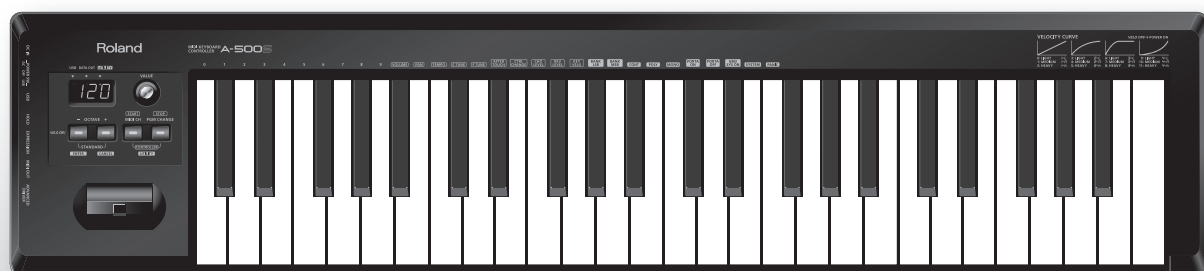

Owner's Manual

Before using this unit, carefully read the sections entitled: "USING THE UNIT SAFELY" and "IMPORTANT NOTES" (p. 3; p. 5). These sections provide important information concerning the proper operation of the unit. Additionally, in order to feel assured that you have gained a good grasp of every feature provided by your new unit, Owner's manual should be read in its entirety. The manual should be saved and kept on hand as a convenient reference.

⚠ CAUTION	Used for instructions intended to alert the user to the risk of injury or material damage should the unit be used improperly. * Material damage refers to damage or other adverse effects caused with respect to the home and all its furnishings, as well to domestic animals or pets.

About the Symbols

	The ⚠ symbol alerts the user to important instructions or warnings. The specific meaning of the symbol is determined by the design contained within the triangle. In the case of the symbol at left, it is used for general cautions, warnings, or alerts to danger.
	The ⚡ symbol alerts the user to items that must never be carried out (are forbidden). The specific thing that must not be done is indicated by the design contained within the circle. In the case of the symbol at left, it means that the unit must never be disassembled.
	The ● symbol alerts the user to things that must be carried out. The specific thing that must be done is indicated by the design contained within the circle. In the case of the symbol at left, it means that the power-cord plug must be unplugged from the outlet.

ALWAYS OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING

⚠ WARNING

- Do not open (or modify in any way) the unit or its AC adaptor. 

- Do not attempt to repair the unit, or replace parts within it (except when this manual provides specific instructions directing you to do so). Refer all servicing to your retailer, the nearest Roland Service Center, or an authorized Roland distributor, as listed on the separate sheet titled "Information." 

- Never install the unit in any of the following locations.
 - Subject to temperature extremes (e.g., direct sunlight in an enclosed vehicle, near a heating duct, on top of heat-generating equipment); or are
 - Damp (e.g., baths, washrooms, on wet floors); or are
 - Exposed to steam or smoke; or are
 - Subject to salt exposure; or are
 - Humid; or are
 - Exposed to rain; or are
 - Dusty or sandy; or are
 - Subject to high levels of vibration and shakiness.


- Make sure you always have the unit placed so it is level and sure to remain stable. Never place it on stands that could wobble, or on inclined surfaces. 

- Do not excessively twist or bend the power cord, nor place heavy objects on it. Doing so can damage the cord, producing severed elements and short circuits. Damaged cords are fire and shock hazards! 

⚠ WARNING

- Use only the specified AC adaptor (PSA series), and make sure the line voltage at the installation matches the input voltage specified on the AC adaptor's body. Other AC adaptors may use a different polarity, or be designed for a different voltage, so their use could result in damage, malfunction, or electric shock. 

- Do not allow any objects (e.g., flammable material, coins, pins); or liquids of any kind (water, soft drinks, etc.) to penetrate the unit. 

- Immediately turn the power off, remove the AC adaptor from the outlet, and request servicing by your retailer, the nearest Roland Service Center, or an authorized Roland distributor, as listed on the separate sheet titled "Information" when:
 - The AC adaptor or the power-supply cord has been damaged; or
 - If smoke or unusual odor occurs
 - Objects have fallen into, or liquid has been spilled onto the unit; or
 - The unit has been exposed to rain (or otherwise has become wet); or
 - The unit does not appear to operate normally or exhibits a marked change in performance.

- In households with small children, an adult should provide supervision until the child is capable of following all the rules essential for the safe operation of the unit. 

WARNING

- Protect the unit from strong impact.
(Do not drop it!) 
- Do not force the unit's power-supply cord to share an outlet with an unreasonable number of other devices. Be especially careful when using extension cords—the total power used by all devices you have connected to the extension cord's outlet must never exceed the power rating (watts/amperes) for the extension cord. Excessive loads can cause the insulation on the cord to heat up and eventually melt through. 
- Before using the unit in a foreign country, consult with your retailer, the nearest Roland Service Center, or an authorized Roland distributor, as listed on the separate sheet titled "Information." 
- Batteries must never be recharged, heated, taken apart, or thrown into fire or water. 

- DO NOT play a CD-ROM or DVD-ROM disc on a conventional audio CD player. The resulting sound may be of a level that could cause permanent hearing loss. Damage to speakers or other system components may result. 
- Never expose battery to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like. 

CAUTION

- The unit and the AC adaptor should be located so their location or position does not interfere with their proper ventilation. 
- Always grasp only the plug on the AC adaptor cord when plugging into, or unplugging from, an outlet or this unit. 
- At regular intervals, you should unplug the AC adaptor and clean it by using a dry cloth to wipe all dust and other accumulations away from its prongs. Also, disconnect the power plug from the power outlet whenever the unit is to remain unused for an extended period of time. Any accumulation of dust between the power plug and the power outlet can result in poor insulation and lead to fire. 

CAUTION

- Try to prevent cords and cables from becoming entangled. Also, all cords and cables should be placed so they are out of the reach of children. 
- Never climb on top of, nor place heavy objects on the unit. 
- Never handle the AC adaptor or its plugs with wet hands when plugging into, or unplugging from, an outlet or this unit. 
- Before moving the unit, disconnect the AC adaptor and all cords coming from external devices. 
- Before cleaning the unit, turn off the power and unplug the AC adaptor from the outlet. 
- Whenever you suspect the possibility of lightning in your area, disconnect the AC adaptor from the outlet. 
- If used improperly, batteries may explode or leak and cause damage or injury. In the interest of safety, please read and observe the following precautions (p. 12). 
 - Carefully follow the installation instructions for batteries, and make sure you observe the correct polarity. 
 - Avoid using new batteries together with used ones. In addition, avoid mixing different types of batteries. 
 - Remove the batteries whenever the unit is to remain unused for an extended period of time.
 - If a battery has leaked, use a soft piece of cloth or paper towel to wipe all remnants of the discharge from the battery compartment. Then install new batteries. To avoid inflammation of the skin, make sure that none of the battery discharge gets onto your hands or skin. Exercise the utmost caution so that none of the discharge gets near your eyes. Immediately rinse the affected area with running water if any of the discharge has entered the eyes.
 - Never keep batteries together with metallic objects such as ballpoint pens, necklaces, hairpins, etc.
- Used batteries must be disposed of in compliance with whatever regulations for their safe disposal that may be observed in the region in which you live. 

