PREDELIVERY CHECK LIST

- ☐ To the best of my knowledge this machine has been delivered ready for field use and the customer has been informed as to proper care and operation.

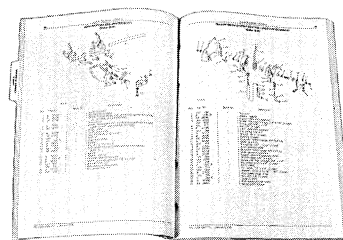

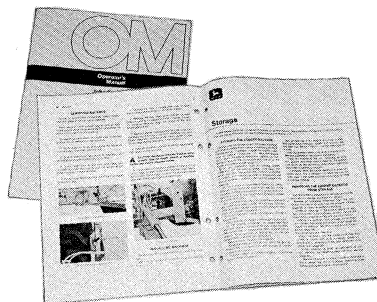

PARTS CATALOG



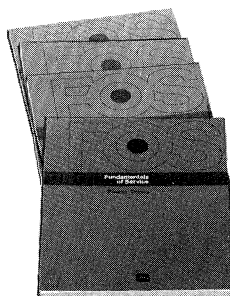
A parts catalog containing exploded view illustrations and lists of all parts is useful when purchasing service parts. Helps identify the correct parts. Useful in assembling and disassembling.

FOS MANUALS



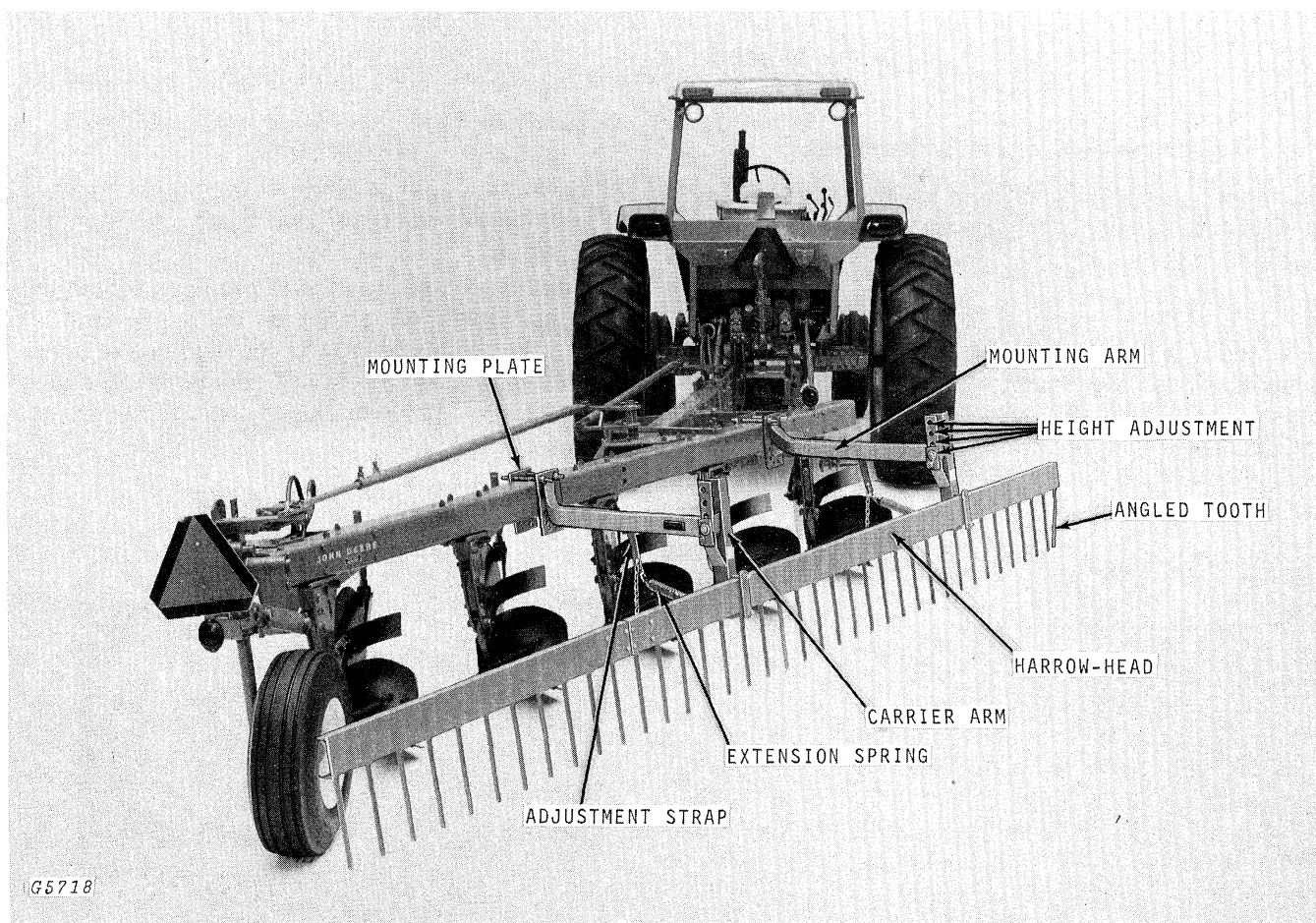

Operation

HOW THE CLOD-BUSTER WORKS

The John Deere Clod-Buster is available for five plow sizes; 4-, 5-, 6-, 7-, and 8-bottom units. A one bottom extension is available for a field conversion.

The fresh plowed clods are tumbled the length of the clod-buster, breaking them down. The clod-buster also levels the plowed furrows.

