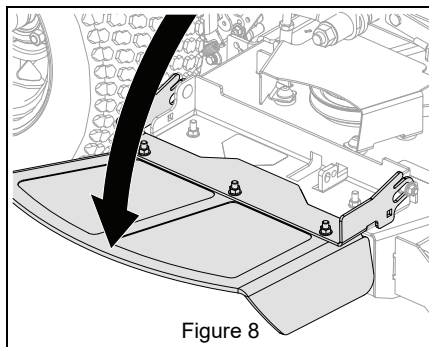

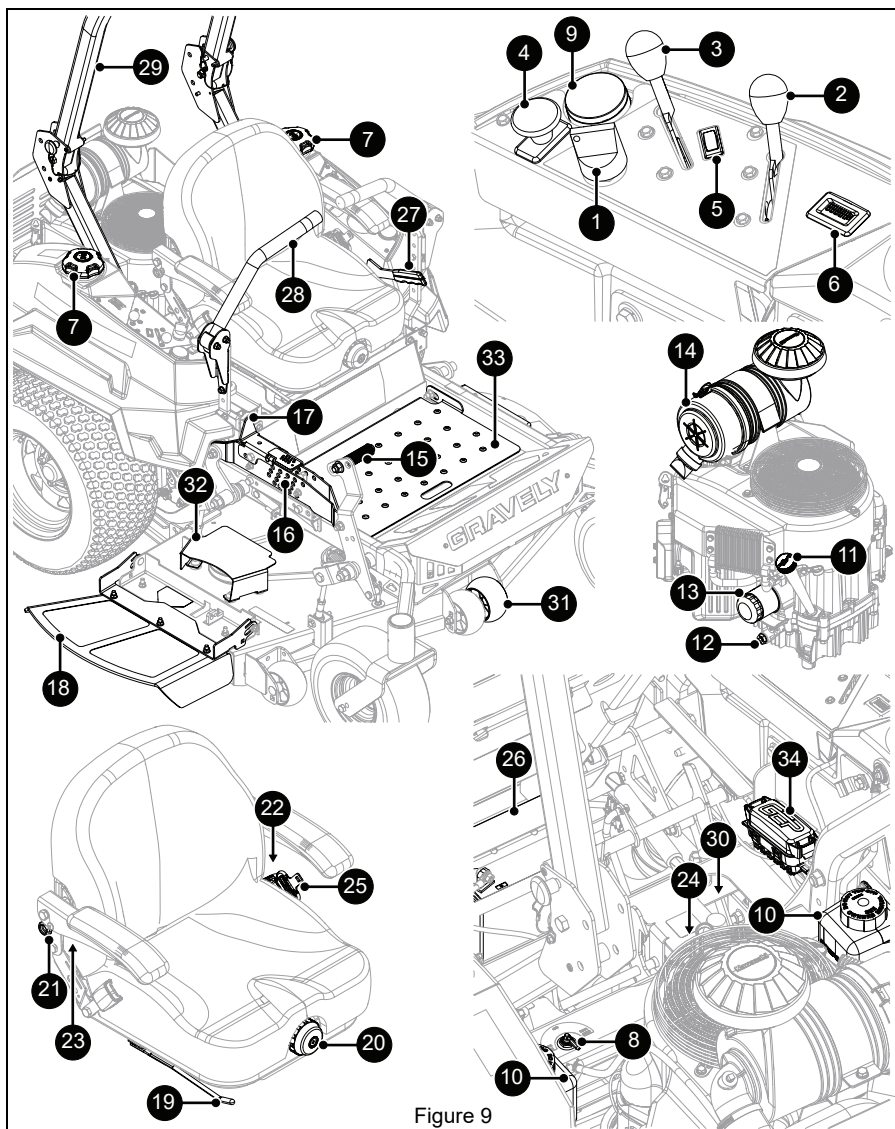

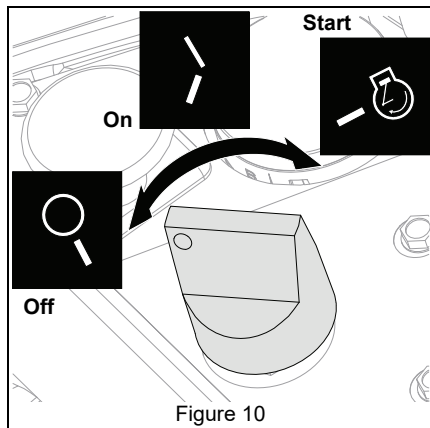

Controls air intake to the engine. Choke is engaged to help start a cold engine.

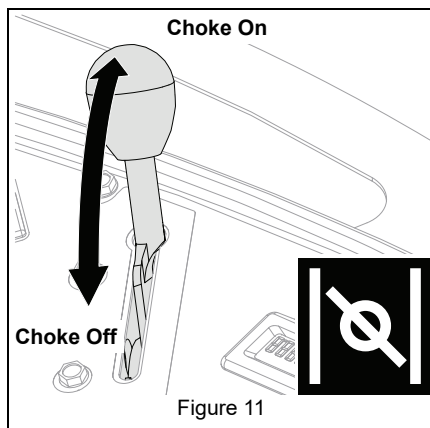

Controls engine speed.

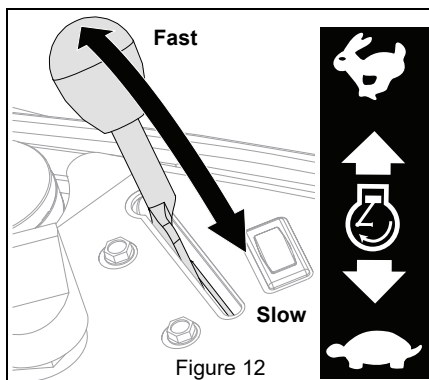

POWER TAKE-OFF (PTO) SWITCH

See Figure 13.

Controls power to mower blades. The engine will not start with the PTO switch in the on position.

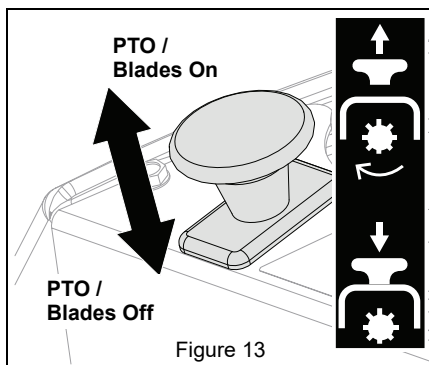

FUEL VALVE

Controls fuel flow to the engine. Directs fuel from left or right fuel tank or stops all fuel flow. See Figure 29.