IMPORTANT NOTES

Power Supply: Use of Batteries

- Do not connect this unit to same electrical outlet that is being used by an electrical appliance that is controlled by an inverter (such as a refrigerator, washing machine, microwave oven, or air conditioner), or that contains a motor. Depending on the way in which the electrical appliance is used, power supply noise may cause this unit to malfunction or may produce audible noise. If it is not practical to use a separate electrical outlet, connect a power supply noise filter between this unit and the electrical outlet.
- The AC adaptor will begin to generate heat after long hours of consecutive use. This is normal, and is not a cause for concern.
- The use of an AC adaptor is recommended as the unit's power consumption is relatively high. Should you prefer to use batteries, please use the alkaline type.
- When installing or replacing batteries, always turn off the power on this unit and disconnect any other devices you may have connected. This way, you can prevent malfunction and/or damage to speakers or other devices.
- Before connecting this unit to other devices, turn off the power to all units. This will help prevent malfunctions and/or damage to speakers or other devices.

Placement

- This device may interfere with radio and television reception. Do not use this device in the vicinity of such receivers.
- Noise may be produced if wireless communications devices, such as cell phones, are operated in the vicinity of this unit. Such noise could occur when receiving or initiating a call, or while conversing. Should you experience such problems, you should relocate such wireless devices so they are at a greater distance from this unit, or switch them off.
- Do not expose the unit to direct sunlight, place it near devices that radiate heat, leave it inside an enclosed vehicle, or otherwise subject it to temperature extremes. Excessive heat can deform or discolor the unit.
- When moved from one location to another where the temperature and/or humidity is very different, water droplets (condensation) may form inside the unit. Damage or malfunction may result if you attempt to use the unit in this condition. Therefore, before using the unit, you must allow it to stand for several hours, until the condensation has completely evaporated.
- Do not allow objects to remain on top of the keyboard. This can be the cause of malfunction, such as keys ceasing to produce sound.
- Depending on the material and temperature of the surface on which you place the unit, its rubber feet may discolor or mar the surface. You can place a piece of felt or cloth under the rubber feet to prevent this from happening. If you do so, please make sure that the unit will not slip or move accidentally.

Maintenance

- For everyday cleaning wipe the unit with a soft, dry cloth or one that has been slightly dampened with water. To remove stubborn dirt, use a cloth impregnated with a mild, non-abrasive detergent. Afterwards, be sure to wipe the unit thoroughly with a soft, dry cloth.
- Never use benzine, thinners, alcohol or solvents of any kind, to avoid the possibility of discoloration and/or deformation.

Additional Precautions

- Use a reasonable amount of care when using the unit's buttons, sliders, or other controls; and when using its jacks and connectors. Rough handling can lead to malfunctions.
- When connecting / disconnecting all cables, grasp the connector itself—never pull on the cable. This way you will avoid causing shorts, or damage to the cable's internal elements.
- To avoid disturbing your neighbors, try to keep the unit's volume at reasonable levels (especially when it is late at night).
- When you need to transport the unit, package it in the box (including padding) that it came in, if possible. Otherwise, you will need to use equivalent packaging materials.
- Use only the specified expression pedal (EV-5; sold separately). By connecting any other expression pedals, you risk causing malfunction and/or damage to the unit.

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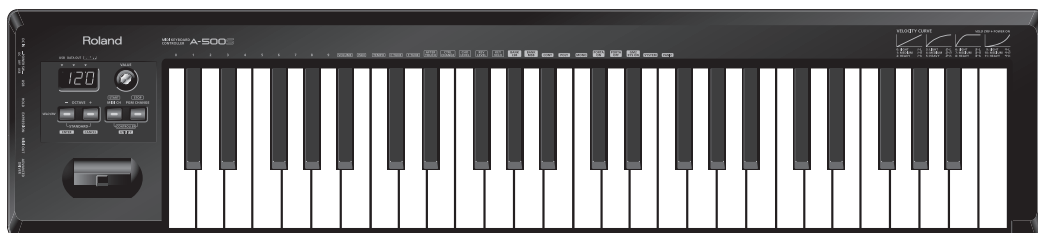
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Contents of the Package

USB cable

Use this cable to connect the A-500S to the USB connector of your computer. For details on connections, refer to **"Driver Installation and Settings"** (p. 13).

- * Please use only the included USB cable. If you require a replacement due to loss or damage, please contact the nearest Roland Service Center, or an authorized Roland distributor, as listed on the separate sheet titled "Information."

CD-ROM, DVD-ROM (one each)

A-500S CD-ROM

This contains the A-500S drivers.

SONAR X1 LE DVD-ROM

SONAR X1 LE, high-quality music production tool, is included.

- * Avoid touching or scratching the shiny underside (encoded surface) of the disc. Damaged or dirty discs may not be read properly. Keep your discs clean using a commercially available CD cleaner.

Unless you complete the user registration and obtain a registration code as directed in this guide, you won't be able to use the software for more than thirty days after installation.

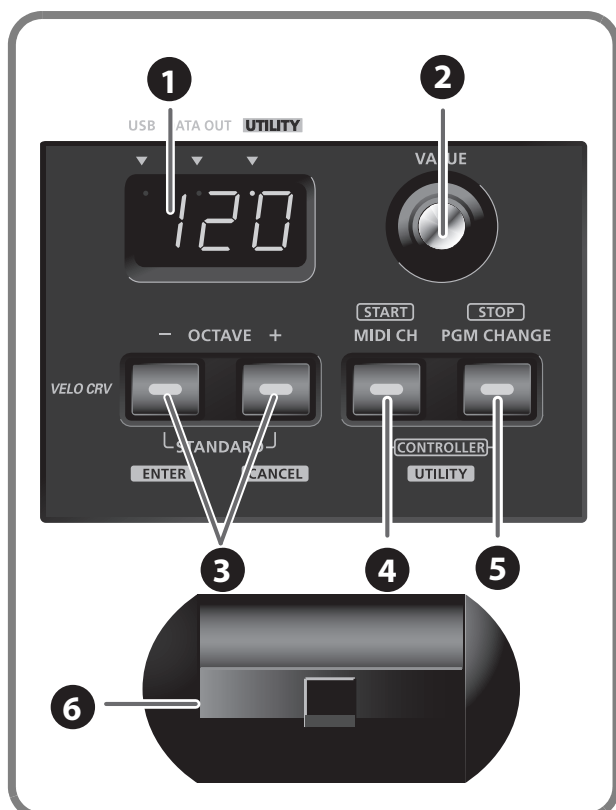
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Names of Things and What They Do

You must install the driver before you connect the A-500S to your computer for the first time.
Install the driver as described in “**Driver Installation and Settings**” (p. 13).