The pressure supplied by spring tension on the clod-buster allows the teeth to ride over any obstruction.

The clod-buster easily swings up into the transport position.

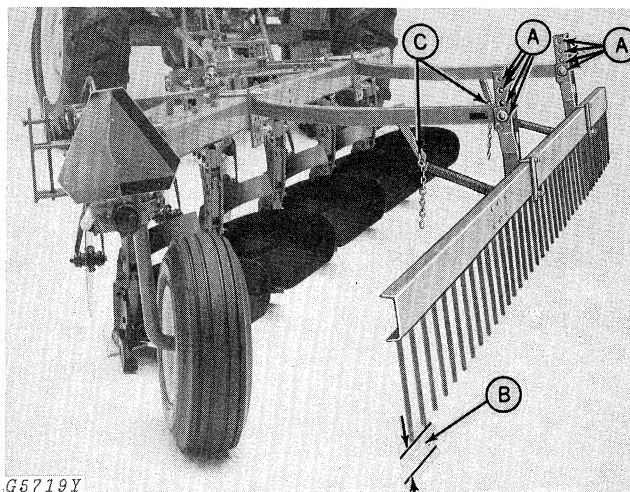
OPERATING ADJUSTMENTS

In some areas there is a trend toward fall plowing. Using the clod-buster in the fall will allow disking and harrowing in the spring to be done at a faster ground speed.

To reduce wind erosion during winter months, because the clods have been broken down too fine, decrease the tension on the clod-buster during fall plowing. If soil conditions do not require the use of the clod-buster, swing it up into the transport position and secure. (See page 3).

Height and Pressure Adjustment

With the plow attached to the tractor, bring the plow to rest on a level surface. (See plow operators manual.)