OIL PRESSURE WARNING LIGHT

Illuminates when oil pressure is low. Stop engine immediately and refer to engine manual.

DECK LIFT PEDAL

Raises mower deck to change height-of-cut setting.

HEIGHT-OF-CUT ADJUSTMENT SYSTEM

Sets the height of cut.

TRANSPORT LOCK

Locks mower deck in the highest position for transporting or moving unit from one work area to another. See *Transport Unit* on page 22.

TRANSPORT LOCK RELEASE LEVER

See Figure 14.

Releases deck from transport lock position.

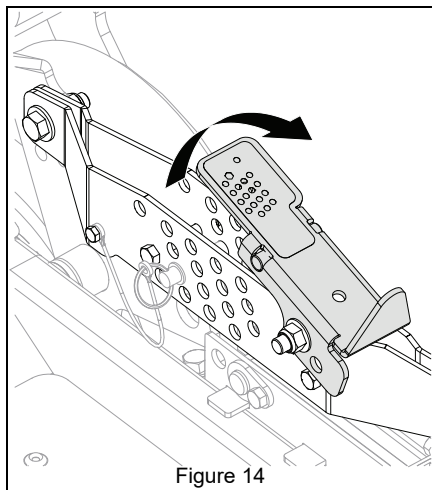

TRANSAXLE BYPASS VALVES

See Figure 15.