Panel



1 Display

Indicates the current status and various other information.

Number	Operating a controller will cause its current value to appear in the display for a time.
USB	Lights if the A-500S is connected to your computer via USB.
DATA OUT	This will blink when MIDI messages are transmitted via USB or MIDI OUT.
UTILITY	This will blink in UTILITY mode (p. 28).

2 VALUE knob

Use this knob to specify the MIDI transmit channel or the program change number. In **CONTROLLER mode** (p. 36), this knob controls the parameter you specify (p. 46).

Turning the encoder specifies the value.

3 OCTAVE [-] [+] button

Press **OCTAVE [-] [+]** button to shift the pitch of the keyboard up or down in steps of an octave.

When not in **PLAY mode** (p. 27), use these buttons to return to confirm setting item (the **[ENTER]** button) or to cancel the setting and return to **PLAY mode** (the **[CANCEL]** button).

* If you do not operate or play the A-500S for a certain length of time, the display and buttons will automatically dim.

4 [MIDI CH] button

Specifies the transmission channel “**Current channel**” (p. 31) for the keyboard and bender.

In **CONTROLLER mode** (p. 36) this transmits a Start message (FAh).

5 [PGM CHANGE] button

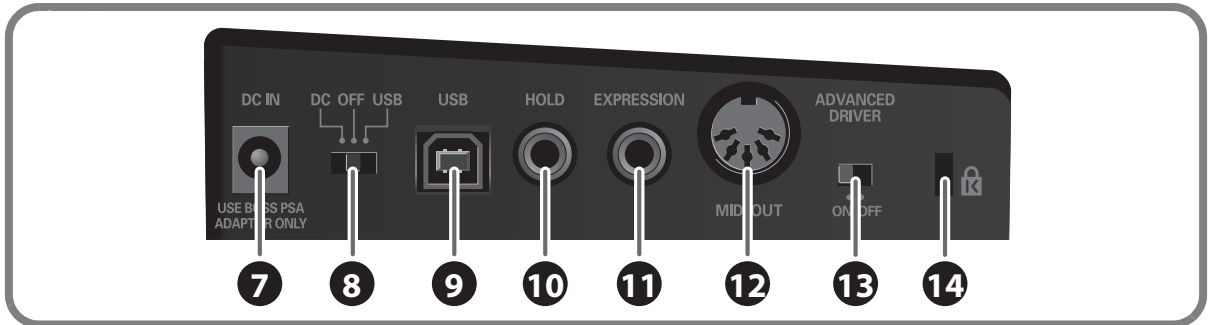
Transmits program change messages on the current channel.

In **CONTROLLER mode** (p. 36) this transmits a Stop message (FCh).

6 Pitch Bend/Modulation lever

This lever can be used to modify the pitch or apply vibrato.

Side panel



7 AC adaptor jack

Connect the AC adaptor (PSA series; sold separately) to this jack. Insert the plug firmly so it won't get unplugged accidentally.

8 Power switch

DC	Power-on status when using the AC adaptor or batteries * If the AC adaptor is connected and batteries are inserted, the power supplied by the AC adaptor is used. If you disconnect the AC adaptor, the power supplied by the batteries is used.
OFF	Power is off
USB	Power on using a USB cable (when not using the AC adaptor) * USB (=BUS power) can be used when the A-500S is connected to your computer via a USB cable. In this case, the power will be supplied from your computer via the USB cable. To use the A-500S with bus power, set the power switch to USB. * For some computers, the A-500S may not operate if bus power is used. In this case, use the AC adaptor (sold separately) or batteries.

9 USB connector

Use this when connecting the A-500S to your computer via a USB cable.

10 HOLD jack

Connect a pedal switch to this jack and use it as a hold pedal.

11 EXPRESSION jack

Connect an expression pedal to this jack and use it to control tone or volume in real time.

12 MIDI OUT connector

This can be connected to the MIDI connector of other MIDI devices to transmit MIDI messages.

13 [ADVANCED DRIVER] switch

This switches the operating mode between Advanced mode and Standard driver mode.

Normally, you should use Advanced mode (ON).

ON (Advanced mode)	This mode utilizes the A-500S's special, advanced MIDI driver. This advanced driver uses *FPT technology for rapid, high-performance MIDI transmissions.
OFF (Standard driver mode)	This mode uses the standard MIDI driver included with the OS. Use this if you do not have the special driver installed. This setting can be used only when running Windows XP.

* FPT=Fast Processing Technology of MIDI Transmission

Inserting batteries

1. Make sure that the power switch is turned off.

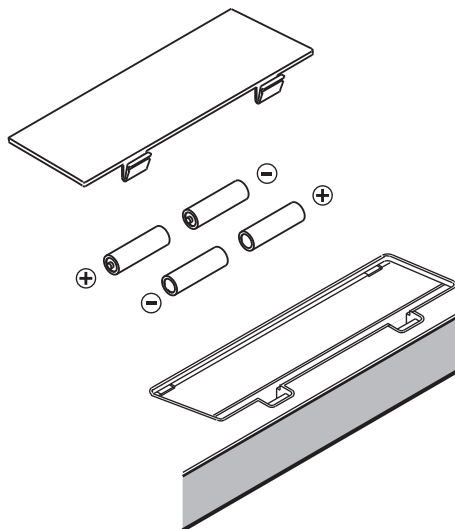
2. Remove the battery cover located on the rear panel of the A-500S.

- * When turning the unit upside-down, get a bunch of newspapers or magazines, and place them under the four corners or at both ends to prevent damage to the buttons and controls. Also, you should try to orient the unit so no buttons or controls get damaged.
- * When turning the unit upside-down, handle with care to avoid dropping it, or allowing it to fall or tip over.

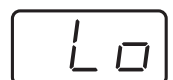
3. Insert four AA batteries into the battery compartment, making sure to observe the correct polarity (+/-).

- * Use alkaline batteries.
- * Do not mix new batteries with partially used batteries, and do not mix batteries of differing types.

4. Close the battery cover.



When the batteries run low, the display will indicate "Lo." When this message appears, replace the batteries as soon as possible.

What is a driver?

A driver is software that transfers data between the A-500S and the application software on your computer when the A-500S is connected to your computer.