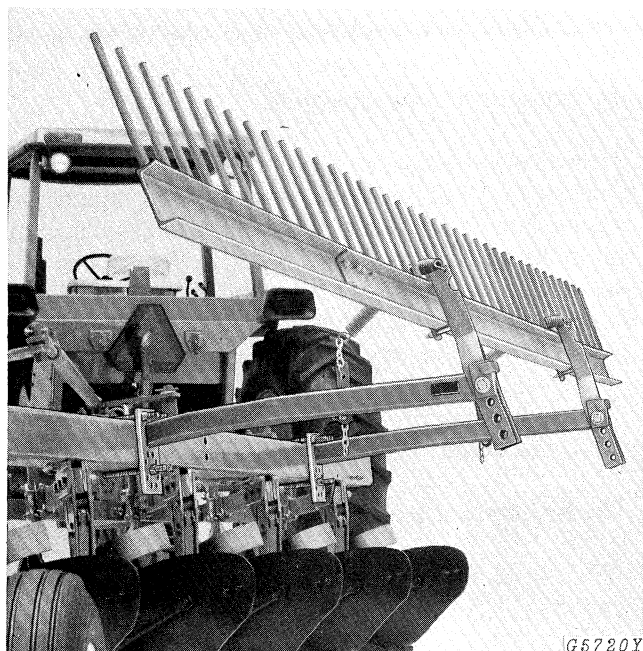
6-Bottom Clod-Buster on a 1450 5-Bottom Semi-Integral Moldboard Plow

Use the four alternate holes on the harrow head at "A" to raise or lower the clod-buster to clear the ground at "B".

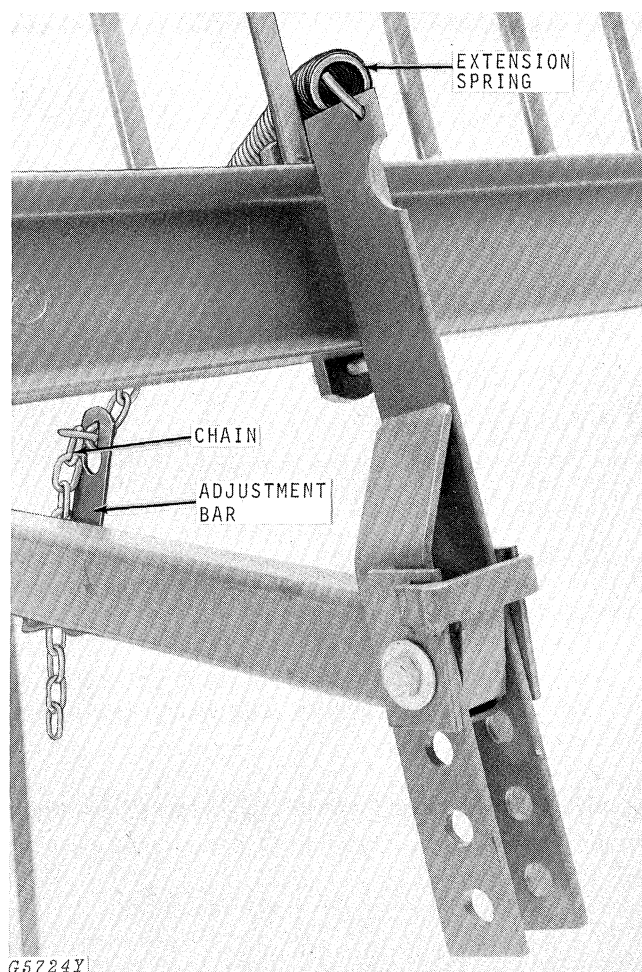
For correct pressure on the clod-buster, tighten the chains and extension springs on the adjustment bar at "C". The operating angle of the clod-buster is approximately 45 degrees. Check spring setting during field operation. Tighten or loosen chains if necessary.