Engage and disengage transaxles so unit can be moved with the engine off.

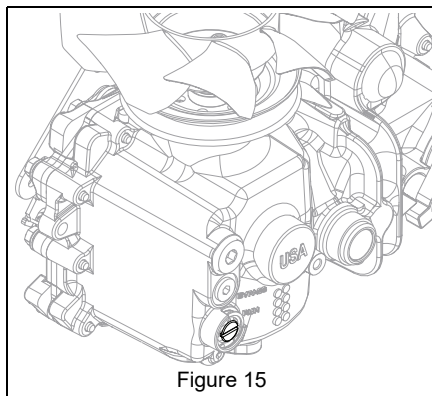

ANTI-SCALP WHEELS

Help prevent the deck from contacting the ground and scalping the lawn when mowing over high spots.

SEAT ADJUSTMENT LEVER

Unlocks seat to allow operator to move seat forward or backward and then lock in desired position.

SEAT HEIGHT ADJUSTMENT DIAL

Raises and lowers seat height for operator comfort.

LUMBAR SUPPORT ADJUSTMENT LEVER

Controls the lumbar support in the backrest for operator comfort.

BACKREST ADJUSTMENT DIAL

Controls backrest angle for operator comfort.

ARMREST ANGLE ADJUSTERS

Set armrest angle for operator comfort.

SEAT LATCH RELEASE KNOB

Pull to release seat latch and rotate seat forward for access to battery and transaxle bypass valves.

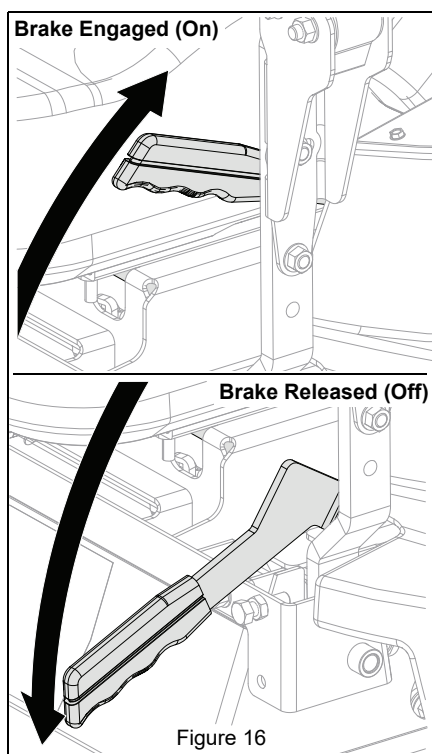
HOUR METER

Measures and displays engine runtime and cannot be reset.

PARKING BRAKE LEVER

See Figure 16.

Engages and releases the parking brake. The engine will not start when brake is released.



STEERING LEVERS

Control the direction and speed of unit. To stop unit, return both steering levers to neutral.

ROLLOVER PROTECTION STRUCTURE (ROPS)

Help protect operator that is wearing their seatbelt in the event of a rollover. DO NOT wear seatbelt when operating with ROPS in the lowered position.

SAFETY INTERLOCK SYSTEM

Monitors the interaction of various unit safety features and closes an electrical circuit that allows for unit to start and operate when certain conditions are met.

NOTICE: Use fresh unleaded fuel with an octane rating of at least 87. DO NOT use E85 blended fuels; the engine is not E20 / E30 / E85 compatible. The maximum recommended ethanol content is 10%. Gravely recommends using a quality fuel stabilizer in all fuel. See *Short-Term Storage* on page 42.

4. Check engine oil level and add oil if needed. Refer to engine manual for details.
5. Check hydraulic oil level. See *Check Hydraulic System* on page 24.
6. Check condition of air filter. Refer to engine manual for details.
7. Check function of all controls.
8. Check function of the Safety Interlock System by performing the following tests. Contact your Gravely dealer for repair if any of the tests fail.