* If you want to use the A-500S in Standard driver mode, refer to **“About standard driver mode (Windows XP)”** (p. 61).

Windows 7/Windows Vista users

Steps to be performed on the A-500S itself are marked by a **Operation of the A-500S** symbol.

Do not connect the A-500S to your computer until you are directed to do so.

* The example screen shots included here are taken from Windows Vista.

Installing the driver

1. Start up Windows without the A-500S connected.
* Disconnect all USB cables other than those for a USB keyboard and/or USB mouse (if used).
2. Close all currently running software.
3. Insert the included **A-500S CD-ROM** into your CD-ROM drive.
* If the auto-play dialog appears, click **"Open folder to view files."**
4. In the appropriate folder within the **CD-ROM**, double-click the **Setup** icon to start up the installer.

Windows Vista	Open the folders [Driver] and then [Vista]
Windows 7 64-bit edition	Open the folders [x64Driver] and then [Win7]

If you get a message saying **"The operating system you are using is not supported"** or **"The version of this file is not compatible with the version of Windows you're running,"** or if you don't know the version of your operating system, check your operating system as described below.

If **System type** indicates **64-bit Operating System**, you have the 64-bit version.

Windows 7 users

Open **Control Panel**, click **System and Security**, and then click **System**.

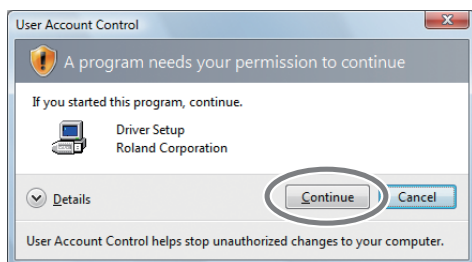
If the Control Panel shows the icon view, click **System**.

Windows Vista users

Open **Control Panel**, click **System and Maintenance**, and then click **System**.

If the Control Panel shows the classic view, double-click the **System** icon.

5. A confirmation screen regarding user account control will appear.
Click **[Yes]** if you're using Windows 7, or click **[Continue]** if you're using Windows Vista.



6. The screen will indicate **“A-500S Driver will be installed on your computer.”**

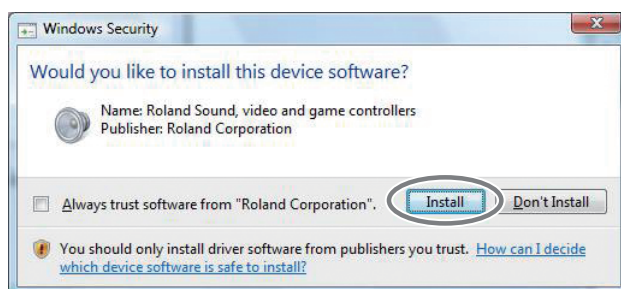
Click **[Next]**.

* If any other message appears, proceed as directed by the message.

7. To begin the installation, click **[Next]** once again.

Installation will begin.

If a dialog box related to Windows Security appears, click **[Install]**.



The screen will indicate **“Ready to install the driver.”**

* If any other message appears, proceed as directed by the message.

8. **Operation of the A-500S** Set the A-500S's [ADVANCED DRIVER] switch to the **ON** position.

* If the [ADVANCED DRIVER] switch is set to **OFF**, the installation will not take place as described in the following procedure.

* Once the connections have been completed, turn on power to your various devices in the order specified. By turning on devices in the wrong order, you risk causing malfunction and/or damage to speakers and other devices.

9. **Operation of the A-500S** Set the A-500S's power switch to the **OFF** position.

10. **Operation of the A-500S** Use a USB cable to connect the A-500S to your computer.

11. **Operation of the A-500S** Set the A-500S's power switch to the **USB** position.

The driver will be installed automatically.

* It can take several minutes for the driver installation to complete.

* This unit is equipped with a protection circuit. A brief interval (a few seconds) after power up is required before the unit will operate normally.

12. When installation has been completed, the **Driver Setup** dialog box will indicate **“Installation has been completed.”**

Click **[Close]** to close the **Driver Setup** dialog box.

If the **System Settings Change** dialog box appears, click **[Yes]**. Windows will automatically restart.

Next, you need to set your software so it can use the A-500S.

Input/output device settings

In order to use the A-500S with your software, you'll need to select the A-500S as MIDI input/output device. For details on how to do this, refer to the documentation for your software.

- * If you're unable to select the A-500S as the input/output device in your software, it may be that a problem has occurred. Refer to **"Problems with settings"** (p. 65) in the Troubleshooting section.

- * The Windows Media Player included with Windows 7 or Windows Vista cannot use the A-500S's MIDI input/output device.

Caution when recording or playing back with your software

Check the following points before you use the A-500S to record or play back.

- Connect the A-500S to your computer before you start up the software you're using.
- Do not disconnect the A-500S's USB cable from your computer while your software is running. Close the software you're using before you disconnect the A-500S's USB cable from your computer.

This completes driver installation and settings.

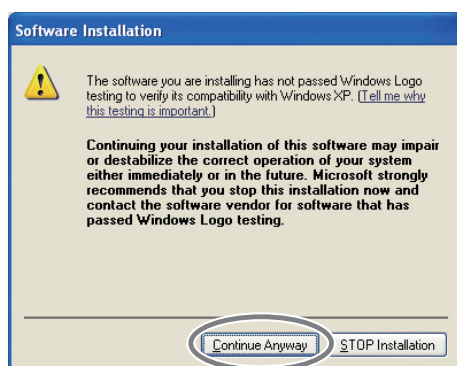
Windows XP users

Steps to be performed on the A-500S itself are marked by a **Operation of the A-500S** symbol.

Do not connect the A-500S to your computer until you are directed to do so.

Installing the driver

1. Start up Windows without the A-500S connected.
 - * Disconnect all USB cables other than those for a USB keyboard and/or USB mouse (if used).
2. Close all currently running software.
3. Insert the included **A-500S CD-ROM** into your CD-ROM drive.
4. On the **CD-ROM**, open the [Driver] folder and then the [XP] folder, and double-click the **Setup** icon.
 - * If you get a message saying “The operating system you are using is not supported” or saying that the application is invalid, check the version of your operating system.
 - * If the “**Install Program As Other User**” dialog box appears, click [**Cancel**] to terminate the installation, log on to Windows using an administrator account, and perform the installation once again.
5. The screen will indicate “**A-500S Driver will be installed on your computer.**” Click [**Next**].
 - * If any other message appears, proceed as directed by the message.
6. To begin the installation, click [**Next**].
 If the **Software Installation** dialog box appears, click [**Continue Anyway**] to proceed with the installation.