TRANSPORTING

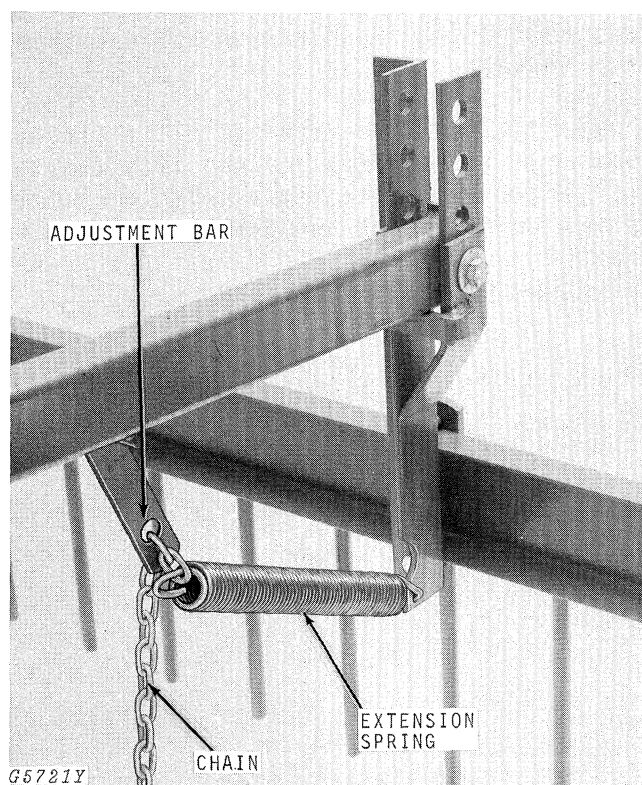


Clod-Buster in Transport Position



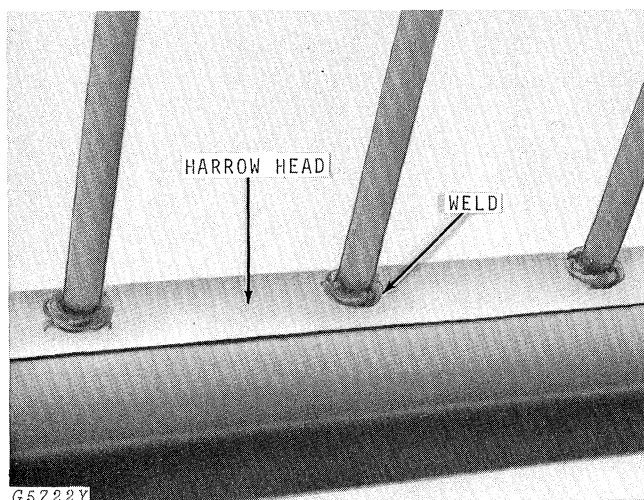
Swing the clod-buster up and over into the stop position. Tighten extension springs and chains to be sure the clod-buster will stay in the transport position.

CAUTION: When transporting the plow and clod-buster on a road or highway at night or during the day, use accessory lights and devices for adequate warning to operators of other vehicles. In this regard, check local governmental regulations. Various safety lights and devices are available from your John Deere dealer.



Remove the extension springs and chains from the adjustment bar.

TEETH REPLACEMENT

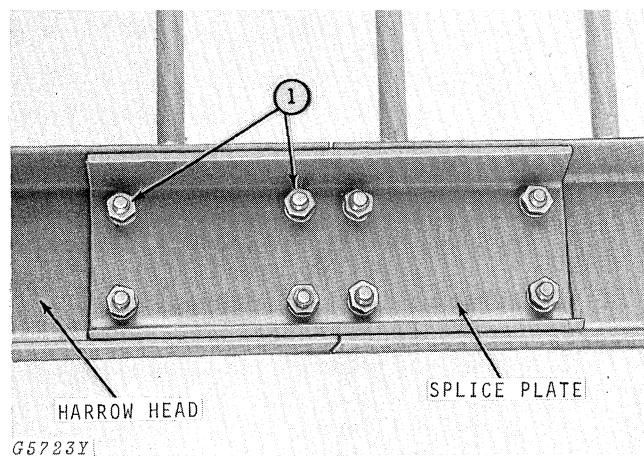


These instructions will help you keep your clod-buster performing efficiently. For additional service, consult your John Deere dealer.

Grind and clean old weld from harrow head. Weld in new tooth where old tooth was with a low hydrogen rod.

IMPORTANT: Weld completely around the base of new tooth.

ONE BOTTOM EXTENSION



A one bottom extension is available to convert a 4-bottom into a 5-bottom, and a 5-bottom into a 6-bottom clod-buster only.