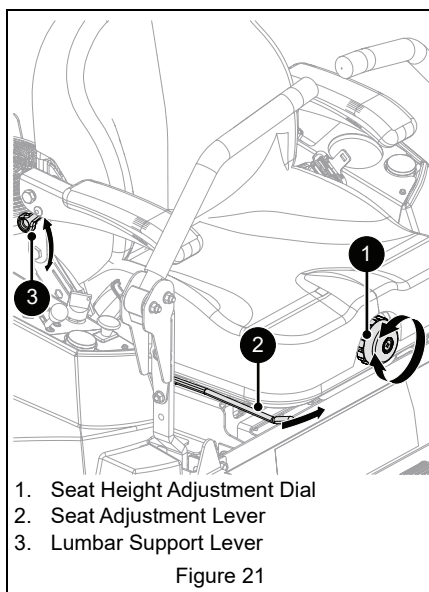

- Lower lever to decrease lumbar support.



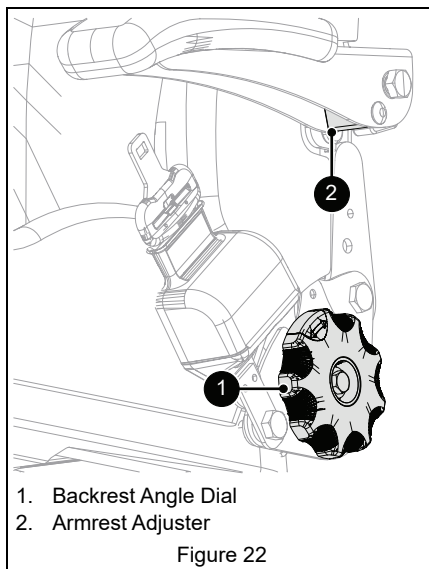

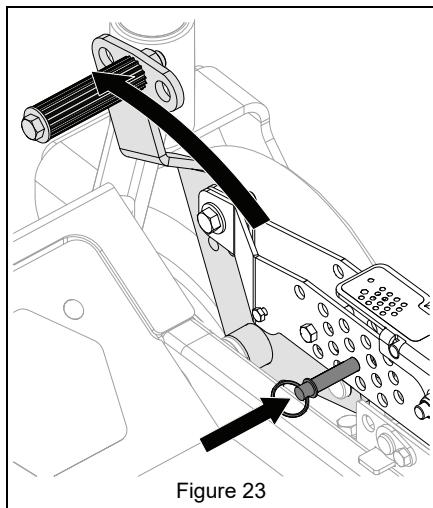

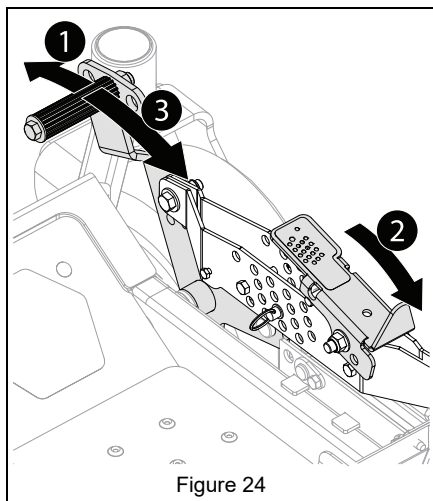

1. Push mower lift pedal completely forward until transport lock engages.
2. Insert adjustment pin through desired setting in height-of-cut adjustment system.

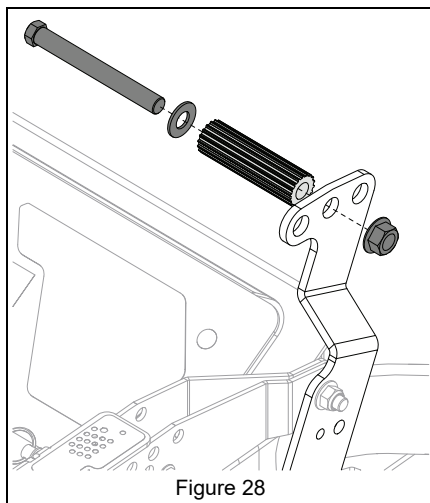

CLEAN MOWER DECK

Clean grass and debris from mower deck before each use.