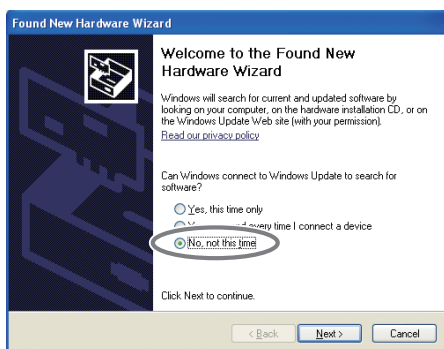


- * If you are unable to proceed, click [**OK**] to halt the installation, and then change the settings as described in “**Driver signing option settings (Windows XP)**” (p. 54).

The screen will indicate “**Ready to install the driver.**”

- * If any other message appears, proceed as directed by the message.

7. **Operation of the A-500S** Set the A-500S's [ADVANCED DRIVER] switch to the **ON** position.
 - * If the [ADVANCED DRIVER] switch is set to **OFF**, the installation won't take place as described in the following procedure.
 - * Once the connections have been completed, turn on power to your various devices in the order specified. By turning on devices in the wrong order, you risk causing malfunction and/or damage to speakers and other devices.
 8. **Operation of the A-500S** Set the A-500S's power switch to the **OFF** position.
 9. **Operation of the A-500S** Use a USB cable to connect the A-500S to your computer.
 10. **Operation of the A-500S** Set the A-500S's power switch to the **USB** position.
 - * This unit is equipped with a protection circuit. A brief interval (a few seconds) after power up is required before the unit will operate normally.
1. The message **"Found New Hardware"** will appear in the lower right corner of the screen, and the **Found New Hardware Wizard** will appear.
 - * It may take between ten seconds to several minutes until the **Found New Hardware Wizard** appears.
- If you are asked whether you want to connect to Windows Update, choose **No** and click **[Next]**.



2. Choose **Install the software automatically (Recommended)**, and click **[Next]**.
 3. If the **Hardware Installation** dialog box appears, click **[Continue Anyway]** to proceed with the installation.
 - * If you are unable to proceed, click **[OK]** to halt the installation, and then change the settings as described in **"Driver signing option settings (Windows XP)"** (p. 54).
 4. The screen will indicate **"Completing the Found New Hardware Wizard."** Click **[Finish]**.
11. When installation is complete, the **Driver Setup** dialog box will indicate **"Installation has been completed."** Click **[Close]** to close the **Driver Setup** dialog box.

If the **System Settings Change** dialog box appears, click **[Yes]** to restart Windows.

Next, you need to set your software so it can use the A-500S.

Input/output device settings

In order to use the A-500S with your software, you must select the A-500S as MIDI input/output device. For details on how to make this setting, refer to the documentation for the software you're using.

* If you're unable to select the A-500S as the input/output device in your software, it may be that a problem has occurred. Refer to **"Problems with settings"** (p. 65) in the Troubleshooting section.

Settings when using the A-500S in Windows Media Player

Some software, such as Windows Media Player, may use the system default playback/recording device as its MIDI input/output device.
Make the following settings if you want to use an external MIDI sound module connected to the MIDI OUT connector of the A-500S.

1. Open the **Control Panel**, click **Sounds, Speech, and Audio Devices**, and then double-click the **Sounds and Audio Devices**.
* If you're using the Classic view, double-click the **Sounds and Audio Devices** icon.
2. Click the **Audio** tab to open it, and in the **MIDI Music Playback** area, select **A-500S MIDI OUT**.
3. Click **[OK]** to complete the setting.

Caution when recording or playing back with your software

PLAY

What is PLAY mode?

This is the mode in which you play the A-500S.

In PLAY mode, playing the keyboard will transmit note messages to play the MIDI device.

In PLAY mode, you can play the keyboard to produce sound on a connected sound module, and also use various other functions, such as operating the Pitch Bend/Modulation lever to change the pitch of the currently sounding note (Pitch Bend), adding vibrato (Modulation), or switching the octave (Octave Shift).

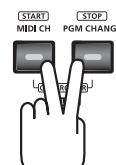
In this mode you can also specify the MIDI transmit channel, and transmit program changes, parameters, or start/stop messages.

To switch the A-500S to PLAY mode...

When you turn on the power, the A-500S will start up in PLAY mode.

To switch the A-500S to PLAY mode from UTILITY mode (p. 28), simultaneously hold the **[MIDI CH]** button and **[PGM CHANGE]** button down or press the **[CANCEL]** button.

- You are returned to PLAY mode once a setting or a process has been completed within the UTILITY mode.
- You will also return to PLAY mode if you cancel an operation within UTILITY mode. In this case, the setting you had been making will be discarded.

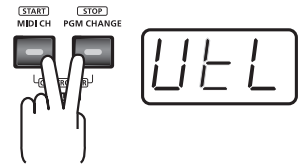

What is UTILITY mode?

This is the mode in which you assign the control messages you want to use, and make settings for the A-500S itself. In UTILITY mode, you use the keyboard to choose the function you want to set. In UTILITY mode, playing the keyboard will not transmit notes.

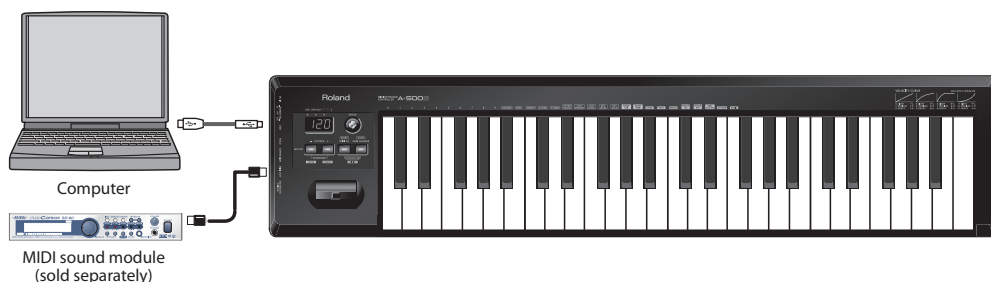

When you turn on the power, the A-500S will start up in **PLAY mode**.

→ “**What is PLAY mode?**” (p. 27)

In **PLAY mode**, playing the keyboard will transmit note messages to play the connected MIDI device.

In order to transmit MIDI messages from the A-500S, perform the following steps.

1. Set the MIDI channel the A-500S will use to transmit to the same channel on the sound module (software) is using to receive on.

Use MIDI Channel mode to set the **MIDI transmit channel**.

→ “**Setting the MIDI transmit channel**” (p. 31)

2. Select a **sound** on your **MIDI sound module**.

→ “**Selecting Sounds on a Sound Module**” (p. 32)

3. Once you have finished making settings, try playing the keyboard.

When you play the keyboard, MIDI messages are sent to the sound module (software).

* Since the A-500S does not contain a sound generator, you cannot play MIDI data using the A-500S alone.