Installation

1. Attach the extension to the rear of clod-buster with the splice plate and eight 7/16-inch x 1-1/4-inch bolts, lock washers, and nuts. Tighten all bolts.

SAFETY SUGGESTIONS

The safety of the operator was one of the prime considerations in the minds of the engineers when this clod-buster was designed.

However, investigations of thousands of farm accidents show that careless use of farm machinery causes nearly one-third of all farm accidents. You can make your farm a safer place to live and work if you observe the safety suggestions given. Study these suggestions carefully and insist that they be followed by those working with you and for you.

Only one person—the operator—should be permitted on the tractor platform while plow is in operation.

Never clean or adjust a machine that is in motion.

Park or block the plow so it will not roll when disconnected from the tractor drawbar.

Never ride or permit others to ride on the drawbar of the tractor.

Be careful when operating on hillsides because the tractor may tip sideways if it strikes a hole, ditch or other irregularity.

When transporting the clod-buster on a road or highway at night or during the day, use accessory lights and devices for adequate warning to operators of other vehicles. In this regard check local governmental regulations. Lights and devices may be obtained from your John Deere dealer.



Assembly

Assemble the clod-buster as illustrated on the following pages. The illustrations show clearly the parts to be assembled and attached in their proper order. Separate all bundles and arrange conveniently for assembly. Attach all parts loosely; then,

tighten after all assembly is completed.

"Right-hand" and "left-hand" sides of the clod-buster are determined by facing in the direction the plow will travel when in use.