1. Stop unit, engage parking brake, and wait for all moving parts to stop and for hot parts to cool.
2. Remove grass and debris from mower deck and around discharge opening.
3. Remove mower blades and remove grass and debris accumulation from inside the cutting chamber. See *Remove Blades* on page 26.

IMPORTANT: Grass accumulation and debris buildup inside the cutting chamber disrupts aerodynamics and can harbor bacteria and fungi. Clean regularly for best cut quality and to help prevent lawn disease spread.

CHECK SAFETY INTERLOCK SYSTEM

With the parking brake engaged, the steering levers must be locked in neutral. With the parking brake disengaged, the engine must not start and the engine must shut off if the operator lifts off the seat. See *Before Operation* on page 16. If system does not operate correctly, see your dealer for repair. DO NOT operate until repairs are made.

CHECK PARKING BRAKE

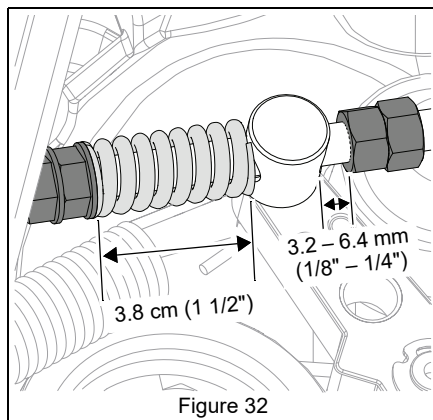

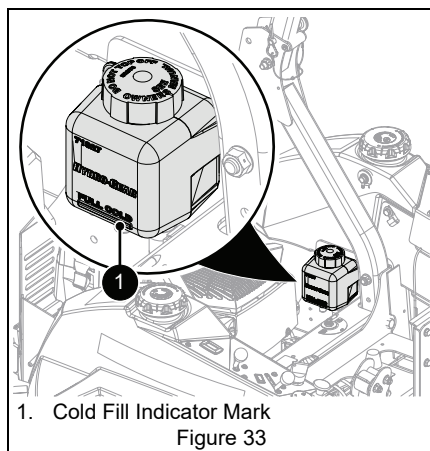

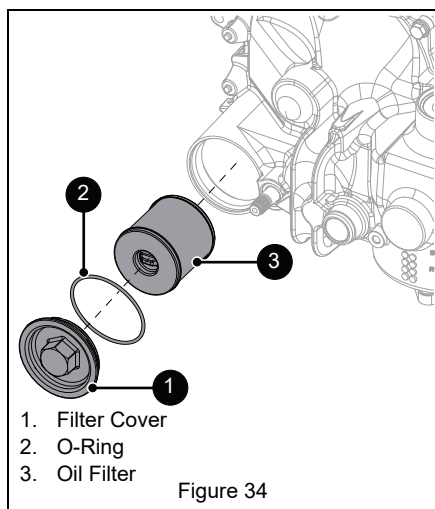

10. Add 20W-50 synthetic motor oil or equivalent into the hydraulic oil expansion tank until oil appears at the bottom of the fill port (4475 mL (151 fl. ounces) per transaxle).
11. Reinstall the vent / fill plug and torque to 22.6 N·m (16.7 lb-ft).
12. Continue adding hydraulic oil until oil reaches cold fill indicator mark on the expansion tank. See Figure 33.
13. Repeat steps 4 – 12 for other transaxle.
14. Purge hydraulic system. See *Purge Hydraulic System* on page 25.

Purge Hydraulic System

Purge air from hydraulic system after draining oil or changing the filter.