Features useful when playing

Applying pitch changes to notes (Pitch Bend)	Move the Pitch Bend/Modulation lever (left or right) to transmit pitch bend messages, and apply subtle pitch changes to notes. * The amount of pitch change ("bend range") depends on the settings of your sound module.
Modifying the sound of notes (Modulation)	Push the Pitch Bend/Modulation lever away from you to transmit modulation messages (CC#01), changing the sound in real time (usually by adding a vibrato effect). * The type of change this produces in the sound depends on the settings of your sound module.
Adding a sustain effect to notes (Hold)	If a pedal switch or foot switch (one from the DP series or BOSS FS-5U; sold separately) is connected to the rear panel HOLD jack, you can press the foot switch to make notes continue sounding even after you remove your hand from the keyboard (the Hold function). This will transmit the MIDI message hold 1 (CC#64). The hold on message (data 127) is transmitted when you press the pedal, and hold off (data 0) when you release the pedal.
Controlling the volume or timbre of the sound (Expression)	If an expression pedal (EV-5; sold separately) is connected to the rear panel EXPRESSION jack, you can use the pedal to control the volume or tone.
Changing octaves (Octave Shift)	You can press OCTAVE [-] or OCTAVE [+] to raise or lower the pitch range of the keyboard (the octave shift function). Press OCTAVE [-] once to lower the pitch range one octave. Press it once again to lower the range an additional octave. Permissible settings for this range from -4 to 5 octaves. OCTAVE [-] or OCTAVE [+] will light according to the current octave shift setting. If you simultaneously press OCTAVE [-] and OCTAVE [+], the octave shift setting will be reset to 0, restoring the normal pitch range of the keyboard.

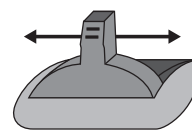
MEMO

While playing the keyboard, move the Pitch Bend/Modulation lever to the left to lower the pitch of the currently selected patch, or to the right to raise its pitch.

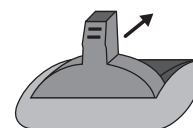
This is known as **pitch bend**. You can also apply vibrato by gently pressing the Modulation Controller. This is known as **modulation**.

If you push the lever away from you and the same time move it to the right or left, you can apply both effects at once.

- * The amount of pitch change ("bend range") depends on the settings of your sound module.

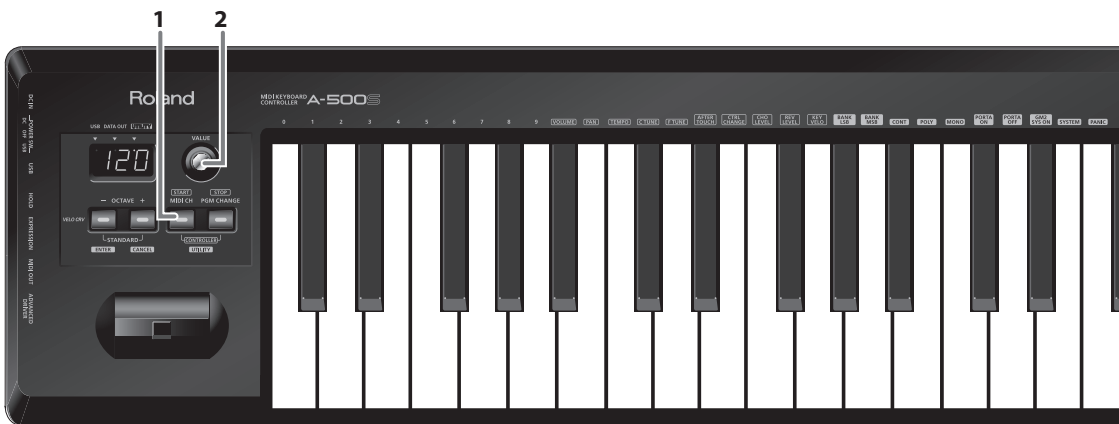

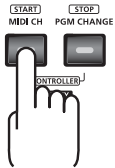

Selecting sounds on a sound module

—Transmitting program change / bank select messages

To select a sound on your MIDI sound module, transmit a program change.

To select a sound from a different bank, first transmit a bank select message that switches the bank. Then transmit a program change.

* You must transmit the bank select message before transmitting the program change message.

What is a bank?

MIDI sound modules organize their numerous sounds in various groups according to the category of sound. These groups are called "banks."

Program change messages can only select sounds within the same bank, but by using these in conjunction with bank select messages, you can select different variations of sound.

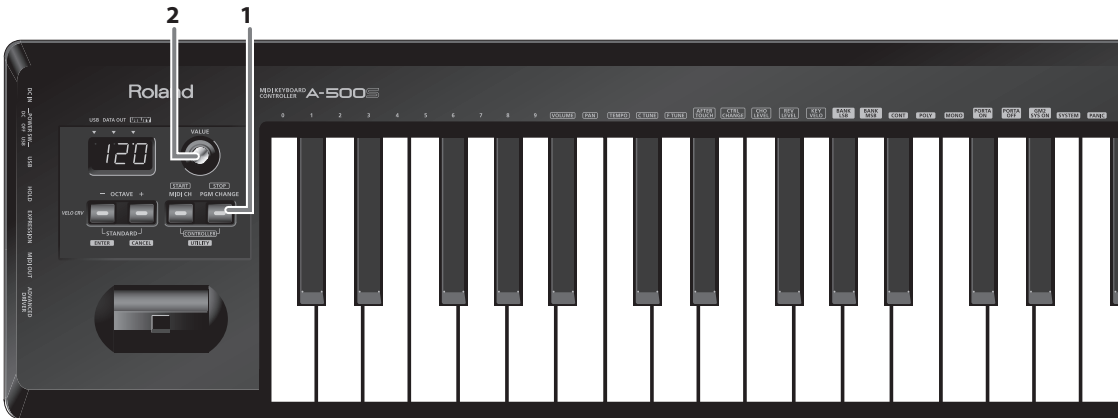

What is CONTROLLER mode?

In this mode, the **[MIDI CH]** button, **[PGM CHANGE]** button, and **VALUE knob** are assigned different functions than in the normal **PLAY mode**.

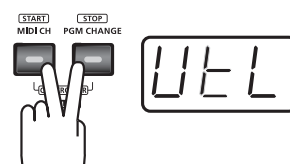
If notes on a connected MIDI sound module become “stuck,” or if there is something wrong with the sound, you can execute the Panic function to solve the problem.

When you execute the panic function, **All sounds off**, **All notes off**, and **Reset all controllers** messages will be transmitted on all channels.



1. Simultaneously hold the **[MIDI CH]** button and **[PGM CHANGE]** button down.

The display will indicate “UTL,” and the A-500S enters UTILITY mode.