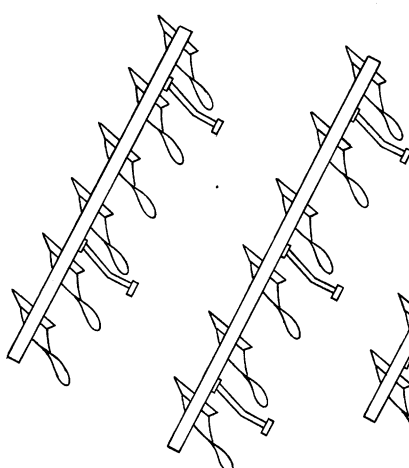

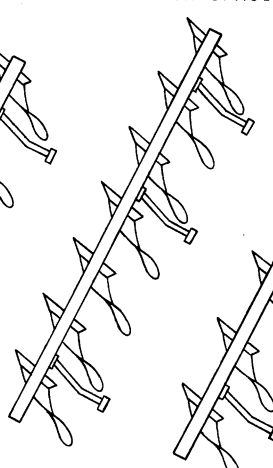
4-BOTTOM PLOW
28-INCH SPACING



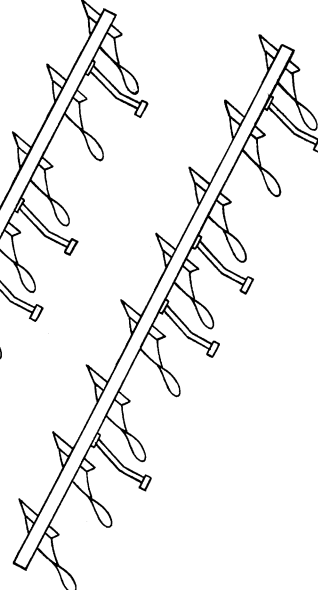
6-BOTTOM PLOW

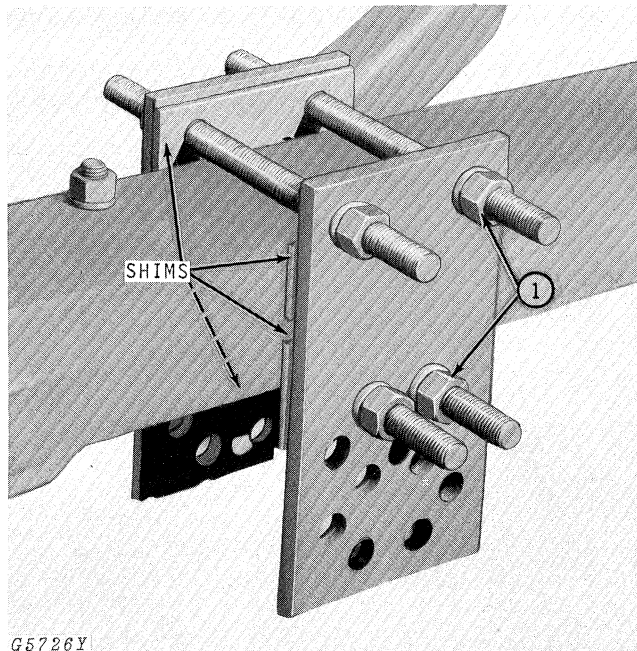

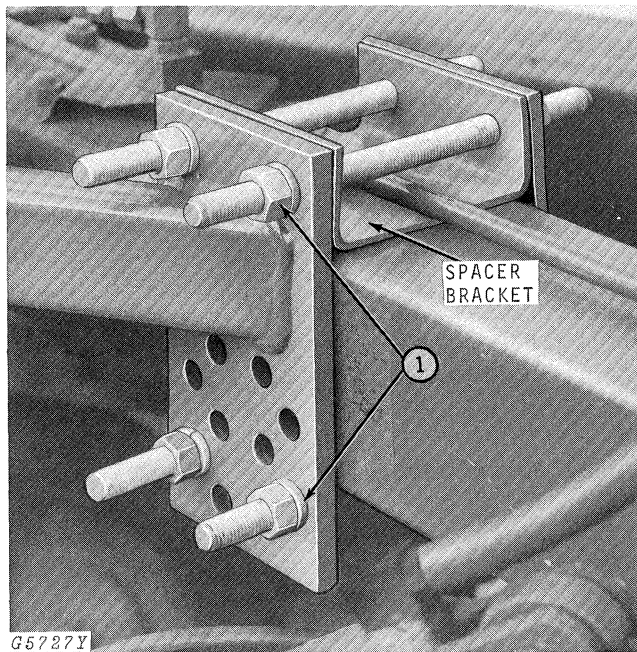
Mounting Arm Location

Welded Seam Truss Box Plows



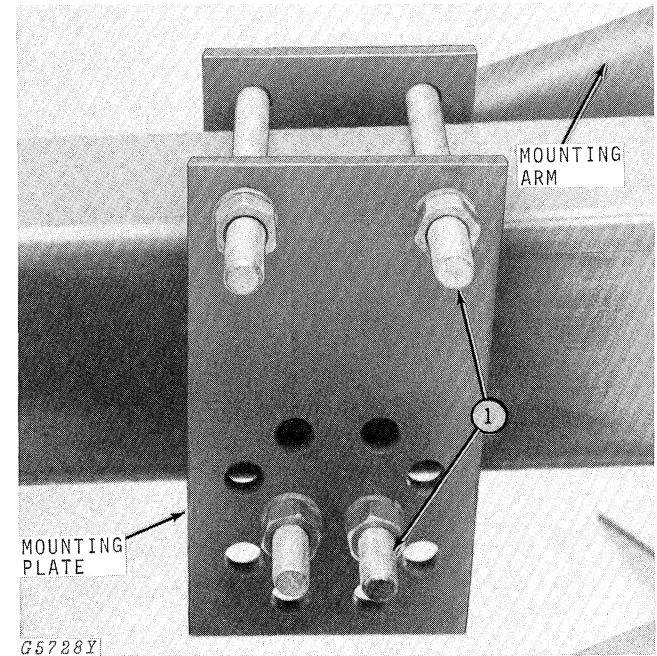
1. Attach mounting arm to truss box of plow using four shims, four 3/4-inch x 11-7/8-inch stud bolts, lock washers, and nuts. Two-hole end of mounting plate must be at the top. Refer to Mounting Arm Location diagram on page 6. Tighten all bolts.