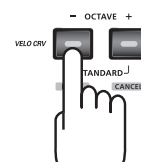

The **reset message** has now been transmitted.

Transmitting the value of a specific parameter

Specified parameters

The A-500S lets you assign a specific parameter to the VALUE knob so that the value of that parameter will be transmitted when you operate the VALUE knob.

To assign a parameter

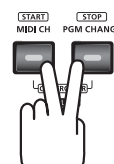
In UTILITY mode **System settings**, specify the parameter you want to assign to the VALUE knob.

If you're in **CONTROLLER mode** (p. 36), operating the VALUE knob will transmit the value of a specific parameter.



1. If you simultaneously press the **[MIDI CH]** button and the **[PGM CHANGE]** button, the **[MIDI CH]** button and **[PGM CHANGE]** button will light, and the A-500S will be in CONTROLLER mode.



2. Operate the **VALUE knob**.
The value of the parameter you assigned will be transmitted.

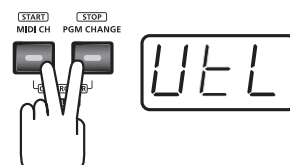

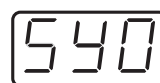

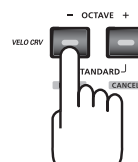

You can also access the VELOCITY CURVE setting screen by holding down the [VELO CRV] button while you turn on the power.

KEY VELOCITY (Keyboard: 3)

Key Velocity mode lets you specify whether the transmitted velocity value will vary according to your keyboard playing strength and the specified “**VELOCITY CURVE**” (p. 49), or will always be transmitted at a fixed value.

The A-500S detects the strength with which you play a key, and transmits the velocity value accordingly. However, if you set Key Velocity mode to a fixed value, the velocity will be transmitted at this fixed value regardless of how strongly you play the keys. You can use the Key Velocity mode to specify a fixed value if you don’t want your playing dynamics to have an effect.

Perform steps 1–3 (p. 47).

4. Use the **VALUE knob** or the **keyboard** to specify the Key Velocity mode.

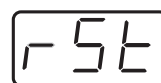

Reinstalling the driver

Removing the driver

Your computer may fail to correctly recognize the A-500S if the driver could not be installed according to the specified procedure. If so, you'll need to delete the driver that was detected by mistake. Use the following procedure to remove the driver, and then install the driver once again according to the procedure given in **"Driver Installation and Settings"** (p. 13).

Windows users

* The displayed content may differ depending on your system.

1. Start up Windows with the A-500S disconnected.

- * Make sure that all USB cables other than those for a USB keyboard and USB mouse (if used) are disconnected.
- * Log on using a user name whose account type is computer administrator (such as Administrator).

2. Insert the included **A-500S CD-ROM** into your computer's CD-ROM drive.

3. On the CD-ROM, navigate to the following folder and double-click **Uninstal.exe**.

6. The screen will indicate **"Uninstallation was completed."** Click **[OK]** to restart Windows.

Macintosh users

* The displayed content may differ depending on your system.

1. Start up your Macintosh with all USB cables disconnected.
 - * Make sure that all USB cables other than those for a USB keyboard and USB mouse are disconnected.
2. Insert the included **A-500S CD-ROM** into the CD-ROM drive of your Macintosh.

3. Double-click one of the following icons on the CD-ROM to start up the uninstaller.

4. The screen will indicate **“This uninstalls A-500S driver from this Macintosh”**. Click **[Uninstall]**.
 - * If any other message appears, proceed as directed by the message.
5. The screen will indicate **“Are you sure to uninstall the driver?”** Click **[OK]**.
6. An **Authenticate** dialog box or the dialog that asks to type your password will appear. Enter the password and click **[OK]**.
7. The screen will indicate **“Uninstallation is completed.”** Click **[Restart]** to restart your Macintosh.
 - * It may take some time for the Macintosh to restart.

Power management settings

If you experience problems such as interrupted notes or dropouts in the sound, you may be able to solve the problem by changing your computer's power management settings.

Windows 7 users

1. Open the **Control Panel**, click **System and Security**, and then click **Power Options**.
 - * If you're using an icon display, double-click the **Power Options** icon.
2. In **Select a power plan**, choose **High performance**.
If you don't see **High performance**, click **Show additional plans**.
3. In the **High performance** area, click **Change plan settings**.
4. Click **Change advanced power settings**.
5. In **Power Options Advanced Settings**, click the "+" symbol for **Hard Disk**, and click the "+" symbol for **Turn off hard disk after** to open it.
6. Click **Setting (Minutes)**, and click the down arrow to change the setting to **Never**.
7. Click **[OK]** to close the **Power Options** window.
8. Close the **Edit Plan Settings** screen.

Windows Vista users

1. Open the **Control Panel**, click **System and Maintenance**, and then click **Power Options**.
 - * If you're using the Classic view, double-click the **Power Options** icon.
2. In **Select a power plan**, choose **High performance**.

You may be able to solve the problem by changing the “Performance” setting of the system as described below.

1. Open the **Control Panel**, click **System and Security** and click **System**.
If you’re using an icon display, double-click the **System** icon.
2. At the left, click **Advanced system settings**.
3. A User Account Control dialog box will appear; click **[Yes]**.
* If you’re asked to enter an administrator password, log on to Windows as a user whose account type is administrator, and make the setting again.
4. Click **Performance [Settings]**, and click the **[Advanced]** tab.
5. Choose **Background services** and click **[OK]**.
6. Click **[OK]** to close **System Properties**.

Windows Vista users

1. Open the **Control Panel**, click **System and Maintenance**, and click **System**.
* If you’re using the Classic view, double-click the **System** icon.
2. In the list of **tasks** shown at the left, click **Advanced System Settings**.
3. A User Account Control dialog box will appear; click **[Continue]**.
* If you’re asked to enter an administrator password, log on to Windows as a user whose account type is administrator, and make the setting again.
4. Click **Performance [Settings]**, and click the **Advanced** tab.

Windows XP users

About standard driver mode (Windows XP)

Use this mode if you want to use the standard driver provided by your operating system.

* This setting can be used only when running Windows XP.

Installing the standard driver

1. Start up your computer with the A-500S disconnected.
 - * Disconnect all USB cables other than those for a USB keyboard and USB mouse (if used).
2. Close any software that is running.
3. Set the A-500S's [ADVANCED DRIVER] switch to **OFF**.
4. Set the A-500S's power switch to the **OFF** position.
5. Connect the A-500S to your computer.
6. Set the A-500S's power switch to the **USB** position.
The driver will be installed automatically.

Input/output device settings

In order to use the A-500S with your software, you'll need to choose the A-500S as the MIDI input/output device. For details on how to make this setting, refer to the documentation of your software.

Troubleshooting

If you experience problems, read this chapter first. It contains information that will help you solve the problem.