2500 Series Plows



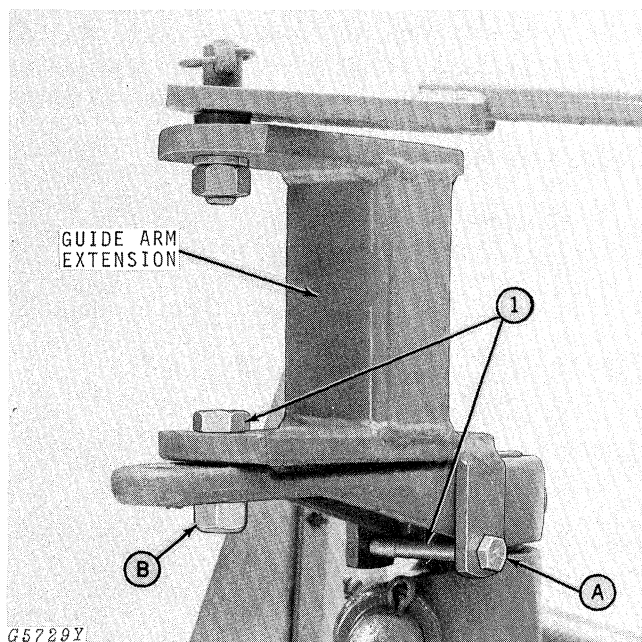
1. Attach mounting arm to truss box of plow using spacer bracket, four 3/4-inch x 11-7/8-inch stud bolts, lock-washers, and nuts. Two-hole end of mounting plate must be at the top. Refer to Mounting Arm Location diagram on page 6. Tighten all bolts.

Standard Assembly Plows



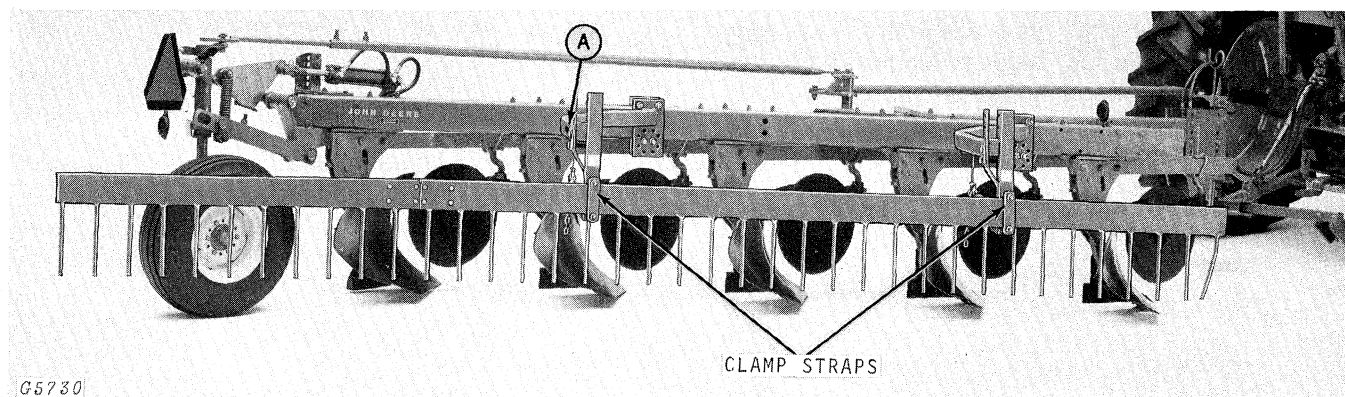
1. Attach mounting arm to truss box of plow, using four 3/4-inch x 11-7/8-inch stud bolts, lock washers, and nuts. Two-hole end of mounting plate must be at the top. Refer to Mounting Arm Location diagram on page 6. Tighten all bolts.

GUIDE ARM EXTENSION

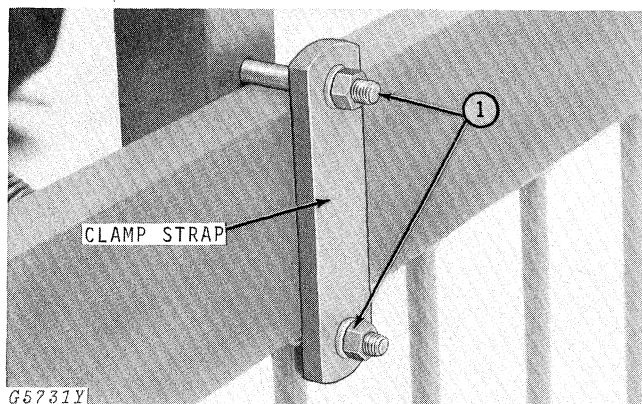


1. If required, attach guide arm extension using the 1/2-inch x 4-inch bolt and lock nut at "A," and 3/4-inch x 2-inch bolt and lock nut at "B". (See chart on page 5.)

HARROW HEAD



John Deere 6-Bottom Clod-Buster on a 1450 5-Bottom Semi-Integral Moldboard Plow



1. Attach harrow head to carrier arm using clamp strap and 1/2-inch x 3-1/2-inch bolts, lock washers, and nuts. Angled tooth must be to the front of the plow.

Attach red reflector at "A".

IMPORTANT: The location of the harrow head must be one bottom forward of the first bottom on the plow.

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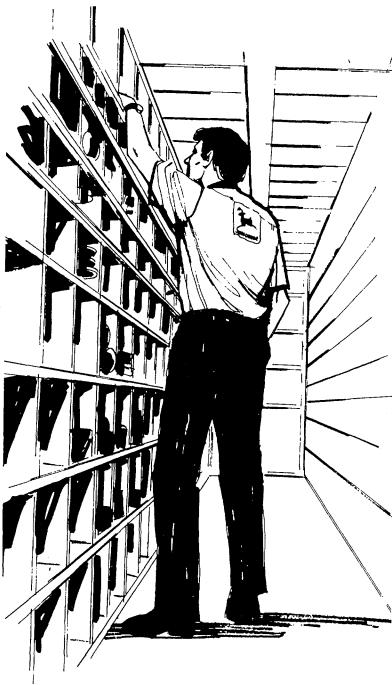

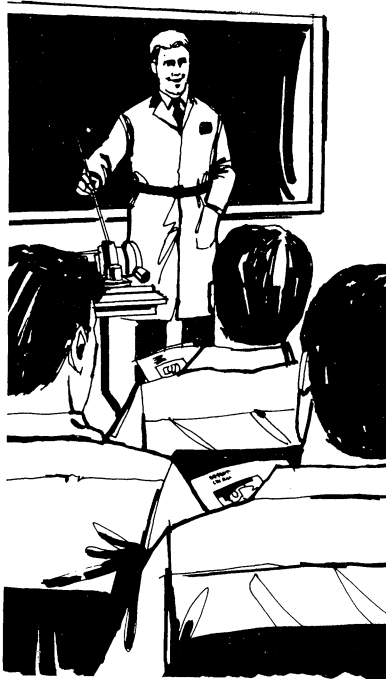

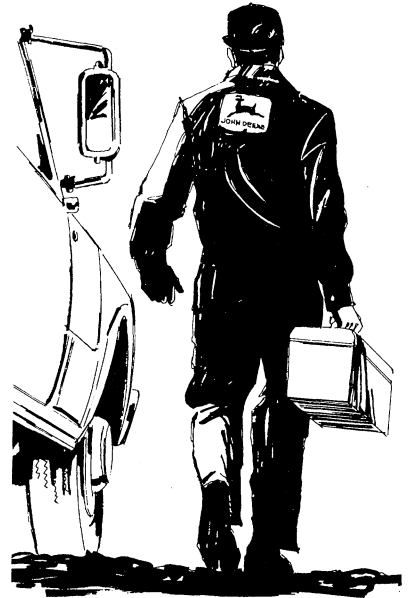