* For help with Windows or Macintosh operation, refer to the documentation for your computer or operating system.

Problems when installing the driver

Can't start up the installer

Is the CD-ROM inserted correctly in your CD-ROM drive?

Make sure that the CD-ROM is correctly inserted in the CD-ROM drive.

Could the CD-ROM itself or the lens of your CD-ROM drive be dirty?

The installer may not operate correctly if the CD-ROM or the lens of your CD-ROM drive is dirty. Use a commercially available CD cleaner or lens cleaner to clean the disc or lens.

Are you attempting to install from a networked CD-ROM drive?

The driver cannot be installed from a CD-ROM drive on the network.

A warning or error appears during the installation (Windows)

Could you have connected the A-500S to your computer before installing the driver?

If you connect the A-500S to your computer before installing the driver, an error message may appear when you begin the installation.

Uninstall the A-500S driver as described in **"Removing the driver"** (p. 55), and then install the A-500S driver once again as described in **"Driver Installation and Settings"** (p. 13).

Are there any devices labeled "Other," "Unknown," or "?/!/X" in the Device Manager?

If driver installation was not completed successfully, the partially installed driver may remain in an incomplete state.

Uninstall the A-500S driver as described in **"Removing the driver"** (p. 55), and then install the A-500S once again as described in **"Driver Installation and Settings"** (p. 13).

Can't install the driver according to the procedure

Did you log on to Windows with the appropriate user privileges?

You must log onto Windows using one of the following user names.

- A user name belonging to the Administrators group, such as Administrator
- A user name whose account type is Computer Administrator
- * For details, ask the system administrator for your computer.

In some cases, you may be unable to install the driver because of the "Driver signing option" settings.

Refer to "**Driver signing option settings (Windows XP)**" (p. 54) and make the appropriate settings.

Could other software be running, perhaps in the background (such as anti-virus software)?

The installation may not occur correctly if other software is running. Be sure to close all other software before you perform the installation.

Installation is not successfully completed when you connect the A-500S

Could the A-500S's [ADVANCED DRIVER] switch be OFF?

Turn the A-500S's [ADVANCED DRIVER] switch **ON**, and install the driver once again.

After you connect the A-500S, it may take several tens of seconds or several minutes before it is recognized by your computer.

This is not a malfunction.

Please wait until the Found New Hardware Wizard appears.

Is the A-500S connected?

Make sure that the A-500S is correctly connected to your computer.

Could your computer be operating on its battery?

Operation may be unstable if your computer is operating on battery power.

Please use your computer with its power supply connected.

Could you be using a bus-powered USB hub (a hub that does not require a power supply)?

The A-500S cannot be used with a bus-powered USB hub (a hub that does not need a separate power supply). Use it with a self-powered USB hub (a hub that has an internal power supply or AC adaptor).

Could a USB device other than a mouse or keyboard be connected?

Disconnect all USB devices (other than a mouse and keyboard, if used) from your computer before performing the installation.

Check the power management settings of your computer.

Your computer's power management settings may be limiting the power that is supplied to USB.

Take a look at your computer's power management settings.

→ "**Power management settings**" (p. 57)

Does your computer meet the requirements of the USB specification?

Operation may be unstable if your computer does not meet the electrical requirements of the USB specification. In this case, you may be able to solve the problem by connecting a self-powered USB hub (a USB hub that has an internal power supply or an AC adaptor).

“Found New Hardware Wizard” appears even though you’ve installed the driver (Windows XP)

Could you have connected the A-500S to a different USB connector than the one you used when installing the driver?

If your computer or USB hub has two or more USB connectors, connecting the A-500S to a different USB connector may cause your computer to ask for the driver file even though the driver has already been installed.

This behavior does not indicate a malfunction.

Install the driver as described in **step 10 of Installing the driver** (p. 18).

A number such as “2-” appears at the beginning of the device name (Windows)

Could you have connected the A-500S to a different USB port?

If you connect the A-500S to a different USB port, some operating systems may automatically add a number to the beginning of the device name, but this should not be a problem when using the A-500S. If you want to return to the device name that does not have this number, you can either connect the A-500S to the same USB port as when you installed it, or install the driver once again.

Problems with settings

Can't select/use the A-500S within software or in system settings

Could the A-500S be in use by other software?

Close all software you currently have running. Next, switch off the A-500S's power, then turn it back on again.

If this does not solve the problem, reinstall the driver.

→ **"Reinstalling the driver"** (p. 54)

Is the driver installed correctly?

Driver installation may have failed. Please reinstall the driver.

→ **"Reinstalling the driver"** (p. 54)

Is the A-500S device name shown?

If the device name is not displayed, it may be that the driver installation failed. Please reinstall the driver.

→ **"Reinstalling the driver"** (p. 54)

Could the computer to which the A-500S is connected have entered standby (suspend) mode, hibernate mode, or sleep mode?

Close all software that's using the A-500S. Next, switch off the A-500S's power, then turn it back on again.

If this does not solve the problem, restart your computer.

Could you have disconnected and reconnected the USB cable while using the A-500S?

Close all software that's using the A-500S. Next, switch off the A-500S's power, then turn it back on again.

If this does not solve the problem, restart your computer.

Could the A-500S have been connected when the computer started up?

On some computers, the A-500S may be unusable if it is already connected when the computer starts up.

Start up your computer, and then connect the A-500S.

Are you using the Media Player included with Windows?

On Windows 7 or Windows Vista, the A-500S's MIDI device cannot be selected by Media Player.

Problems when playing

The display indicates “Lo”

When the batteries run low, the display will indicate “Lo.” If this message appears, replace the batteries as soon as possible.

Replacing the batteries will not erase the contents of SYSTEM settings (p. 47).

Playback contains clicks, dropouts, or other problems

Check the power management settings

You may be able to eliminate clicks and pops by changing your system’s power management settings.

→ **“Power management settings”** (p. 57)

Try updating the driver of your display adaptor (Windows)

You may be able to eliminate clicks and pops by updating the driver for the display adaptor installed in your computer.

Have you set the system’s “Performance” setting? (Windows)

You may be able to solve the problem by changing the “Performance” setting of the system.

→ **“System “Performance” settings (Windows)”** (p. 59)

Could other software programs be running?

Close software that you’re not using.

If the window of a Windows program has been closed but it is still shown in the taskbar, that program is still running.

Close all unneeded software that’s shown in the taskbar.

Have you tried Windows Update or Microsoft Update? (Windows)

Try using Windows Update or Microsoft Update (provided by the Microsoft Corporation) to update your system to the latest version.

Try disabling the LAN

If this eliminates the clicks and pops, it may be that updating your LAN driver or BIOS may solve the problem. Check whether updated software is available.

- Decrease the buffer size of your sound card
